**Subject:** Discuss filling the City Treasurer vacancy to complete the current term ending in November 2020.

---

**I. BACKGROUND**

The role of the City Treasurer may be filled by election or appointment. In instances where an elected City Treasurer's post becomes vacant prior to the end of the incumbent's term, the City Council may appoint an individual to the seat or call an election.

There are two options the City Council can consider regarding the position of the City Treasurer. In light of the recent resignation of the elected City Treasurer, the City Council needs to either appoint a successor to complete her term, which runs to November 2020, or call for an election to fill the post for the remainder of the term.

**II. DISCUSSION**

In instances in which an elected City Treasurer's post is vacated prior to the end of the Treasurer's term, Government Code section 365, subsection 12(b) provides that:

If a vacancy occurs in an elective office provided for in this chapter, the council shall, within 60 days from the commencement of the vacancy, either fill the vacancy by appointment or call a special election to fill the vacancy.

Due to the high cost of a special election, City staff recommends that the City appoint Maria Wilson, who currently works in the City Finance Department, be appointed as the new City Treasurer.

**III. FISCAL IMPACT**

*City Treasurer Appointment:* If the City Council decides to fill the currently vacant City Treasurer post by appointing Maria Wilson, there is no cost to the City.

*City Treasurer Special Election:* If the City Council decides to fill the currently vacant City Treasurer post by Special Election, the cost is between \$80,000 to \$100,000.

**Subject:** Adopt a Resolution Declaring Property Surplus and Authorizing the Release of the Property to California Auction Company for Sale in an Upcoming Auction, or Permanent Disposal through Gilton Solid Waste Management or Covanta Energy.

**I. BACKGROUND**

Staff has identified items of property that are no longer needed or has reached the end of its useable service life and is requesting authorization to releasing the property that has been identified as surplus and is no longer needed. This property has no real value or the need to be held further for the owners or unknown owners to make claim to the items.

**II. DISCUSSION**

Staff has identified property that is no longer needed, is not in good working or safe condition, and is recommending said property be declared as surplus property. The property proposed for this sale/disposition, includes, but is not limited to; equipment that was utilized over the years by police officers that has become antiquated and outdated by technological advances in communications technology, worn out police gear, items that were utilized by the Equestrian Unit, K9 Unit, officer's Gym/Work out area, and office equipment that is damaged or no longer needed. Staff has reached out to the appropriate units and/or associations to remove any items that may belong to them. Each group was advised beginning in April 2019 of the need to claim any property and emailed on July 3, 2019 that any unclaimed items left after Tuesday, July 9<sup>th</sup>, 2019, would be removed and disposed of by either auction, or permanent disposal. Staff also identified items from the Property and Evidence Unit subject to purging and disposition where the property has been unclaimed and/or the owner is unknown after reasonable and diligent efforts have been made to identify owners.

For property that has potential monetary value, Staff has developed a procedure for handling Surplus, Found or Safekeeping Property value by a contract with California Auction Company. California Auction Company provides an inventory of property for sale, transportation of the property to the auction site, and advertises the auction. The City has used California Auction Company in a previous auction of property. For items that do not have any monetary value, permanent disposal through Gilton Solid Waste Management or Covanta Energy will be conducted.

Section 33-6 of the Oakdale City Code states, "Property received and not delivered to the true owner or finder shall be disposed of by public auction or appropriation to the use of the city..." Following the attached listed property being declared surplus, the police department will confer with the purchasing officer of the City to determine any items that may be appropriated to City use (OCC 33-8). All remaining items of value will be auctioned and all proceeds deposited into the City's General Fund (OCC 33-9). Items without monetary value will be disposed through Gilton Solid Waste Management or Covanta Energy.

### **III. FISCAL IMPACTS**

Proceeds from sales will be used as additional revenues and returned to the City General Fund.

### **IV. RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a Resolution declaring property surplus and authorizing the release of the property to California Auction Company for sale in an upcoming auction, or permanent disposal through Gilton Solid Waste Management or Covanta Energy.

## **I. BACKGROUND**

In 2018, Senate Bill 2 (Building Homes and Jobs Act) came into effect which is a funding source to assist in the development of the housing stock throughout the State. Fifty Percent (50%) of the first year's revenue is to be provided to cities and counties for planning activities (General Plan and Zoning Code Amendments, Accessory Dwelling Units, infrastructure financing plans to facilitate residential development, etc.) that reduce constraints and incentivize housing production. The City of Oakdale is eligible to receive up to \$180,000 of these funds with no match requirement. In order to apply for the grant funds the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) requires a resolution of authorization from the City Council to apply for the grant.

## **II. DISCUSSION**

On March 29, 2019, the State of California, Department of Housing and Community Development issued a Notice of Funding Availability for its Planning Grants Program. Senate Bill 2 (SB 2) established a permanent source of funding intended to increase the housing stock in California. The Planning Grants Program is a one-time component of SB 2 that, among other provisions, provides financial assistance to local governments to update planning documents in order to: accelerate housing production, streamline the approval of housing development affordable to owner and renter households at all income levels, facilitate housing affordability for all income groups, promote development consistent with state planning priorities, and ensure geographical equity in the distribution and expenditure of allocation funds.

The City of Oakdale intends to use the Planning Grants Program funding revenue to study the feasibility of updating the City's Planning Documents to assist in the development of the City's housing stock. Any updates to the City's Planning Documents will be presented to the City Council for consideration.

SB 2 Planning Grants Applications are due to be submitted to the Department of Housing and Community Development by November 29, 2019.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Oakdale, State of California desires to submit a project application for the Planning Grants Program to accelerate the production of housing and will submit a 2019 Planning grant Program Application as described in the Planning Grants Program NOFA and Senate Bill 2 Planning Grants Program Guidelines released by the Department of Housing and Community Development for the Planning Grants Program; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Housing and Community Development of the State of California is authorized to provide up to \$1.2 million under the Senate Bill 2 Planning Grants Program from the Building Homes and Jobs Trust Fund for assistance to cities and counties (as described in Health and Safety Code Section 50470 et. Seq. (Chapter 364, Statutes of 2017 (SB 2)) related to the Planning Grants Program.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the **CITY COUNCIL** of the **CITY OF OAKDALE** hereby:

**Section 1.** The City of Oakdale City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized and directed to apply for and submit to the Department of Housing and Community Development of the State of California, the 2019 Planning Grants Program Application released March 29, 2019, in the amount of \$180,000.

**Section 2.** In connection with the Planning Grants Program Grant, if the application is approved by the Housing and Community Development Department of the State of California, the City of Oakdale City Manager, or designee, is authorized to enter into, execute, and deliver a State of California Standard Agreement (Standard Agreement) for the amount of \$180,000, and any and all other documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate to evidence and secure the Planning Grant Program Grant, the City of Oakdale's obligations related thereto, and all amendments, thereto (collectively, the Planning Grant Program Grant Documents).

Housing and Community Development Department of the State of California. Funds are to be used for allowable expenditures that are specifically identified in the Standard Agreement. The Planning Grants Program Application in full is incorporated as part of the Standard Agreement. Any and all activities funded, and timelines represented in the Grant Application will be enforceable through the executed Standard Agreement. The City of Oakdale City Council hereby agrees to use the funds for eligible uses in the manner presented in the application as approved by the Department of Housing and Community Development of the State of California, and in accordance with the Planning Grants NOFA, the Planning Grants Program Guidelines, and 2019 Planning Grants Program Application.

**Section 4.** The City of Oakdale City Manager or designee is authorized and directed to execute the City of Oakdale Planning Grants Program Application, the Planning Grants Program Grant Documents, and any amendments thereto, on behalf of the City of Oakdale as required by the Housing and Community Development of the State of California for receipt of the Planning Grants Program Grant.

**Subject:** Introduction of an Ordinance Amending Article VIII of Chapter 19 of the Oakdale City Code relating to Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations and Waive the First Reading.

---

I. Background

Adopting amendments to Sections 19-123 through 134 (Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations) of Article VIII of Chapter 19 of the Oakdale City Code related to Massage Establishment Regulations is intended to provide a more efficient and effective regulatory process with necessary legal updates for the management of Massage Establishments in the City of Oakdale. The recommended updates to the City Code bring the Massage Establishment Regulations current with best practices throughout the State of California. The amendment aims to enact massage business practice mandates that will reduce the occurrence of illegal activity occurring in and association with massage businesses including human trafficking. The proposed update is in accordance with current laws and best practices. The CAMTC certification requirement applies to those individuals and businesses obtaining a massage business permit after October 1, 2019. The remaining business requirements apply to all massage businesses.

II. Discussion

Prior to 2009, individual municipalities, not the State of California, were responsible for regulating massage businesses and massage professionals. In 2009, the California State Legislature passed the California Massage Therapy Law or Senate Bill 731. This legislation established the California Massage Therapy Council (CAMTC), a nonprofit entity charged with issuing voluntary permits to all massage therapists in the state. The law also significantly limited cities' regulatory authority over massage businesses. Subsequently, the City of Oakdale amended its massage ordinance to comply with SB 731 and to require all massage practitioners working in the City of Oakdale to obtain an Operators Permit and/or Massage Technician Permit from the Chief of Police. This Ordinance, which is currently in effect, did not require massage practitioners to have CAMTC permits in order to obtain an Operators Permit and/or Massage Technician Permit to practice in the City of Oakdale.

In 2014, the state legislature enacted AB 1147, returning authority to cities and counties to regulate the massage industry. Under AB 1147, cities and counties have increased

authority to regulate the massage industry. The new legislation allows the CAMTC to continue to certify massage practitioners while empowering local governments to exercise land use control and impose operating standards and permit, licensing and certification requirements on massage businesses.

Key provisions of the proposed amended Ordinance are as follows:

- Massage businesses must obtain a “Massage Registration Certificate” (Certificate) verifying that a massage business consists of only CAMTC State-certified massage practitioners. The CAMTC certification requirement applies to those individuals and businesses obtaining a massage business permit after October 1, 2019.
  1. Under the current State law, the City may no longer require Certificates of individual massage practitioners employed by massage businesses.
  2. Police Department may collect important information including names of all business owners, employees and independent contractors and any owner of a massage business not certified by the CAMTC of state or local law.
  3. No Massage Registration Certificate may be issued for a business at a fixed location if that location was previously used by another massage business that has a suspended or revoked registration, has received a notice of suspension, or has outstanding fines issued under the terms of the ordinance.
- All massage businesses in the City must comply with operating standards addressing issues as hours of operation, cleanliness, attire, and advertising, to ensure health and safety and prevent illegal activities, including but not limited to the following:
  1. Hours of operation are limited to 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. with no massage to occur from 9:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
  2. Maintain written records of services provided.
  3. No curtains, blinds, or other material shall obstruct or blur any windows from the street looking into the reception area of a massage business.
  4. No massage business shall allow any person to reside within the business or any structures owned, leased, or controlled by the business. This provision is intended to reduce the likelihood of human trafficking.
- Police Chief and Community Development Director may issue administrative fines for violation of ordinance. Fines may be appealed to City Manager.

1. Police Chief may suspend or revoke a Certificate if specified violations are found.
2. A Certificate may not be issued for a location if another Certificate for that location is currently under suspension, was revoked within the last year, or has outstanding administrative fines.
3. Suspensions and revocations of Certificates may be appealed to the City Manager. Decision of the City Manager is final with no further right to appeal or reconsideration.
4. No reapplication for Certificate within one year of revocation.
5. Massage businesses operating contrary to Ordinance are declared a public nuisance.
6. The proposed ordinance also exempts certain individuals or businesses such as medical professionals, barbers, beauticians, hospitals, sports trainers, and massages at a single event such as a health fair.

It is Staff's recommendation, in accordance with best practices, and to assist with managing massage establishments in a more efficient manner, Article VIII of Chapter 19 of the Oakdale City Code, related to Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations, be amended by replacing the language in Sections 19-123 through 19-134 with the proposed language listed in the attached proposed Ordinance.

