Council Member McCarty expressed concern for the location of a new basketball court at this park due to past safety concerns at the park.

Kathleen Westenberg stated there are other areas in town with basketball courts and asked if it is necessary to install a new court at this location.

Interim Public Services Director Gravel addressed the issues raised by Council Member McCarty and Mrs. Westenberg advising that the City is limited in terms of accessible basketball courts noting that schools are locked when closed and that the City is looking at a couple of additional locations for installing half-courts to encourage more outdoor activity.

City Manager Whitemyer advised one of the best ways to fight crime is to keep our youth busy. This court is one of two regulation sized courts that the City will have and it is hoped that it will encourage youth to get outside and play.






Assets and Deferred Outflows of Resources

Net Position




Government-Wide Financial Statements

Net Cost of Service to Tax Revenue (Governmental Activities)




Pension Plan



ORDINANCE 1247**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE AMENDING OAKDALE CITY CODE CHAPTER 28: SEWERS AND SEWAGE DISPOSAL, BY REPLACING SECTION 28-17 (CHARGES ESTABLISHED); DELETING SECTIONS 28-28.1 THROUGH 28-28.3 AND REPLACING WITH NEW SECTIONS 28-28.1 (SEWER RATES AND CHARGES) AND 28-28.2 (SEWER CONNECTION CHARGES); AND AMENDING CHAPTER 35: WATER, BY REPLACING SECTION 35-35 (CHARGES ESTABLISHED)

WHEREAS, pursuant to the requirements of Proposition 218, the City of Oakdale (“City”) must prepare a rate study, circulate the study for public review, and conduct a public hearing with 45-day mailed notice, prior to the City Council taking any action to increase property-related rates or charges, such as water and sewer rates; and,

WHEREAS, in addition to Proposition 218, the Oakdale City Code currently requires the City Council to revise water and sewer rates and charges through adoption of a new ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the ordinance adoption process ordinarily requires an additional sixty (60) to ninety (90) days before water and sewer rates can become legally effective; and,

WHEREAS, the City initiated a rate study in June 2016 to evaluate the City’s capital improvement needs for water and sewer services over the next five years; and,

WHEREAS, the City initiated Proposition 218 proceedings in January 2017 to adjust the City’s water service rates in order to meet essential capital infrastructure needs for all customers who receive City water service; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the interest the City Council and all City residents to adopt water and sewer rate changes by resolution, immediately following successful Proposition 218 proceedings, so that the City’s water service and essential capital improvements can be properly financed.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 28: Sewers and Sewage Disposal, Article II: Fees and Charges, Section 28-17 of the Oakdale City Code is repealed in their entirety and shall be replaced with a new section that reads as follows:



**IN THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE
STATE OF CALIFORNIA
ORDINANCE 1247**

Sec. 28-17. Charges established.

The amounts of all charges provided for in this chapter, including, but not limited to, charges for monthly sewer service charges, meters, screens, standby charges, sewer connection fees, reserve capacity charges, lateral and main connection charges, inflow/outflow monitoring devices and sampling devices, penalties and reconnection fees may be established by resolution of the City Council. The failure to pay any charge established by resolution of the City Council shall constitute a violation of the provisions of this chapter.

SECTION 2. Chapter 28: Sewers and Sewage Disposal, Article III: Sewer Mains and Sewer Laterals, Section 28-28.1 through 28-28.3 of the Oakdale City Code are repealed in their entirety and shall be replaced with new Sections 28-28.1 and 28-28.2 that read as follows:

Sec. 28-28.1 Sewer rates and charges.

Each property with a sewer connection shall pay a user charge. User charges for sewer service shall be set from time to time by resolution of the City Council, in accordance with this chapter and California law.

Notwithstanding the above, the monthly wastewater rates established by City Ordinance No. 1218-13 shall remain in effect until such time that the City Council adopts a resolution establishing new monthly wastewater rates and charges in accordance with this chapter and California law.

Sec. 28-28.2 Sewer connection charges.

Sewer connection charges may be set from time to time by resolution of the City Council, in accordance with this chapter and California law.

Notwithstanding the above, the sewer connection charges established by City Ordinance No. 949 shall remain in effect until such time that the City Council adopts a resolution establishing new charges.

SECTION 3. Chapter 35: Water, Article III: Fees and Charges, Section 35-35 of the Oakdale City Code is repealed in its entirety and shall be replaced with a new section that reads as follows:

Sec. 35-35. Charges established.