The language to be removed is indicated with a line striking the items to remove. The new proposed language is marked with italics and underlined. Sections 19-135 to 19-138 will be reserved for future legislation.

### III. Environmental Review

The Ordinance does not constitute a project subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"). The Ordinance will not result in any direct or indirect environmental impacts.

### IV. Fiscal Impacts

The proposed Ordinance is not anticipated to have a financial impact on the City's budget. The City of Oakdale's Master Fee Schedule establishes the fee for registering a massage business in the City and does not exceed the reasonable cost of staff time in reviewing a new application.

ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT OF CODE: Article VIII of Chapter 19 of the Oakdale  
City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Article VIII. Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations.

This article shall be known as the "Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations."

Sec. 19-123. Findings and purpose.

The city council finds and declares as follows:

~~(a) The permit requirements and restrictions imposed by this article are reasonably necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Oakdale;~~

(a) In enacting this chapter, the City Council recognizes that commercial massage therapy is a professional pursuit, which can offer the public valuable health and therapeutic services. The City Council further recognizes that, unless properly regulated, the practice of massage therapy and the operation of massage businesses may be associated with unlawful activity and pose a threat to the quality of life in the local community. Accordingly, it is the purpose and intent of this chapter to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by providing for the orderly regulation of businesses providing massage therapy services, discouraging prostitution and related illegal activities carried on under the guise of massage therapy, and establishing certain sanitation, health, and operational standards for massage businesses.

~~(b) The City of Oakdale is authorized, by virtue of the California Constitution and Government Code section 51030 et seq., to regulate massage establishments by imposing reasonable standards relative to the skill and experience of massage operators and massage technicians and reasonable conditions on the operation of massage establishments;~~



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(b) Furthermore, it is the purpose and intent of this chapter to address the negative impacts identified in the City Council's findings to reduce or prevent neighborhood blight and to protect and preserve the quality of City neighborhoods and commercial districts; and to enhance enforcement of criminal statutes relating to the conduct of operators and employees of massage businesses.

~~(c) There is a significant risk of injury to massage clients by improperly trained and/or educated massage technicians and this article provides reasonable safeguards against injury and economic loss;~~

(c) It is the Council's further purpose and intent to rely upon the uniform statewide regulations applicable to massage practitioners and establishments that were enacted by the State Legislature in 2008 as Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq. by Senate Bill 731, and amended in 2011 by Assembly Bill 619 and in 2014 by Assembly Bill 1147, to restrict the commercial practice of massage in the City to those persons duly certified to practice by the California Massage Therapy Council and to provide for the registration and regulation of massage businesses for health and safety purposes to the extent allowed by law.

~~(d) There is opportunity for acts of prostitution and other unlawful sexual activity to occur in massage establishments. Courts have long recognized that massage is a pervasively regulated activity and that massage establishments are often brothels in disguise. The establishment of reasonable standards for issuance of permits and restrictions on operations would serve to reduce the risk of illegal activity without significantly burdening legitimate businesses;~~

~~(e) The restrictions and requirements contained in this article reduce the burdens on the police department and permit the deployment of police personnel such that more serious crimes may be prevented and more important laws enforced; and~~

~~(f) The regulations and restrictions contained in this article tend to discourage massage establishments from degenerating into houses of prostitution and the means utilized in this article bear a reasonable and rational relationship to the goals sought to be achieved. (Ord. No. 1151)~~



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Sec. 19-124. Definitions.

Unless the context otherwise requires, the definitions and provisions contained in this section shall govern the construction, meaning and application of words and phrases used in this article.

(a) ~~"Bath" shall mean the giving or furnishing of Russian, Finnish, Swedish, hot air, vapor, electric, cabinet, mineral, sweat, salt, Japanese, sauna, or fomentation bath, or bath of any kind whatever, excluding ordinary bath tubs or showers where an attendant is not required. "Bath" shall also include any form of body shampoo.~~

(a) "Business" includes, but not by way of limitation, everything about which a person can be employed, and means that which occupies the time, attention, and labor of men and women for the purpose of producing a livelihood or profit, and connotes the efforts of men and women by varied and diverse methods of dealing with each other, to improve their individual economic conditions, and for the purposes of this chapter shall include, without limitation, the advertising and soliciting of massages. The term "business" includes, but is not limited to, a massage practitioner who is the sole owner, operator and employee of a massage business operating as a sole proprietorship, as well as a massage establishment, which employs massage practitioners and therapists.

(b) "City manager" shall mean the City manager of the City of Oakdale or his or her designated representative.

(c) ~~"City council" shall mean the City Council of the City of Oakdale.~~

(c) "California Massage Therapy Council" or "CAMTC" means the massage therapy organization formed pursuant to Business and Professions Code Section 4600.5.

(d) ~~"Conviction," "convicted" shall mean a plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere.~~

(d) "Certified massage practitioner" means any individual certified by the California Massage Therapy Council as a certified massage therapist or as a certified massage practitioner pursuant to California Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq.



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~~(e) "Employ" shall include contracting with independent contractors.~~

(e) "Client" means the customer or patron who pays for or receives massage services.

~~(f) "Employee" shall include independent contractors.~~

(f) "Employee" means any person employed by a massage business who may render any service to the business, and who receives any form of compensation from the business.

~~(g) "Health department" shall mean the Stanislaus County Health Care Services.~~

(g) "Health Officer" means the person appointed by the City of Oakdale pursuant to the California Health and Safety Code or his or her authorized representatives or designees.

~~(h) "Manager" shall mean the person(s) designated by the operator of the massage establishment to act as the representative and agent of the operator in managing day-to-day operations with the same liabilities and responsibilities. Evidence of management includes, but is not limited to, evidence that the individual has power to direct or hire and dismiss employees, control hours of operation, create policy or rules or purchase supplies. A manager may also be an operator. A massage technician permit is not required to qualify as a manager. A manager may not perform any massage services without first meeting the standards and qualifications of section 19-128 and obtaining a technician permit.~~

(h) "Compensation" means the payment, loan, advance, donation, contribution, deposit, exchange, or gift of money or anything of value.

~~(i) "Massage" shall mean any method of treating the external parts of the body for remedial, hygienic, relaxation or any other reason or purpose, whether by means of pressure on, friction against or stroking, kneading, tapping, pounding, vibrating, rubbing or other manner of touching external parts of the body with the hands or with the aid of any mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliance with or without supplementary aids such as rubbing alcohol, liniment, antiseptic, oil, powders, creams, ointment or other similar preparations commonly used in this practice.~~

(i) "Massage" or "massage therapy," means and refers to any method of treating the external parts of the body for remedial, health, or hygienic purposes for any form of



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compensation by means of pressure on or friction against, or stroking, kneading, rubbing, tapping, pounding, or stimulating the external parts of the body, with or without the aid of any mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances; or with or without supplementary aids, such as rubbing alcohol, liniments, antiseptics, oils, powders, creams, lotions, ointments, or other similar preparations commonly used in this practice; or by baths, including but not limited to Turkish, Russian, Swedish, Japanese, vapor, shower, electric tub, sponge, mineral, fomentation, or any other type of bath.

- (j) ~~"Massage establishment" shall mean any business conducted within the City of Oakdale where any person, firm, association, partnership, corporation or combination thereof engages in, conducts, carries on or permits to be conducted or carried on, for money or any other consideration, administration to another person of a massage or health treatment involving massage.~~
- (i) "Massage business," means any business that offers massage therapy in the City of Oakdale in exchange for compensation, whether at a fixed place of business or at a location designated by the customer or client through outcall massage services. Any business that offers any combination of massage therapy and bath facilities—including, but not limited to, showers, baths, wet and dry heat rooms, pools and hot tubs—shall be deemed a massage business under this chapter. The term "massage business" includes a certified massage practitioner who is the sole owner, operator and employee of a massage business operating as a sole proprietorship.
- (k) ~~"Massage technician" shall mean any person who administers to another person a massage within a massage establishment in exchange for anything of value whatsoever.~~
- (k) "Outcall massage" means the engaging in or carrying on of massage therapy for compensation in a location other than the business operations address set forth in the massage business's City registration certificate.
- (l) "Operator" or "massage business operator" shall mean any and all owners of a massage business. ~~persons who have an ownership interest in the massage establishment and are responsible for its day-to-day operations.~~
- (m) ~~"Person" shall mean any individual, corporation, partnership, association or other group or combination thereof acting as an entity.~~
- (m) "City registration certificate" means a registration certificate issued by the Chief of Police





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upon submission of satisfactory evidence that a massage business employs or uses only certified massage practitioners pursuant to this chapter.

(n) "Police e Chief" shall mean the Police Chief of the City of Oakdale or his or her designated representative. authorized representatives or designees.

(e) — "Police department" shall mean the Police Department of the City of Oakdale.

(o) "Owner" or "massage business owner" means any of the following persons:

(1) Any person who is a general partner of a general or limited partnership that owns a massage business.

(2) Any person who has five percent or greater ownership interest in a corporation that owns a massage business.

(3) Any person who is a member of a limited liability company that owns a massage business.

(4) Any person who has a five percent or greater ownership interest in any other type of business association that owns a massage business.

(p) — "Qualified massage educational program" shall mean an educational program, class or course primarily focused on the theory, ethics, practice, profession or work of massage and meeting one of the following criteria:

(1) — Provided by a recognized school of massage;

(p) "School of massage" means any school or institution of learning that is recognized as an approved school pursuant to Business and Professions Code Division 2, Chapter 10.5, as currently drafted or as may be amended.

(q) "Person" means any individual, firm, association, partnership, corporation, joint venture, limited liability company, or combination of individuals.

(r) "Practitioner" or "massage practitioner" shall be used interchangeably and mean any person who administers massage to another person, for any form of consideration (whether for the massage, as part of other services or a product, or otherwise).

(s) "Reception and waiting area" means an area immediately inside the front door of the massage business dedicated to the reception and waiting of patrons of the massage



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business and visitors, and which is not a massage therapy room or otherwise used for the provision of massage therapy services.

(t) "Registration" means the registration required by this chapter to operate a massage business.

(u) "Sole proprietorship" means and includes any legal form of business organization where the business owner (sometimes referred to as the "sole proprietor") is the only person employed by that business to provide massage services.

(v) "Solicit" means to request, ask, demand or otherwise arrange for the provision of services.

Sec. 19-125. ~~Operator permit required.~~ CAMTC CERTIFICATION AND LOCAL REGISTRATION REQUIRED.

~~No person shall operate a massage establishment within the city without first obtaining an operator permit pursuant to section 19-126 and section 19-127 and securing the necessary business license as set forth in the Oakdale Municipal Code. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

(a) Individuals. It shall be unlawful for any individual to practice massage therapy for compensation as a sole proprietorship or employee of a massage business or in any other capacity with the City of Oakdale unless that individual is a certified massage practitioner through the CAMTC or possesses a current valid noncertified massage business permit obtained prior to October 1, 2019, under the previous massage ordinance.

(b) Businesses. It shall be unlawful for any business to provide massage for compensation within the City of Oakdale unless all individuals employed by the massage business to perform massage, whether as an employee, independent contractor, or sole proprietorship, are certified massage practitioners through CAMTC or possess a current valid noncertified massage business permit obtained prior to October 1, 2019, under the previous massage ordinance, and said business has obtained a valid City registration certificate as provided in this chapter.

Sec. 19-126. ~~Application for operator permit.~~ MESSAGE BUSINESS REGISTRATION.



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- (a) ~~Any person seeking an operator permit for a massage establishment shall file a written application on the required form with the police chief. The application shall be accompanied by the appropriate filing fee established by resolution of the city council. The application shall be completed and signed by the operator, or authorized representative thereof, of the proposed massage establishment. The permit application does not authorize the operation of a massage establishment unless and until such permit has been properly granted.~~ Application. The registration application for a City registration certificate shall include contain or be accompanied by all of the following information:
- (1) ~~The type of ownership of the business. If the applicant is a corporation, the name of the corporation shall be set forth exactly as shown in its articles of incorporation or charter, together with the state and date of incorporation and the names and residential addresses of each of its current officers and directors, and of each stockholder holding more than five percent of the stock of that corporation. If the applicant is a partnership, the application shall set forth the name and residence of each of the partners, including limited partners. If it is a limited partnership, it shall furnish a copy of its certificate of limited partnership filed with the Secretary of State. If one or more of the partners is a corporation, the provisions of this subsection pertaining to corporations shall apply. A corporate or partnership applicant shall designate one of its officers or general partners to act as its responsible managing officer. Such designated persons shall complete and sign all application forms required for an individual applicant under this article, but only one application fee shall be charged;~~
- (2)(1) The precise Legal name under which the massage establishment is to be conducted; of the massage business.
- (3)(2) ~~The complete a~~ Address and all telephone numbers of the massage establishment; business.
- (4)(3) ~~A complete and current list of the~~ Legal names and residential addresses of all proposed massage technicians and employees in the massage establishment and the name and residential addresses of the manager(s) proposed to be principally in charge of the operation owners of the massage establishment; business.
- (5)(4) ~~The proposed hours of operation~~ A list of all of the massage business's employees and independent contractors who are performing massage and their CAMTC certification. ~~establishment, provided such establishment is not open between the hours of ten p.m. and six a.m., No massage appointment will be scheduled after nine p.m.~~
- (6)(5) A description list of all of the massage any other business's employees and independent contractors who are performing massage and their CAMTC



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~~certification, operated on the same premises or within the City of Oakdale or the State of California which is owned or operated by the applicant;~~

~~(6) Business address and telephone number of all owners of the massage business.~~

~~(7) The following personal information concerning the applicant: form of business under which the massage business will be operating (i.e. corporation, general or limited partnership, limited liability company, or other form).~~

- ~~a. Full complete name and all aliases used by the applicant;~~
- ~~b. Current address and telephone number and all previous residential addresses for eight years preceding the date of the application;~~
- ~~c. Acceptable proof that the applicant is at least eighteen years of age;~~
- ~~d. Height, weight, color of hair and eyes and gender;~~
- ~~e. Two front-faced portrait photographs at least two inches by two inches in size;~~
- ~~f. The applicant's complete business, occupation and employment history for the eight years preceding the date of the application, including, but not limited to, massage or similar business history and experience of the applicant;~~
- ~~g. The complete massage permit history of the applicant: whether such person has ever had any permit or license, issued by any agency, board, city, county territory or state; the date of issuance of such a permit or license; or whether the permit or license was denied, revoked or suspended and the reasons therefor;~~
- ~~h. All criminal convictions, including pleas of nolo contendere, within the last eight years, including those dismissed or expunged pursuant to Penal Code section 1203.4, but excluding minor traffic violations, and the date and place of each such conviction and explanation thereof;~~
- ~~i. A complete set of fingerprints taken by the police department;~~

~~(8) The name and address of the owner and lessor of the real property upon which the business is to be conducted. In the event the applicant is not the legal owner of the property, the application must be accompanied by a copy of the lease and a notarized acknowledgment from the owner of the property that a massage establishment will be located on his or her property;~~



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- (8) Each owner operator of the massage business who is not a CAMTC-certified massage practitioner shall submit an application for a background check, including the following: the individual's business, occupation, and employment history for the five years preceding the date of the application; the inclusive dates of such employment history; the name and address of any massage business or similar business owned or operated by the individual whether inside or outside the County of Stanislaus and its incorporated cities.
- (9) Authorization for the city, its agents and employees to seek verification of the information contained in the application; For all owners, a valid and current driver's license and/or identification issued by a state or federal governmental agency or other photographic identification bearing a bona fide seal by a foreign government.
- (10) Such other identification and information as the police chief may reasonably require in order to discover the truth of the matters herein specified and as required to be set forth in the application; For all owners, a signed statement that all of the information contained in the application is true and correct; that all owners shall be responsible for the conduct of the business's employees or independent contractors providing massage services; and acknowledging that failure to comply with the California Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq., and local, state, or federal law, or the provisions of this chapter may result in revocation of the business's City registration certificate.
- (b) Issuance. Upon provision by the massage business of the foregoing documentation, the Chief of Police shall issue the massage business a City registration certificate, which shall be valid for two years from the date of issuance. No reapplication will be accepted within one year after an application or renewal is denied or a certificate is revoked. City registration certificates shall not be issued to a massage business seeking to operate at a particular location if:
- (1) Another massage business is or was operating at that particular location and that massage business is currently serving a suspension or revocation pursuant to Section 19-133, during the pendency of the suspension or one year following revocation;
- (2) Another massage business is or was operating at that particular location and that massage business has received a notice of suspension, revocation, or fine issued pursuant to Sections 19-132 and 19-133, during the 10-day period



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following receipt of the notice or while any appeal of a suspension, revocation or fine is pending.

- (3) Another massage business is or was operating at that particular location, and that massage business has outstanding fines issued pursuant to Section 19-132 that have not been paid.
- (c) Amendment. A massage business shall apply to the City to amend its City registration certificate within 30 days after any change in the registration information, including, but not limited to, the hiring or termination of certified massage practitioners, the change of the business's address, or changes in the owner's addresses and/or telephone numbers.
- (d) Renewal. A massage business shall apply to the City to renew its City registration certificate at least 30 days prior to the expiration of said City registration certificate. If an application for renewal of a City registration certificate and all required information is not timely received and the certificate expires, no right or privilege to provide massage shall exist.
- (e) Fees. There shall be no fee for the registration application or certificate, or any amendment or renewal thereof. The provisions of this section shall not prevent the City from establishing fees for safety inspections as may be conducted from time to time by the Chief of Police, and for the background checks, fingerprinting, and subsequent arrest notification for owners of a massage business who are not CAMTC-certified and who are subject to such background checks pursuant to this chapter. There are certain fees for appeals as described below.
- (f) Transfer. A City registration certificate shall not be transferred except with the prior written approval of the Chief of Police. A written request for such transfer shall contain the same information for the new ownership as is required for applications for registration pursuant to this section. In the event of denial, notification of the denial and reasons therefor shall be provided in writing and shall be provided to the applicant by personal delivery or by registered or certified mail. A City registration certificate may not be transferred during any period of suspension or one year following revocation pursuant to Section 19-133, during the 10-day period following a massage business's receipt of a notice of suspension, revocation or fine issued pursuant to Sections 19-132 and 19-133 or while any appeal of a suspension, revocation or fine is pending. Further, a City registration certificate may not be transferred until all outstanding fines issued pursuant to Section 19-132 have been paid.
- (11) ~~A statement in writing and dated by the applicant that he or she certifies under penalty of perjury that all information contained in the application is true and correct;~~





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- (12) ~~Statements in writing and dated by the applicant and the applicant's designated manager(s) certifying under penalty of perjury that they;~~

  - c. ~~Understand the duties of an operator or manager, respectively, as provided in this article;~~
- (b) ~~If, during the term of a permit, the permit holder has any change in information submitted on the original or renewal application, the permit holder shall notify the police department of such change in writing within ten business days thereafter. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

Sec. 19-127. ~~Operator permit issuance and denial. OPERATING REQUIREMENTS.~~

*No person shall engage in, conduct, carry on, or permit any massage within the City of Oakdale unless all of the following requirements are met:*

(a) ~~Upon receipt of a complete permit application, the police chief shall conduct an investigation to ascertain whether such permit should be issued as requested. The police chief shall, within sixty days of receipt of an application, approve, conditionally approve or deny the application. The sixty-day period may be extended for up to thirty additional days, if necessary, to complete the investigation. The police chief shall issue such permit as requested, unless he or she makes any of the following findings:~~

(a) *CAMTC certification shall be worn by and clearly visible on the massage practitioner's person during working hours and at all times when the massage practitioner is inside a massage business or providing outcall massage.*

- (1) ~~The applicant, or any officers, directors or partners, or any person directly engaged or employed in the massage establishment, has within the eight years preceding the date of the application:~~
- a. ~~Been convicted of a violation of Penal Code sections 266, 266a, 266b, 266d, 266e, 266f, 266g, 266h, 266i, 314, 315, 316, 318, 647(a), 647(b) or 647(d) or any other provision of law pursuant to which a person is required to register under the provisions of Penal Code section 290 or when the prosecution accepted a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to a charge of a violation of Penal Code section 415 or any lesser included or lesser related offense in satisfaction of, or as a substitute of, any of the previously listed crimes;~~



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- b. ~~Been convicted of a violation of Health & Safety Code section 11550 or any offense involving the illegal sale, distribution or possession of a controlled substance specified in Health & Safety Code sections 11054, 11055, 11056, 11057 or 11058;~~
  - c. ~~Been convicted of any offense in any other state which is the equivalent of any of the above mentioned offenses;~~
  - d. ~~Been subjected to a permanent injunction against the conducting or maintaining of a nuisance pursuant to Penal Code section 11225 et seq. or any similar provisions of law in a jurisdiction outside the State of California;~~
  - e. ~~Been convicted of an act involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or moral turpitude or an act of violence, which act or acts are related to the qualifications, functions or duties of an operator;~~
  - f. ~~Has had an operator or massage technician permit or other similar license or permit denied, suspended or revoked for cause by a licensing authority or by any city, county or state;~~
- (2) ~~The applicant has made a false, misleading or fraudulent statement or omission of fact to the city in the permit application process.~~
- (3) ~~The application does not contain all of the information required by section 19-126.~~
- (4) ~~The massage establishment, as proposed by the applicant, does not comply with all applicable laws, including, but not limited to, health, zoning, fire and safety requirements and standards.~~
- (5) ~~The applicant has not satisfied the requirements of this article in the time specified.~~
- (6) ~~If the application is denied for failure to comply with subsections (2) or (3) above, the applicant may not reapply for a period of six months from the date the application was denied.~~
- (b) ~~All operators and managers shall comply with the following conditions to the operator permit and any other reasonable conditions imposed by the police chief:~~
- (b) *Massage shall be provided or given only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. No massage business shall be open and no massage shall be provided between 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. A massage commenced prior to 9:00 p.m. shall nevertheless*



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terminate at 9:00 p.m., and, in the case of a massage business, all clients shall exit the premises at that time. It is the obligation of the massage business to inform clients of the requirement that services must cease at 9:00 p.m.

- (1) ~~Prohibited massage areas. Except to the extent required, in writing, by a state-licensed medical practitioner, no massage technician shall massage the genitals or anal area of any patron or the breast(s) of any female patron, nor shall any operator or manager of a massage establishment allow or permit such massage. No operator or manager, while performing any task or service associated with the massage establishment, shall be present in any room with another person unless the person's genitals, anus are fully covered.~~
- (2) ~~Names. No operator granted a permit pursuant to this section shall use any name or conduct business under any designation not specified in his or her permit.~~
- (3) ~~Manager/operator available to respond within thirty minutes to the premises. The manager/operator of the massage establishment is not required to be on the premises at all times during hours of operation. However, if the manager/operator cannot respond within thirty minutes, the manager/operator(s) shall file a statement with the police chief designating the person with power to act as a manager who is available to respond within thirty minutes. The operator shall also file with the police chief a statement, signed and dated by each manager designated after permit issuance, certifying under penalty of perjury that they:
  - a. ~~Have received a copy of this article;~~
  - b. ~~Understand its contents; and~~
  - c. ~~Understand the duties of a manager as provided in this article.~~~~
- (4) ~~Licensed massage technician on premises. During the hours of operation, the massage establishment shall have at least one massage technician holding a current valid massage technician permit for the specific establishment on the premises.~~
- (5) ~~Operator/manager responsibility. The operator and on-duty manager shall be responsible for the conduct of all employees while the employees are on the licensed premises. An act or omission of any employee constituting a violation of the provisions of this article shall be deemed the act or omission of the operator for purposes of determining whether the operator permit shall be revoked, suspended, denied or renewed.~~
- (6) ~~Licensed massage technicians. The operator or manager shall not employ any person as a massage technician who does not have a valid massage technician~~



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permit issued pursuant to this article. The operator shall report to the police chief any change of employees, whether by new or renewed employment, discharge or termination, on the form and in the manner required by the police chief. The report shall contain the name of the employee and the date of hire or termination. The report shall be made within five days of the date of hire or termination. The operator shall deliver the permit and photo identification card of any massage technician no longer employed by the operator to the police chief within five days of employment termination. The operator/manager shall notify the Oakdale Police Department if it is not possible to retrieve the technician's permit.