The amounts of all charges provided for in this chapter, including but not limited to water rates, connection fees, deposits, turning on charges, penalties, and reconnection fees, shall be set from time to time by resolution of the City Council, in accordance with this chapter and California law. The failure to pay any charge established by resolution of the City Council adopted pursuant to this chapter shall constitute a violation of this code.

Notwithstanding the above, the water rates established by City Ordinance No. 1218-13 shall remain in effect until such time that the City Council adopts a resolution establishing new charges therein.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days from and after its final passage and adoption, provided it is published in a newspaper of general circulation at least fifteen (15) days prior to its effective date.

SECTION 5. If any section, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after its passage by the City Council, and following the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the City Council. Within 15 days of its adoption, a summary of the ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Oakdale, State of California, which summary shall include the names of those Council Members voting for and against the ordinance. A certified copy of the full text of such adopted ordinance or amendment shall be on file in the office of the City Clerk.

I. BACKGROUND:

In November 1979, the voters of the State of California approved Proposition 4, commonly known as the Gann Initiative. The Proposition created Article XIII B of the State Constitution placing limits on the amount of revenue that can be spent by all entities of government. Proposition 4 became effective in fiscal year 1980-81, but the formula for calculating appropriation limits was based on the 1978-79 “base year” revenues.

Voters approved Proposition 111 in June 1990. Among other things, Proposition 111 provided a new adjustment formula that made the Appropriation Limit more responsive to local growth and service delivery issues. It also requires an annual review of the Limit Calculation.

The Appropriation Limit imposed by Propositions 4 and 111 creates a cap on the amount of revenue that can be appropriated in any fiscal year. The Limit is based on actual appropriations during the 1978-79 fiscal year and is increased each year using the growth of population and inflation.

Not all revenues are restricted by the Limit, only those that are referred to as “proceeds of taxes”. Proposition 111 expanded these exempt categories to include expenditures by “qualified capital outlay” beginning in 1990-91. Appropriations for these excludable categories do not count against the Limit.

In addition, non-proceeds of taxes are allowed to be spent on several types of appropriations, which do not count against the Limit. The law allows a city to spend tax proceeds on voter-approved debt and the costs of complying with court orders and federal mandates, with certain restrictions. Annually, a local government must acknowledge its “Gann Limits”.

II. DISCUSSION:

According to staff's calculations, the Gann Appropriation Limit for the City of Oakdale for fiscal year 2016-2017 is \$20,699,224. The Appropriation subject to the Limitation is \$9,347,662, which is 55 percent under the Appropriation Limit. The calculation of the Appropriation limit is outlined in Attachment A to the Resolution.

The General Fund's budgeted expenditures for FY 2017-17 are \$11,489,479, well below the current Gann Appropriation Limit.

During the calculation of the 2015-16 appropriation limit there was a clerical error that resulted in an overstatement of the appropriation limit by \$180,010. Since our actual expenditures are so far below the appropriation limit, there was no impact. The correction to the 2015-16 appropriation limit is already reflected in the calculation of the 2016-17 appropriation limit.

III. RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve and adopt the attached resolutions and findings regarding the 2015-16 and the 2016-17 City's Appropriation Limits.

Subject: Review And Consider Directing Staff To Work With The Oakdale Irrigation District To Develop A Cooperation Action Plan Between The Two Agencies And Bring Back To The City Council At A Future Meeting

I. BACKGROUND

Staff from the City of Oakdale (City) and the Oakdale Irrigation District (OID) have met over the last year to develop a draft Cooperative Action Plan (Action Plan) that outlines common interests between both jurisdictions. A goal of the Action Plan is to provide an equity analysis of the property taxes paid by City residents and industries to OID to insure the City is getting full benefit of that contribution. Currently, the City contributes approximately \$1.07 million annually in property tax dollars to OID's annual operating revenues of \$13.74 million (2015 OID audit) or about 7.8%.

The potential areas of common interest identified in the draft Action Plan include:

- Stormwater response services by OID to City
- Equipment sharing between both agencies
- Domestic water O&M services from City to OID
- Road and street repair costs when dealing with OID pipelines
- Raw water delivery from OID to City parks and open areas
- Dual purpose reservoirs for parks, irrigation and recharge
- Sustainable Groundwater Management Act projects – recycled water from City treatment ponds

If the Action Plan is implemented, the City of Oakdale will need funding to address some of these priority areas. The projects identified in the Action Plan when implemented will provide tremendous long term benefits to the City's residents and businesses. This plan will enable both OID and the City to work more closely together to more efficiently serve its constituents.