(7) — Insurance. No person shall engage in, conduct or carry on the business of a massage establishment unless there is on file with the police chief, in full force and effect at all times, documents issued by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of California evidencing that the operator is insured under a liability insurance policy providing minimum coverage of five hundred thousand dollars for injury or death arising out of the operation of the massage establishment and/or the administration of a massage. Each operator shall provide the police chief with evidence of insurance within forty-five days of the date of issuance of the permit.

(8) — Compliance with Code. The operator shall comply with all provisions of this article and any applicable provisions of the Oakdale Municipal Code.

(9) — Inspections and searches. By applying for a permit, the operator consents to the inspection of the massage establishment by city's building department, police department, and the fire department and Stanislaus County Health Department for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article or other applicable laws or regulations are met. The operator consents to the inspection of the occupied massage rooms by a member of the Oakdale Police Department dressed in plainclothes for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article are met upon occurrence of any of the conditions described in Article VIII, which would require the posting of the Notice to All Patrons. The member shall knock, announce his presence, and request that the technician answer the door. The technician shall exit the room within a reasonable period of time. (Ord. No. 1151)

(c) A list of the services available and the cost of such services shall be posted in the reception area within the massage premises, and shall be described in readily understandable language. Outcall service providers shall provide such a list to clients in advance of performing any service. No owner, manager, operator, or responsible managing employee shall permit, and no massage practitioner shall offer or perform, any service other than those posted or listed as required herein, nor shall an operator or a massage practitioner request or charge a fee for any service other than those on the list of services available and posted in the reception area or provided to the client in advance of any outcall services.



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- (d) A copy of the CAMTC certificate of each and every massage practitioner employed in the business shall be displayed in the reception area or similar open public place on the premises. CAMTC certificates of former employees and/or contractors shall be removed as soon as those massage practitioners are no longer employed by or offering services through the massage business.
- (e) For each massage service provided, every massage business shall keep a complete and legible written record of the following information: the date and hour that service was provided; the name and telephone number of each client; the service received; the name or initials of the employee entering the information; and the name of the massage practitioner administering the service. Such records shall be open to inspection and copying by police officers, enforcement officials, or other City officials charged with enforcement of this chapter. These records may not be used by any massage practitioner or operator for any purpose other than as records of service provided and may not be provided to other parties by the massage practitioner or operator unless otherwise required by law. Such records shall be retained on the premises of the massage business for a period of two years and be immediately available for inspection during business hours.
- (f) Massage businesses shall at all times be equipped with an adequate supply of clean sanitary towels, coverings and linens. Clean towels, coverings, and linens shall be stored in enclosed cabinets. Towels and linens shall not be used on more than one client, unless they have first been laundered and disinfected. Disposable towels and coverings shall not be used on more than one client. Soiled linens and paper towels shall be deposited in separate, approved receptacles.
- (g) Wet and dry heat rooms, steam or vapor rooms or cabinets, toilet rooms, shower and bath rooms, tanning booths, whirlpool baths and pools shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected as needed, and at least once each day the premises are open, with a disinfectant approved by the Health Officer. Bathtubs shall be thoroughly cleaned after each use with a disinfectant approved by the Health Officer. All walls, ceilings, floors, and other physical facilities for the business must be in good repair, and maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (h) Instruments utilized in performing massage shall not be used on more than one client unless they have been sterilized, using approved sterilization methods.



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- (i) All massage business operators and their employees, including massage practitioners, shall wear clean, non-transparent outer garments. Said garments shall not expose their genitals, pubic areas, buttocks, or chest, and shall not be worn in such manner as to expose the genitals, pubic areas, buttocks, or chest. For the purposes of this section, outer garments means a garment worn over other garments and does not include garments like underwear, bras, lingerie or swimsuits.
- (j) No person shall enter, be, or remain in any part of a massage business while in possession of an open container of alcohol, or consuming or using any alcoholic beverage or drugs except pursuant to a prescription for such drugs. The owner, operator, responsible managing employee, or manager shall not permit any such person to enter or remain upon such premises.
- (k) No massage business shall operate as a school of massage, or use the same facilities as that of a school of massage.
- (l) No massage business shall place, publish or distribute, or cause to be placed, published or distributed any advertising matter that depicts any portion of the human body that would reasonably suggest to prospective clients that any service is available other than those services listed as an available service pursuant to Section 19-127(c), nor shall any massage business employ language in the text of such advertising that would reasonably suggest to a prospective client that any service is available other than those services as described in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.
- (m) No massage shall be given unless the client's genitals are, at all times, fully covered. A massage practitioner shall not, in the course of administering any massage, make physical contact with the genitals or private parts of any other person regardless whether the contact is over or under the person's clothing.
- (n) Where the business has staff available to assure security for clients and massage staff are behind closed doors, the entry to the reception area of the massage business shall remain unlocked during business hours when the business is open for business or when clients are present.
- (o) No massage business located in a building or structure with exterior windows fronting a public street, highway, walkway, or parking area shall, during business hours, block visibility into the interior reception and waiting area through the use of curtains, closed blinds, tints, or any other material that obstructs, blurs, or unreasonably darkens the view



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into the premises. For the purpose of this subsection, there is an irrebuttable presumption that the visibility is impermissibly blocked if more than 10 percent of the interior reception and waiting area is not visible from the exterior window.

- (p) All signs shall be in conformance with the current ordinances of the City of Oakdale.
- (q) Minimum lighting consisting of at least one artificial light of not less than 40 watts shall be provided and shall be operating in each room or enclosure where massage services are being performed on clients, and in all areas where clients are present.
- (r) Ventilation shall be provided in accordance with applicable building codes and regulations.
- (s) Hot and cold running water shall be provided at all times.
- (t) Adequate dressing, locker and toilet facilities shall be provided for clients.
- (u) A minimum of one wash basin for employees shall be provided at all times. The basin shall be located within or as close as practicable to the area devoted to performing of massage services. Sanitary towels shall also be provided at each basin.
- (v) All massage businesses shall comply with all state and federal laws and regulations for handicapped clients.
- (w) A massage practitioner shall operate only under the name specified in his or her CAMTC certificate. A massage business shall operate only under the name specified in its City registration certificate.
- (x) No massage business shall allow any person to reside within the massage business or in attached structures owned, leased or controlled by the massage business.
- (y) Other than custodial or maintenance staff, no persons shall be permitted within the premises of a massage business between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.





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Sec. 19-128. ~~Massage technician permit.~~ *INSPECTION BY OFFICIALS.*

~~No person shall perform or administer a massage or advertise to provide massage services in the City of Oakdale, unless such person has in effect a valid massage technician permit issued pursuant to, and complies with the requirements of, section 19-129 and section 19-130 of this article.~~

*The investigating and enforcing officials of the City of Oakdale, including, but not limited to, the police, Health Officer and Director of Building and Planning, or their designees, shall have the right to enter the premises from time to time during regular business hours for the purpose of making reasonable inspections to observe and enforce compliance with building, fire, electrical, plumbing or health regulations, and to enforce compliance with applicable regulations, laws, and statutes, and with the provisions of this chapter. The massage business may be charged a fee for any safety inspections.*

Sec. 19-129. ~~Application for massage technician permit.~~ *NOTIFICATIONS.*

- ~~(a) — Any person seeking a massage technician permit shall file a written application on the required form with the police chief. The application shall be accompanied by the appropriate filing fee established by resolution of the city council. The application shall contain the following information:~~
- (a) A massage business shall notify the Chief of Police of any changes described in Section 19-126 pursuant to the timelines specified therein.
- ~~(1) — A statement of the exact location at which the applicant will be working as a massage technician, including the full street address and all telephone numbers associated with the location. Massage technicians who provide services to patrons at a residence, business, or other location shall maintain a current ledger that, at a minimum, provides information on the date and time of the appointment, the length of time at the appointment, and the address where the service was provided. The patron's name and other personal information shall be omitted from the ledger. Massage technicians shall keep their ledgers for a period of not less than two years. The ledger will be subject to inspection by the Oakdale Police Chief or designee upon request.~~
- (2) — The following personal information of the applicant:
  - ~~a. — Full complete name and all aliases used by the applicant;~~
  - ~~b. — Current address and telephone number and all previous residential addresses for the eight years preceding the date of the application;~~



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- c. ~~Acceptable written proof that the applicant is at least eighteen years of age;~~
  - d. ~~Height, weight, color of hair and eyes and gender;~~
  - e. ~~Two front-faced portrait photographs at least two inches by two inches in size;~~
  - f. ~~The business, occupation and employment history of the applicant for the eight years immediately preceding the date of the application;~~
  - g. ~~The complete massage permit history of the applicant: whether such person has ever had any permit or license, issued by any agency, board, city, county, territory or state; the date of issuance of such a permit or license; or whether the permit or license was denied, revoked or suspended and the reasons therefor;~~
- (3) ~~All criminal convictions, including pleas of nolo contendere, within the last eight years, including those dismissed or expunged pursuant to Penal Code section 1203.4, but excluding minor traffic violations, and the date and place of each such conviction and explanation thereof;~~
- (4) ~~A complete set of fingerprints taken by the police department;~~
- (5) ~~Authorization for the city, its agents and employees to seek verification of the information contained in the application;~~
- (6) ~~Such other identification and information as the police chief may reasonably require in order to discover the truth of the matters herein specified and as required to be set forth in the application;~~
- (7) ~~A statement in writing and dated by the applicant certifying under penalty of perjury that all information contained in the application is true and correct;~~
- (8) ~~A statement in writing and dated by the applicant certifying under penalty of perjury that he or she:~~
- a. ~~Has received a copy of this article;~~
  - b. ~~Understands its contents; and~~
  - c. ~~Understands the duties of a massage technician as provided in this article.~~



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- ~~(9) An original or certified copy of a diploma or certificate and certified transcript of graduation for completion of two hundred fifty hours of instruction from a qualified massage educational program.~~

The police chief may consider an applicant's study of massage completed outside the State of California if proof of completion from a formalized course of study in massage practice, anatomy and/or physiology is provided with the application. Proof of completion shall include dates of study and the name, address and phone number of the school attended.~~
- ~~b. Any out-of-state course of study submitted for approval shall meet the State of California's Office of Post-Secondary Education's minimum requirements and be for completion of two hundred fifty hours of on-premises training.~~
- ~~(b) If, during the term of a permit, a permit holder has any change in information submitted on the original or renewal application, the permit holder shall notify the police department of such change in writing within ten business days thereafter. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

(b) A registrant shall report to Chief of Police any of the following within 96 hours of the occurrence:

- (1) Arrests of any employees or owners of the registrant's massage business for an offense other than a misdemeanor traffic offense;
- (2) Resignations, terminations, or transfers of practitioners employed by the registrant's massage business;
- (3) Any event involving the registrant's massage business or the massage practitioners employed therein that constitutes a violation of this chapter or state or federal law.

(c) This provision requires reporting to the Chief of Police even if the massage business believes that the Chief of Police has or will receive the information from another source.

Sec. 19-130. Massage technician permit issuance and denial. EXEMPTIONS.



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The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the following classes of individuals or businesses while engaged in the performance of their duties:

(a) — Upon receipt of a complete permit application, the police chief shall conduct an investigation to ascertain whether such permit should be issued as requested. The police chief shall approve, conditionally approve or deny the application within sixty days of the filing of an application. The sixty-day period may be continued for up to thirty additional days, if necessary, to complete the inspection. The police chief shall issue such permit as requested, unless he or she makes any of the following findings:

(a) Physicians, surgeons, chiropractors, osteopaths, nurses or any physical therapists who are duly licensed to practice their respective professions in the State of California and persons working directly under the supervision of or at the direction of such licensed persons, working at the same location as the licensed person, and administering massage services subject to review or oversight by the licensed person.

(1) — The applicant has within eight years preceding the date of the application been convicted of any of the following:

- a. — A violation of Penal Code sections 266, 266a, 266b, 266d, 266e, 266f, 266g, 266h, 266i, 314, 315, 316, 318, 647(a), 647(b) or 647(d) or that the applicant is required to register under the provisions of Penal Code section 290 or when the prosecution accepted a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to a charge of a violation of Penal Code section 415 or any lesser included or lesser related offense in satisfaction of, or as a substitute for, any of the previously listed crimes;
- b. — A violation of Health & Safety Code section 11550 or any offense involving the illegal sale, distribution or possession of a controlled substance specified in Health & Safety Code sections 11054, 11055, 11056, 11057 or 11058; or
- c. — Any offense in any other state which is the equivalent of any of the above-mentioned offenses;
- d. — An act involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or moral turpitude or an act of violence, which act or acts are substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a massage technician;

(2) — The applicant has had an operator permit or massage technician permit or other similar license or permit denied, suspended or revoked for cause by a licensing authority or by any city, county or state within eight years prior to the date of the application.

(3) — The applicant has knowingly made a false, misleading or fraudulent statement or omission of fact to the city in the permit application process.



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- (4) — ~~The application does not contain the information required by section 19-129.~~
- (5) — ~~The applicant has not satisfied the requirements of this article in the time specified.~~
- (6) — ~~If the application is denied for failure to comply with subsections (3) or (4) above, the applicant may not reapply for a period of six months from the date the application was denied.~~
- (b) — ~~All massage technicians shall comply with the following conditions and any other reasonable conditions specified by the police chief on issuance of the massage technician permit.~~
- (b) *Barbers and cosmetologists who are duly licensed under the laws of the State of California while engaging in practices within the scope of their licenses, except that this provision shall apply solely to the massaging of the neck, face and/or scalp, hands or feet of the clients.*
- (1) — ~~Prohibited massage areas. Except to the extent required, in writing, by a state-licensed medical practitioner, no massage technician shall massage the genitals or anal area of any patron.~~
- (2) — ~~Covering. No massage technician shall massage any patron unless the person's genitals, and anus are fully covered at all times while the technician is present in the same room as the patron.~~
- (3) — ~~Identification cards. The massage technicians shall have on their possession or on the premises a photo identification card prepared and issued by the city. Such identification shall be provided to city regulatory officials upon demand. The identification card shall be placed on outer clothing with the photo side facing out. If a massage technician changes his or her business address, he or she shall, prior to such change, obtain from the police chief a new photo identification card and advise the police department, in writing, of the new business address.~~
- (5) — ~~Names. While on duty, the massage technician shall not use any name other than that specified on the photo identification card.~~
- (6) — ~~Clothing. The massage technician shall be fully clothed at all times. Clothing shall be of a fully opaque, nontransparent material and provide complete covering of the genitals, pubic area, buttocks, anal area and chest.~~
- (7) — ~~Inspections and searches. The massage technician consents to the inspection of the massage establishment by the city's building department, police department, and the fire department and Stanislaus County Health Department for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article or other applicable laws~~



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~~or regulations are met. The massage technician consents to the inspection of the occupied massage rooms by a member of the police department for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article are met upon occurrence of any of the conditions described in section 19-131(b)(16) which would require the posting of the Notice to All Patrons. The member shall knock, announce his presence, and request that the technician answer the door. The technician shall exit the room within a reasonable period of time. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

- (c) Hospitals, nursing homes, mental health facilities, or any other health facilities duly licensed by the State of California, and employees of these licensed institutions, while acting within the scope of their employment.
- (d) Accredited high schools, junior colleges, and colleges or universities whose coaches and trainers are acting within the scope of their employment.
- (e) Trainers of amateur, semi-professional or professional athletes or athletic teams while engaging in their training responsibilities for and with athletes; and trainers working in conjunction with a specific athletic event.
- (f) Individuals administering massages or health treatment involving massage to persons participating in single-occurrence athletic, recreational or festival events, such as health fairs, road races, track meets, triathlons and other similar events; provided, that all of the following conditions are satisfied:
  - (1) The massage services are made equally available to all participants in the event;
  - (2) The event is open to participation by the general public or a significant segment of the public such as employees of sponsoring or participating corporations;
  - (3) The massage services are provided at the site of the event and either during, immediately preceding or immediately following the event;
  - (4) The sponsors of the event have been advised of and have approved the provisions of massage services;
  - (5) The persons providing the massage services are not the primary sponsors of the event.



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Sec. 19-131. Requirements for the operation of a massage establishment.  
UNLAWFUL BUSINESS PRACTICES MAY BE ENJOINED; REMEDIES  
CUMULATIVE.

Any massage business operated, conducted or maintained contrary to the provisions of this chapter shall constitute an unlawful business practice pursuant to Business and Professions Code Section 17200 et seq., and the City Attorney or District Attorney may, in the exercise of discretion, in addition to or in lieu of taking any other action permitted by this chapter, commence an action or actions, proceeding or proceedings in the Superior Court of Stanislaus County, seeking an injunction prohibiting the unlawful business practice and/or any other remedy available at law, including but not limited to fines, attorneys fees and costs. All remedies provided for in this chapter are cumulative.

~~(a) — Facilities.~~

- ~~(1) — Structure. Massage establishments shall be located in a zoning district, which permits such use. When a new massage establishment is constructed, three sets of plans shall be submitted to the city and the health department for approval and shall be accompanied by the appropriate plan check fee.~~
- ~~(2) — Signs; display of permits. Each operator shall post and maintain, in compliance with existing state and city laws, a readable sign identifying the premises as a massage establishment. The sign and the front of the business shall not be illuminated by strobe or flashing lights. Each operator and/or on-duty manager shall display the operator permit in a conspicuous public place in the lobby of the massage establishment. Each operator and/or on-duty manager shall ensure the massage technician permit for each massage technician employed at the establishment (whether on-duty or not) is conspicuously displayed in a public place in the lobby, and that each massage technician is wearing the identification required by section 19-130(b)(3) at all times when in the massage establishment. The operator and/or on-duty manager must also post, on a daily basis in a conspicuous public place in the lobby, the name of the operator and on-duty manager, as well as all on-duty massage technicians. Finally, the hours of operation must be posted in the front window and clearly visible from the outside.~~
- ~~(3) — Services list. Each operator shall post and maintain a list of services available and the cost of such services in a conspicuous public place within the premises. No massage establishment may offer baths as a service unless the patron is bathing in a room alone. No operator or on-~~





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~~duty manager shall permit, and no massage technician shall offer or perform, any service other than those posted.~~

- ~~(4) — Lighting. Each operator shall provide in each room where massage is given sufficient lighting and ventilation that complies with the Uniform Building Code. The lighting in each massage room shall be activated at all times while the patron is in such room or enclosure.~~
- ~~(5) — Restroom facilities. A minimum of one toilet and one separate wash basin shall be provided for patrons in each massage establishment, which basin shall provide soap or detergent and hot running water at all times and shall be located within close proximity to the area devoted to massage services. A soap dispenser, filled with soap, and a single service towel dispenser shall be provided at the restroom handwash sink. No bar soap may be used. A trash receptacle shall be provided in each toilet room. Showers may be provided at the operator's option.~~
- ~~(6) — Maintenance. All facilities for the massage establishment must be in good repair and shall be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized each day the business is in operation. All walls, floors and ceilings of each restroom and shower area shall be made smooth and easily cleanable. No carpeting shall be installed in any of these areas.~~
- ~~(7) — Handicapped areas. Massage establishments shall comply with all state and federal laws and regulations for handicapped customers.~~
- ~~(8) — Doors. All front, reception, hallway or front exterior doors (except back or exterior doors used solely for employee entrance to and exit from the massage establishment) shall be unlocked during business hours, except as may be permitted by applicable law (such as the Uniform Fire Code) which allow for safety doors which may be opened from the inside when locked. No massage may be given within any cubicle, room, enclosure or any area within a massage establishment which is fitted with a lock of any kind (such as a locking door knob, padlock, dead bolt, sliding bar or similar device), unless the only door is an exterior door.~~

~~(b) — Operations.~~

- ~~(1) — Equipment. Each operator and/or on-duty manager shall provide and maintain on the premises adequate equipment for disinfecting and sterilizing instruments used in massage.~~
- ~~(2) — Inspections. The operator and/or on-duty manager consents to the inspection of the massage establishment by the city's building department, police department and the fire department and health department for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article or other applicable laws or regulations are met.~~



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- a. ~~The city's building department, police department and the fire department and health department may, from time to time, make an inspection of each massage establishment for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article, state law or other applicable laws or regulations are met. Routine inspections shall not occur more than twice a year, unless violations are found or complaints are received. Criminal investigations may be conducted as directed by the police chief. The police department may inspect the occupied massage rooms for the purpose of determining that the provisions of this article are met upon occurrence of any of the conditions described in subsection section 19-131(b)(15) which would require the posting of the Notice to All Patrons. During an inspection, the police department may verify the identity of all on-duty employees.~~
- b. ~~Inspections of the massage establishment shall be conducted during business hours.~~
- c. ~~An operator or his or her agent, servant or employee, commits an offense if he or she refuses to permit a lawful inspection of the premises by a representative of the police department at any time it is occupied or open for business.~~
- (3) ~~Clothing. All persons employed in the massage establishment shall be fully clothed at all times while present at the massage establishment. Clothing shall be of a fully opaque, nontransparent material and shall provide complete covering of the genitals, pubic area, buttocks, anal area and chest.~~
- (4) ~~Roster of employees. The operator and/or on-duty manager shall maintain a register of all employees showing the name, nicknames and aliases used by the employee, residential address, age, birth date, gender, height, weight, color of hair and eyes, phone numbers, date of employment and termination, if any, and duties of each employee. The above information on each employee shall be maintained in the register on the premises for a period of two years following termination. The operator and/or on-duty manager shall make the register of employees available immediately for inspection upon demand of a representative of the police department at all reasonable times.~~
- (5) ~~Linen. Common use of towels or linen shall not be permitted. Towels and linen shall be laundered or changed promptly after each use. Separate cabinets or containers shall be provided for the storage of clean and soiled towels or linen.~~
- (6) ~~Living prohibited. No person or persons shall be allowed to live inside the massage establishment at any time. All living quarters shall be separate from the massage establishment. No food of any kind shall be prepared for sale or sold in~~



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~~the establishment unless an appropriate food vending permit is granted by the County of Stanislaus.~~