Over the years, residents from time to time have expressed the perception that the return on City tax dollars paid to OID were lagging behind the services and benefits received. The draft Action Plan intends to determine if that condition exists; to determine the "gap" of that difference; and put together a plan on how best to close that gap. Both City and OID staffs believe that the end result will be a foundation to achieving the Action Plan elements identified.

MEETING DATE: March 6, 2017

The draft Action Plan was reviewed and discussed by the OID and City 2+2 committee and it recommended that this be brought before both governing bodies for consideration.

Staff is asking the City Council to direct staff to further explore and develop with OID a final product document and bring that document back to the Council for further direction.

II. FISCAL IMPACT

Staff time only. No outside costs.

III. RECOMMENDATION

Direct staff to work with OID staff in development of a Cooperation Action Plan and bring back to the City Council at a future meeting.

The City and OID have been working closely on developing a framework of common interest goals and projects that when implemented would mutually benefit both OID's agriculture and urban service area residents. What follows is a "draft" of an Action Plan for review and input by the City-OID Committee that was established for such purposes. Upon its review, both City and OID staff would be looking for direction from the Committee to formalize this Action Plan and bring it before both elected bodies for adoption.

Basis for Cooperative Action Plan: Provide an equity analysis of the property taxes paid by City residents and industries to Oakdale Irrigation District to insure the City is getting full benefit of that contribution.

Background:

1. The City contributes approximately \$1.07 million in property tax dollars to OID's annual operating revenues of \$13.74 million (2015 audit) or about 7.8%.
2. The City lots however do not pay OID separately for the Fixed Rate Charge assessed to all OID service area lands. What this means is that a portion of the \$1.07 million covers that OID assessment. That assessment revenue to OID, in addition to other revenue streams from OID enterprises, supports in part the funding of OID's Operations and Maintenance expenses.
3. After analysis of the Fixed Rate Charge and other O&M services provided by OID to the City and comparing that amount to the revenues OID receives from the City may result in an unrealized benefit to OID from the City.

If an unrealized benefit exists, both OID and City will work together to develop a plan to insure the City is getting its equitable benefit from the revenues it provides to OID.

Such equity analysis and resultant plan could include funding for the following Action Items.

Action Item No. 1: Develop a Mutual Aid Agreement that would allow City and OID personnel to work together on both emergency response issues and general O&M issues that brings economic value and benefit to both parties.

Background:

Common interest areas that both parties could benefit from include:

1. Storm water response services by OID to City.
2. Equipment and operator sharing between agencies when needed and available.
3. Domestic water O&M services by the City to OID.

4. Repairs to roads, sidewalks, and landscaping in the City of Oakdale when repairs to OID lines impact those community assets.

Upon establishment of the services to be provided, each agency could establish an internal account by which to invoice said services. At the end of each year, a true-up of the accounts would be conducted.

Action Item No. 2: Develop a plan for the conversion of City parks to the use of surface water provided by OID where applicable.

Background:

1. Many City parks and open space area sites are near OID facilities that could benefit from such proximity.
2. These types of projects, ones that reduce City pumping of the aquifer, will be essential for implementing the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act in our County.
3. Small storage ponds would likely be integral to meeting the high volume short duration demand of these systems. In addition, recharge and aesthetic values could be derived benefits from such facilities.

Developing planning documents now will put both agencies in position to apply for State grants and loans when monies are made available.

Action Item No. 3: Develop a plan for the design and construction of a recycled water project at the City of Oakdale Wastewater Treatment Plant. Project to potentially recycle approximately 2,000 acre feet of treated wastewater into OID canals for irrigation purposes.

Background:

OID has already prepared a scope of work for such a project at its own cost.

1. As part of the project, a downstream holding reservoir will be needed. During the irrigation season OID would be able to utilize the reservoir for water regulation purposes. In the winter the facility could be used to capture and store storm water for groundwater recharge purposes.
2. The recycled City water would replace OID irrigation water creating a like-kind surplus supply in New Melones. This water could be used for water marketing purposes to pay off the project costs and as a potential revenue stream to both parties.






SECTOR ALLOCATION