- ~~(7) Recordings. No electrical, mechanical or artificial device shall be used by the operator or any employee of the massage establishment for audio and/or video recording or for monitoring the performance of a massage or the conversation or other sounds in the massage rooms without the knowledge or consent of the patron.~~
- ~~(8) Coverings. Each massage establishment shall provide to all patrons clean, sanitary and opaque coverings capable of covering the patrons specified anatomical areas, including the genital area, anus and female breast(s). No common use of such coverings shall be permitted, and re-use is prohibited unless adequately cleaned.~~
- ~~(9) Records or treatment. The operator shall keep a record of the dates and hours of each treatment or service, the name and address of the patron, the name of technician administering such service and a description of the treatment or service rendered. A short medical history form shall be completed by the patron to determine if the patron has any communicable diseases, areas of pain, high blood pressure or any physical condition which may be adversely affected by massage. These records shall be prepared prior to administering any massage or treatment and shall be retained for a period of twenty-four months after such treatment or service. These records shall be open to inspection upon demand only by officials charged with enforcement of this article and for no other purpose. The police department shall periodically inspect the records to ensure compliance with this section. The information furnished or secured as a result of any such records should be used only to ensure and enforce compliance with this article or any other applicable state or federal laws and shall remain confidential. Any unauthorized disclosure or use of such information by any officer or employee of the city shall constitute a misdemeanor.~~
- ~~(10) Advertising. No massage establishment shall place, publish or distribute, or cause to be placed, published or distributed, any advertising matter that depicts female breasts showing nipples, genitals, or the anus.~~
- ~~(11) Access. No person(s) other than valid permit holders under this article and customers will be allowed anywhere in the massage establishment other than the lobby/reception area during hours of operation. Entry doors to any room shall not be obstructed by any means. Student(s) enrolled in a school of massage therapy or those who have recently graduated from such a school are exempted from this requirement if for lab credit and/or as a learning exercise.~~
- ~~(12) Sexual paraphernalia. Instruments, devices or paraphernalia that are designed for use in connection with sexual activities, including, but not limited to, condoms, shall not be permitted within a massage establishment.~~



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- (13) ~~Compliance. Massage establishments shall comply with all applicable provisions of the Oakdale Municipal Code.~~
- (14) ~~Notices. The police chief may require that the following notice be posted in the event that any employee of the massage establishment or any person who has been aided and abetted by an employee of the massage establishment has been found, after full hearing by administrative proceeding or state court, to have violated any of the offenses listed in section 19-127 and section 19-130:~~

- c. ~~The requirement for posting the notice described in this subsection is cumulative and in addition to all other remedies, violations and penalties set forth in this article or in the ordinances, laws, rules or regulations of the city, County of Stanislaus and the State of California. Sec. 19-132. ~~Changes of business. ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION.~~

- (a) ~~Every massage establishment operator shall report immediately to the police department any and all changes of ownership or management of the massage establishment or business, including, but not limited to, changes of manager or other person principally in charge, stockholders holding more than five percent of the stock of the corporation, officers, directors and partners in any and all changes of name, style or designation under which the business is to be conducted and all changes of address or telephone numbers of the massage business. A change of location of any of the premises may be approved by the police chief provided there is compliance with all applicable regulations of the City of Oakdale.~~
- (a) Violations. Any violations may be subject to the administrative citation process as set forth in this Code.



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~~(b) No massage technician permit or operator permit may be sold, transferred or assigned by a permittee, or by operation of law, to any other person or persons. Any such sale, transfer or assignment, or attempted sale, transfer or assignment, shall be deemed to constitute a voluntary surrender of such permit and such permit shall thereafter be null and void; provided and excepting, however, that if the permittee is a partnership and one or more of the partners should die, one or more of the surviving partners may acquire, by purchase or otherwise, the interest of the deceased partner or partners without effecting a surrender or termination of such permit, and in such case, the permit, upon notification to the police chief, shall be placed in the name of the surviving partners. No massage technician permit may be sold, transferred or assigned by a permittee or any operation of law to any other person or persons. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

(b) *Separate Violations. Each violation of any provision of this chapter shall constitute a separate violation. Each client to whom massage is provided or offered in violation of this chapter shall also constitute a separate violation. Each day upon which a massage business remains open for business in violation of this chapter shall also constitute a separate violation.*

Sec. 19-133. ~~Fees.~~ *SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF CITY REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES.*

~~The city council shall establish by resolution, and from time to time may amend, the fees for the administration of this article. The city may include in this resolution a health services fee schedule prescribing annual fees to be paid by the operator of each massage establishment, such fees to be paid directly to the health department and retained by the county as reimbursement for the services related to this article. Fees required by this article shall be in addition to any required by this Code. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

(a) *Reasons. Certificates of registration may be suspended or revoked by the Chief of Police upon finding any of the following grounds:*

(1) *A massage practitioner is no longer in possession of current and valid CAMTC certification. This subsection shall apply to a sole proprietor or a person employed or used by a massage business to provide massage.*

(2) *An owner or sole proprietor fails to register under the provisions of California Penal Code Section 290 (sex offender registration), is convicted of California Penal Code Sections 266i (pandering), 315 (keeping or residing in a house of ill-fame), 316 (keeping disorderly house), 318 (prevailing upon person to visit a place for prostitution), 647(b) (engaging in or soliciting prostitution), 653.22 (loitering with intent to commit prostitution), 653.23 (supervision of*



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prostitute); has a business permit or license denied, revoked, restricted, or suspended by any agency, board, city, county, territory, or state; is subject to an injunction for nuisance pursuant to California Penal Code Sections 11225—11235 (red light abatement); is convicted of a felony offense involving the sale of a controlled substance; is convicted of any crime involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit, violence, or moral turpitude; or is convicted in any other state of an offense which, if committed in this state, would have been punishable as one or more referenced offenses in this subsection.

(3) The City determines that a material misrepresentation was included on the application for a certificate of registration or renewal.

(4) Violations of any of the following occurred on the premises of a massage business or were committed by a massage practitioner: California Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq.; any local, state, or federal law; or the provisions of this chapter.

(b) Procedures. Written notice of the suspension or revocation shall be served on the sole proprietor or owners by personal service or certified mail with the legal violation and supporting facts. The notice shall contain an advisement of the right to request an appeal hearing before the Police Chief.

(c) Time Period of Suspension of Permit. The Chief of Police may suspend a registration for a period between five days and the end of the license term, at his or her discretion.

(d) Effective Date of Suspension or Revocation. Suspension or revocation issued pursuant to subsection (b) of this section will be effective 10 days from the date appearing on the order, unless a timely appeal is filed in accordance with subsection (e) of this section.

(e) Appeal.

(1) The decision of the Chief of Police is appealable to the City Manager.

(2) An appeal must be in writing, and be hand-delivered or mailed to the City Manager's office.



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- (3) An appeal must be received by the City Manager on or before the effective date of suspension or revocation provided by subsection (d) of this section.
- (4) The filing of a timely appeal will stay a suspension or revocation pending a decision on the appeal by the City Manager.
- (5) A hearing shall be scheduled before the City Manager within 30 days. Either the appellant or the Police Chief may request, in writing directed to the City Manager, a continuance of the hearing. Such requests must be supported by good cause. The decision whether to grant a continuance is at the discretion of the City Manager, who shall consider whether granting the continuance poses a threat to public health or safety in light of the severity of the violations alleged.
- (6) The decision of the City Manager shall be final, with no further administrative right of appeal or reconsideration. The City Manager may sustain a suspension or revocation, overrule a suspension or revocation, reduce a revocation to a suspension and/or reduce the length of a suspension. Further, the City Manager may stay the effective date of any suspension for a reasonable time following a hearing.
- (f) Reapplication. No reapplication will be accepted within one year after a certificate is revoked.
- (g) Evidence. The following rules shall apply to any hearing required by this section. All parties involved shall have the right to offer testimonial, documentary, and tangible evidence bearing on the issues, to be represented by counsel, and to confront and cross-examine witnesses. Any relevant evidence may be admitted if it is the sort of evidence upon which reasonable persons are accustomed to rely in the conduct of serious affairs. Formal rules of evidence and discovery do not apply to proceedings governed by this chapter. Unless otherwise specifically prohibited by law, the burden of proof is on the registrant in any hearing or other matter under this chapter.

Sec. 19-134. ~~Exemption; existing permittees.~~ PUBLIC NUISANCE.

It shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for a massage business to be operated, conducted, or maintained contrary to the provisions of this chapter. The City may exercise its discretion, in addition to or in lieu of prosecuting a criminal action, to commence proceedings for the abatement, removal, and enjoinder of that business in any manner provided by law.





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- (a) ~~The requirements of this article shall have no application and no effect upon and shall not be construed as applying to any persons designated as follows: state-licensed physicians, surgeons, chiropractors, physical therapists, osteopaths or any registered or licensed vocational nurse working on the premises of, and under the direct supervision of, a state-licensed physician, surgeon, chiropractor or osteopath. ~~(2) — The police chief may suspend a massage technician permit for a period of thirty days for each violation of section 19-130(b) not listed above, or section 19-131.~~

~~(c) — Notice. When the police chief concludes that grounds for denial, suspension, revocation or refusal to renew a permit exist, he or she shall serve the applicant or permit holder, either personally or by certified mail addressed to the business or residential address of applicant or permit holder, with a Notice of Denial or Notice of Intent to Suspend, Revoke or Refuse to Renew Permit. This notice shall state the reasons for the proposed action, the effective date of the decision, the right of the applicant or permit holder to appeal the decision to the city council, and that the decision will be final if no appeal is filed within the time permitted.~~

~~(e) — Appeal.~~

~~(1) — The right to appeal shall terminate upon the expiration of fifteen days from the date of mailing of the notice. The notice of appeal shall be filed with the police department, along with the payment of any hearing fee which may be established by city council resolution. Any hearing fee shall not exceed the reasonable cost to the city of a hearing.~~

~~(2) — In the event an appeal is timely filed, the suspension or revocation shall not be effective until a final decision has been rendered. If no appeal is filed, the~~

- ~~(3) The city manager shall appoint a neutral hearing officer in consultation with the appellant to conduct the hearing, receive relevant evidence and render a decision. The decision of the hearing officer shall be final. The appellant shall be entitled to notice of the basis for the proposed action, a copy of the documents upon which the decision was based and the opportunity to present contrary evidence at the hearing.~~
- ~~(4) Notice of the date, time and place of the hearing shall be mailed at least ten days prior to the date of the hearing, by U.S. Mail, with proof of service attached, to the address listed on the application, or the address given in the Notice of Appeal, if different.~~
- ~~(5) The following rules and evidence shall apply:
  - ~~a. Oral evidence shall be taken only under oath or affirmation. The hearing officer shall have authority to administer oaths and to receive and rule on admissibility of evidence;~~

- ~~(f) No permit granted herein shall confer any vested right to any person or business for more than the permit period. All operators, managers and massage technicians subject to this article shall comply with the provisions of this article as they may be amended hereafter. (Ord. No. 1151)~~



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Sec. 19-137. Attorneys' fees and costs.

- (a) — ~~In any action, administrative proceeding or special proceeding commenced by the city to abate a public nuisance or to enjoin violation of any provision of this article, if the city elects, at the initiation of that individual action or proceeding, to seek recovery of its own attorneys' fees, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover all costs incurred therein, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of suit. In no action, administrative proceeding or special proceeding shall an award of attorneys' fees to a prevailing party exceed the amount of reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the city in the action or proceeding.~~
- (b) — ~~The city shall be considered a prevailing party entitled to attorneys' fees under subsection (a) when it can demonstrate that:~~
- ~~(1) — Its lawsuit was the catalyst motivating the defendant to provide the primary relief sought;~~
  - ~~(2) — The lawsuit was meritorious and achieved its result by "threat of victory;" and~~
  - ~~(3) — The city reasonably attempted to settle the litigation before filing the lawsuit. (Ord. No. 1151)~~

Sec. 19-138. Violation and penalty.

- (a) — ~~Violations of this article may be enforced as set forth in the Oakdale Municipal Code.~~
- (b) — ~~Any massage establishment operated, conducted or maintained contrary to the provisions of this article shall be, and the same is declared to be, unlawful and a public nuisance, and the city may, in addition to or in lieu of prosecuting a criminal action hereunder, commence an action or actions, proceeding or proceedings for the abatement, removal and enjoinder thereof, in the manner provided by law, and shall take such other steps and shall apply to such court or courts as may have jurisdiction to grant such relief as will abate or remove such massage establishments and restrain and enjoin any person from operating, conducting or maintaining a massage establishment contrary to the provisions of this article. The CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE, CALIFORNIA DOES  
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT OF CODE: Article VIII of Chapter 19 of the Oakdale  
City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Article VIII. Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations.

This article shall be known as the "Oakdale Massage Establishment Regulations."

Sec. 19-123. Findings and purpose.

The city council finds and declares as follows:

- (a) In enacting this chapter, the City Council recognizes that commercial massage therapy is a professional pursuit, which can offer the public valuable health and therapeutic services. The City Council further recognizes that, unless properly regulated, the practice of massage therapy and the operation of massage businesses may be associated with unlawful activity and pose a threat to the quality of life in the local community. Accordingly, it is the purpose and intent of this chapter to protect the public health, safety, and welfare by providing for the orderly regulation of businesses providing massage therapy services, discouraging prostitution and related illegal activities carried on under the guise of massage therapy, and establishing certain sanitation, health, and operational standards for massage businesses.
- (b) Furthermore, it is the purpose and intent of this chapter to address the negative impacts identified in the City Council's findings to reduce or prevent neighborhood blight and to protect and preserve the quality of City neighborhoods and commercial districts; and to enhance enforcement of criminal statutes relating to the conduct of operators and employees of massage businesses.



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(c) It is the Council's further purpose and intent to rely upon the uniform statewide regulations applicable to massage practitioners and establishments that were enacted by the State Legislature in 2008 as Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq. by Senate Bill 731, and amended in 2011 by Assembly Bill 619 and in 2014 by Assembly Bill 1147, to restrict the commercial practice of massage in the City to those persons duly certified to practice by the California Massage Therapy Council and to provide for the registration and regulation of massage businesses for health and safety purposes to the extent allowed by law.

Sec. 19-124. Definitions.

Unless the context otherwise requires, the definitions and provisions contained in this section shall govern the construction, meaning and application of words and phrases used in this article.

(a) "Business" includes, but not by way of limitation, everything about which a person can be employed, and means that which occupies the time, attention, and labor of men and women for the purpose of producing a livelihood or profit, and connotes the efforts of men and women by varied and diverse methods of dealing with each other, to improve their individual economic conditions, and for the purposes of this chapter shall include, without limitation, the advertising and soliciting of massages. The term "business" includes, but is not limited to, a massage practitioner who is the sole owner, operator and employee of a massage business operating as a sole proprietorship, as well as a massage establishment, which employs massage practitioners and therapists.

(b) "City manager" shall mean the City manager of the City of Oakdale or his or her designated representative.

(c) "California Massage Therapy Council" or "CAMTC" means the massage therapy organization formed pursuant to Business and Professions Code Section 4600.5.

(d) "Certified massage practitioner" means any individual certified by the California Massage Therapy Council as a certified massage therapist or as a certified massage practitioner pursuant to California Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq.





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- (e) “Client” means the customer or patron who pays for or receives massage services.
- (f) “Employee” means any person employed by a massage business who may render any service to the business, and who receives any form of compensation from the business.
- (g) “Health Officer” means the person appointed by the City of Oakdale pursuant to the California Health and Safety Code or his or her authorized representatives or designees.
- (h) “Compensation” means the payment, loan, advance, donation, contribution, deposit, exchange, or gift of money or anything of value.
- (i) “Massage” or “massage therapy,” means and refers to any method of treating the external parts of the body for remedial, health, or hygienic purposes for any form of compensation by means of pressure on or friction against, or stroking, kneading, rubbing, tapping, pounding, or stimulating the external parts of the body, with or without the aid of any mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances; or with or without supplementary aids, such as rubbing alcohol, liniments, antiseptics, oils, powders, creams, lotions, ointments, or other similar preparations commonly used in this practice; or by baths, including but not limited to Turkish, Russian, Swedish, Japanese, vapor, shower, electric tub, sponge, mineral, fomentation, or any other type of bath.
- (j) “Massage business,” means any business that offers massage therapy in the City of Oakdale in exchange for compensation, whether at a fixed place of business or at a location designated by the customer or client through outcall massage services. Any business that offers any combination of massage therapy and bath facilities—including, but not limited to, showers, baths, wet and dry heat rooms, pools and hot tubs—shall be deemed a massage business under this chapter. The term “massage business” includes a certified massage practitioner who is the sole owner, operator and employee of a massage business operating as a sole proprietorship.
- (k) “Outcall massage” means the engaging in or carrying on of massage therapy for compensation in a location other than the business operations address set forth in the massage business’s City registration certificate.



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- (l) "Operator" or "massage business operator" shall mean any and all owners of a massage business.
- (m) "City registration certificate" means a registration certificate issued by the Chief of Police upon submission of satisfactory evidence that a massage business employs or uses only certified massage practitioners pursuant to this chapter.
- (n) "Police Chief" shall mean the Police Chief of the City of Oakdale or his or her authorized representatives or designees.
- (o) "Owner" or "massage business owner" means any of the following persons:
- (1) Any person who is a general partner of a general or limited partnership that owns a massage business.
  - (2) Any person who has five percent or greater ownership interest in a corporation that owns a massage business.
  - (3) Any person who is a member of a limited liability company that owns a massage business.
  - (4) Any person who has a five percent or greater ownership interest in any other type of business association that owns a massage business.
- (p) "School of massage" means any school or institution of learning that is recognized as an approved school pursuant to Business and Professions Code Division 2, Chapter 10.5, as currently drafted or as may be amended.
- (q) "Person" means any individual, firm, association, partnership, corporation, joint venture, limited liability company, or combination of individuals.
- (r) "Practitioner" or "massage practitioner" shall be used interchangeably and mean any person who administers massage to another person, for any form of consideration (whether for the massage, as part of other services or a product, or otherwise).
- (s) "Reception and waiting area" means an area immediately inside the front door of the massage business dedicated to the reception and waiting of patrons of the massage business and visitors, and which is not a massage therapy room or otherwise used for the provision of massage therapy services.
- (t) "Registration" means the registration required by this chapter to operate a massage business.



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(u) "Sole proprietorship" means and includes any legal form of business organization where the business owner (sometimes referred to as the "sole proprietor") is the only person employed by that business to provide massage services.

(v) "Solicit" means to request, ask, demand or otherwise arrange for the provision of services.

Sec. 19-125. CAMTC CERTIFICATION AND LOCAL REGISTRATION REQUIRED.

(a) Individuals. It shall be unlawful for any individual to practice massage therapy for compensation as a sole proprietorship or employee of a massage business or in any other capacity with the City of Oakdale unless that individual is a certified massage practitioner through the CAMTC or possesses a current valid noncertified massage business permit obtained prior to October 1, 2019, under the previous massage ordinance.

(b) Businesses. It shall be unlawful for any business to provide massage for compensation within the City of Oakdale unless all individuals employed by the massage business to perform massage, whether as an employee, independent contractor, or sole proprietorship, are certified massage practitioners through CAMTC or possess a current valid noncertified massage business permit obtained prior to October 1, 2019, under the previous massage ordinance, and said business has obtained a valid City registration certificate as provided in this chapter.

Sec. 19-126. MESSAGE BUSINESS REGISTRATION.

(a) Application. The registration application for a City registration certificate shall include all of the following:

(1) Legal name of the massage business.

(2) Address and all telephone numbers of the massage business.

(3) Legal names of all owners of the massage business.

(4) A list of all of the massage business's employees and independent contractors who are performing massage and their CAMTC certification.

(5) A list of all of the massage business's employees and independent contractors who are performing massage and their CAMTC certification.



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- (6) Business address and telephone number of all owners of the massage business.
  - (7) The form of business under which the massage business will be operating (i.e. corporation, general or limited partnership, limited liability company, or other form).
  - (8) Each owner operator of the massage business who is not a CAMTC-certified massage practitioner shall submit an application for a background check, including the following: the individual's business, occupation, and employment history for the five years preceding the date of the application; the inclusive dates of such employment history; the name and address of any massage business or similar business owned or operated by the individual whether inside or outside the County of Stanislaus and its incorporated cities.
  - (9) For all owners, a valid and current driver's license and/or identification issued by a state or federal governmental agency or other photographic identification bearing a bona fide seal by a foreign government.
  - (10) For all owners, a signed statement that all of the information contained in the application is true and correct; that all owners shall be responsible for the conduct of the business's employees or independent contractors providing massage services; and acknowledging that failure to comply with the California Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq., and local, state, or federal law, or the provisions of this chapter may result in revocation of the business's City registration certificate.
- (b) Issuance. Upon provision by the massage business of the foregoing documentation, the Chief of Police shall issue the massage business a City registration certificate, which shall be valid for two years from the date of issuance. No reapplication will be accepted within one year after an application or renewal is denied or a certificate is revoked. City registration certificates shall not be issued to a massage business seeking to operate at a particular location if:
- (1) Another massage business is or was operating at that particular location and that massage business is currently serving a suspension or revocation pursuant to Section 19-133, during the pendency of the suspension or one year following revocation;
  - (2) Another massage business is or was operating at that particular location and that massage business has received a notice of suspension, revocation, or fine issued pursuant to Sections 19-132 and 19-133, during the 10-day period



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following receipt of the notice or while any appeal of a suspension, revocation or fine is pending.

(3) Another massage business is or was operating at that particular location, and that massage business has outstanding fines issued pursuant to Section 19-132 that have not been paid.

(c) Amendment. A massage business shall apply to the City to amend its City registration certificate within 30 days after any change in the registration information, including, but not limited to, the hiring or termination of certified massage practitioners, the change of the business's address, or changes in the owner's addresses and/or telephone numbers.

(d) Renewal. A massage business shall apply to the City to renew its City registration certificate at least 30 days prior to the expiration of said City registration certificate. If an application for renewal of a City registration certificate and all required information is not timely received and the certificate expires, no right or privilege to provide massage shall exist.

(e) Fees. There shall be no fee for the registration application or certificate, or any amendment or renewal thereof. The provisions of this section shall not prevent the City from establishing fees for safety inspections as may be conducted from time to time by the Chief of Police, and for the background checks, fingerprinting, and subsequent arrest notification for owners of a massage business who are not CAMTC-certified and who are subject to such background checks pursuant to this chapter. There are certain fees for appeals as described below.

(f) Transfer. A City registration certificate shall not be transferred except with the prior written approval of the Chief of Police. A written request for such transfer shall contain the same information for the new ownership as is required for applications for registration pursuant to this section. In the event of denial, notification of the denial and reasons therefor shall be provided in writing and shall be provided to the applicant by personal delivery or by registered or certified mail. A City registration certificate may not be transferred during any period of suspension or one year following revocation pursuant to Section 19-133, during the 10-day period following a massage business's receipt of a notice of suspension, revocation or fine issued pursuant to Sections 19-132 and 19-133 or while any appeal of a suspension, revocation or fine is pending. Further, a City registration certificate may not be transferred until all outstanding fines issued pursuant to Section 19-132 have been paid.

Sec. 19-127. OPERATING REQUIREMENTS.



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No person shall engage in, conduct, carry on, or permit any massage within the City of Oakdale unless all of the following requirements are met:

- (a) CAMTC certification shall be worn by and clearly visible on the massage practitioner's person during working hours and at all times when the massage practitioner is inside a massage business or providing outcall massage.
- (b) Massage shall be provided or given only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. No massage business shall be open and no massage shall be provided between 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. A massage commenced prior to 9:00 p.m. shall nevertheless terminate at 9:00 p.m., and, in the case of a massage business, all clients shall exit the premises at that time. It is the obligation of the massage business to inform clients of the requirement that services must cease at 9:00 p.m.
- (c) A list of the services available and the cost of such services shall be posted in the reception area within the massage premises, and shall be described in readily understandable language. Outcall service providers shall provide such a list to clients in advance of performing any service. No owner, manager, operator, or responsible managing employee shall permit, and no massage practitioner shall offer or perform, any service other than those posted or listed as required herein, nor shall an operator or a massage practitioner request or charge a fee for any service other than those on the list of services available and posted in the reception area or provided to the client in advance of any outcall services.
- (d) A copy of the CAMTC certificate of each and every massage practitioner employed in the business shall be displayed in the reception area or similar open public place on the premises. CAMTC certificates of former employees and/or contractors shall be removed as soon as those massage practitioners are no longer employed by or offering services through the massage business.
- (e) For each massage service provided, every massage business shall keep a complete and legible written record of the following information: the date and hour that service was provided; the name and telephone number of each client; the service received; the name or initials of the employee entering the information; and the name of the massage practitioner administering the service. Such records shall be open to inspection and copying by police officers, enforcement officials, or other City officials charged with enforcement of this chapter. These records may not be used by any massage practitioner or operator for any purpose other than as records of service provided and may not be provided to other parties by the massage practitioner or operator unless



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otherwise required by law. Such records shall be retained on the premises of the massage business for a period of two years and be immediately available for inspection during business hours.

- (f) Massage businesses shall at all times be equipped with an adequate supply of clean sanitary towels, coverings and linens. Clean towels, coverings, and linens shall be stored in enclosed cabinets. Towels and linens shall not be used on more than one client, unless they have first been laundered and disinfected. Disposable towels and coverings shall not be used on more than one client. Soiled linens and paper towels shall be deposited in separate, approved receptacles.
- (g) Wet and dry heat rooms, steam or vapor rooms or cabinets, toilet rooms, shower and bath rooms, tanning booths, whirlpool baths and pools shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected as needed, and at least once each day the premises are open, with a disinfectant approved by the Health Officer. Bathtubs shall be thoroughly cleaned after each use with a disinfectant approved by the Health Officer. All walls, ceilings, floors, and other physical facilities for the business must be in good repair, and maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (h) Instruments utilized in performing massage shall not be used on more than one client unless they have been sterilized, using approved sterilization methods.
- (i) All massage business operators and their employees, including massage practitioners, shall wear clean, non-transparent outer garments. Said garments shall not expose their genitals, pubic areas, buttocks, or chest, and shall not be worn in such manner as to expose the genitals, pubic areas, buttocks, or chest. For the purposes of this section, outer garments means a garment worn over other garments and does not include garments like underwear, bras, lingerie or swimsuits.
- (j) No person shall enter, be, or remain in any part of a massage business while in possession of an open container of alcohol, or consuming or using any alcoholic beverage or drugs except pursuant to a prescription for such drugs. The owner, operator, responsible managing employee, or manager shall not permit any such person to enter or remain upon such premises.
- (k) No massage business shall operate as a school of massage, or use the same facilities as that of a school of massage.



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- (l) No massage business shall place, publish or distribute, or cause to be placed, published or distributed any advertising matter that depicts any portion of the human body that would reasonably suggest to prospective clients that any service is available other than those services listed as an available service pursuant to Section 19-127(c), nor shall any massage business employ language in the text of such advertising that would reasonably suggest to a prospective client that any service is available other than those services as described in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.
- (m) No massage shall be given unless the client's genitals are, at all times, fully covered. A massage practitioner shall not, in the course of administering any massage, make physical contact with the genitals or private parts of any other person regardless whether the contact is over or under the person's clothing.
- (n) Where the business has staff available to assure security for clients and massage staff are behind closed doors, the entry to the reception area of the massage business shall remain unlocked during business hours when the business is open for business or when clients are present.
- (o) No massage business located in a building or structure with exterior windows fronting a public street, highway, walkway, or parking area shall, during business hours, block visibility into the interior reception and waiting area through the use of curtains, closed blinds, tints, or any other material that obstructs, blurs, or unreasonably darkens the view into the premises. For the purpose of this subsection, there is an irrebuttable presumption that the visibility is impermissibly blocked if more than 10 percent of the interior reception and waiting area is not visible from the exterior window.
- (p) All signs shall be in conformance with the current ordinances of the City of Oakdale.
- (q) Minimum lighting consisting of at least one artificial light of not less than 40 watts shall be provided and shall be operating in each room or enclosure where massage services are being performed on clients, and in all areas where clients are present.
- (r) Ventilation shall be provided in accordance with applicable building codes and regulations.
- (s) Hot and cold running water shall be provided at all times.





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- (t) Adequate dressing, locker and toilet facilities shall be provided for clients.
- (u) A minimum of one wash basin for employees shall be provided at all times. The basin shall be located within or as close as practicable to the area devoted to performing of massage services. Sanitary towels shall also be provided at each basin.
- (v) All massage businesses shall comply with all state and federal laws and regulations for handicapped clients.
- (w) A massage practitioner shall operate only under the name specified in his or her CAMTC certificate. A massage business shall operate only under the name specified in its City registration certificate.
- (x) No massage business shall allow any person to reside within the massage business or in attached structures owned, leased or controlled by the massage business.
- (y) Other than custodial or maintenance staff, no persons shall be permitted within the premises of a massage business between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

Sec. 19-128. INSPECTION BY OFFICIALS.

The investigating and enforcing officials of the City of Oakdale, including, but not limited to, the police, Health Officer and Director of Building and Planning, or their designees, shall have the right to enter the premises from time to time during regular business hours for the purpose of making reasonable inspections to observe and enforce compliance with building, fire, electrical, plumbing or health regulations, and to enforce compliance with applicable regulations, laws, and statutes, and with the provisions of this chapter. The massage business may be charged a fee for any safety inspections.

Sec. 19-129. NOTIFICATIONS.

- (a) A massage business shall notify the Chief of Police of any changes described in Section 19-126 pursuant to the timelines specified therein.
- (b) A registrant shall report to Chief of Police any of the following within 96 hours of the occurrence:



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- (1) Arrests of any employees or owners of the registrant's massage business for an offense other than a misdemeanor traffic offense;
  - (2) Resignations, terminations, or transfers of practitioners employed by the registrant's massage business;
  - (3) Any event involving the registrant's massage business or the massage practitioners employed therein that constitutes a violation of this chapter or state or federal law.
- (c) This provision requires reporting to the Chief of Police even if the massage business believes that the Chief of Police has or will receive the information from another source.

Sec. 19-130. EXEMPTIONS.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the following classes of individuals or businesses while engaged in the performance of their duties:

- (a) Physicians, surgeons, chiropractors, osteopaths, nurses or any physical therapists who are duly licensed to practice their respective professions in the State of California and persons working directly under the supervision of or at the direction of such licensed persons, working at the same location as the licensed person, and administering massage services subject to review or oversight by the licensed person.
- (b) Barbers and cosmetologists who are duly licensed under the laws of the State of California while engaging in practices within the scope of their licenses, except that this provision shall apply solely to the massaging of the neck, face and/or scalp, hands or feet of the clients.
- (c) Hospitals, nursing homes, mental health facilities, or any other health facilities duly licensed by the State of California, and employees of these licensed institutions, while acting within the scope of their employment.
- (d) Accredited high schools, junior colleges, and colleges or universities whose coaches and trainers are acting within the scope of their employment.



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- (e) Trainers of amateur, semi-professional or professional athletes or athletic teams while engaging in their training responsibilities for and with athletes; and trainers working in conjunction with a specific athletic event.
- (f) Individuals administering massages or health treatment involving massage to persons participating in single-occurrence athletic, recreational or festival events, such as health fairs, road races, track meets, triathlons and other similar events; provided, that all of the following conditions are satisfied:
- (1) The massage services are made equally available to all participants in the event;
  - (2) The event is open to participation by the general public or a significant segment of the public such as employees of sponsoring or participating corporations;
  - (3) The massage services are provided at the site of the event and either during, immediately preceding or immediately following the event;
  - (4) The sponsors of the event have been advised of and have approved the provisions of massage services;
  - (5) The persons providing the massage services are not the primary sponsors of the event.

Sec. 19-131. UNLAWFUL BUSINESS PRACTICES MAY BE ENJOINED;  
REMEDIES CUMULATIVE.

Any massage business operated, conducted or maintained contrary to the provisions of this chapter shall constitute an unlawful business practice pursuant to Business and Professions Code Section 17200 et seq., and the City Attorney or District Attorney may, in the exercise of discretion, in addition to or in lieu of taking any other action permitted by this chapter, commence an action or actions, proceeding or proceedings in the Superior Court of Stanislaus County, seeking an injunction prohibiting the unlawful business practice and/or any other remedy available at law, including but not limited to fines, attorneys fees and costs. All remedies provided for in this chapter are cumulative.

Sec. 19-132. ADMINISTRATIVE CITATION.



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- (a) Violations. Any violations may be subject to the administrative citation process as set forth in this Code.
- (b) Separate Violations. Each violation of any provision of this chapter shall constitute a separate violation. Each client to whom massage is provided or offered in violation of this chapter shall also constitute a separate violation. Each day upon which a massage business remains open for business in violation of this chapter shall also constitute a separate violation.

Sec. 19-133. SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF CITY REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES.

- (a) Reasons. Certificates of registration may be suspended or revoked by the Chief of Police upon finding any of the following grounds:
- (1) A massage practitioner is no longer in possession of current and valid CAMTC certification. This subsection shall apply to a sole proprietor or a person employed or used by a massage business to provide massage.
- (2) An owner or sole proprietor fails to register under the provisions of California Penal Code Section 290 (sex offender registration), is convicted of California Penal Code Sections 266i (pandering), 315 (keeping or residing in a house of ill-fame), 316 (keeping disorderly house), 318 (prevailing upon person to visit a place for prostitution), 647(b) (engaging in or soliciting prostitution), 653.22 (loitering with intent to commit prostitution), 653.23 (supervision of prostitute); has a business permit or license denied, revoked, restricted, or suspended by any agency, board, city, county, territory, or state; is subject to an injunction for nuisance pursuant to California Penal Code Sections 11225—11235 (red light abatement); is convicted of a felony offense involving the sale of a controlled substance; is convicted of any crime involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit, violence, or moral turpitude; or is convicted in any other state of an offense which, if committed in this state, would have been punishable as one or more referenced offenses in this subsection.
- (3) The City determines that a material misrepresentation was included on the application for a certificate of registration or renewal.



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- (4) Violations of any of the following occurred on the premises of a massage business or were committed by a massage practitioner: California Business and Professions Code Sections 4600 et seq.; any local, state, or federal law; or the provisions of this chapter.
- (b) Procedures. Written notice of the suspension or revocation shall be served on the sole proprietor or owners by personal service or certified mail with the legal violation and supporting facts. The notice shall contain an advisement of the right to request an appeal hearing before the Police Chief.
- (c) Time Period of Suspension of Permit. The Chief of Police may suspend a registration for a period between five days and the end of the license term, at his or her discretion.
- (d) Effective Date of Suspension or Revocation. Suspension or revocation issued pursuant to subsection (b) of this section will be effective 10 days from the date appearing on the order, unless a timely appeal is filed in accordance with subsection (e) of this section.
- (e) Appeal.
- (1) The decision of the Chief of Police is appealable to the City Manager.
- (2) An appeal must be in writing, and be hand-delivered or mailed to the City Manager's office.
- (3) An appeal must be received by the City Manager on or before the effective date of suspension or revocation provided by subsection (d) of this section.
- (4) The filing of a timely appeal will stay a suspension or revocation pending a decision on the appeal by the City Manager.
- (5) A hearing shall be scheduled before the City Manager within 30 days. Either the appellant or the Police Chief may request, in writing directed to the City Manager, a continuance of the hearing. Such requests must be supported by good cause. The decision whether to grant a continuance is at the discretion of the City Manager, who shall consider whether granting the continuance poses a threat to public health or safety in light of the severity of the violations alleged.



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(6) The decision of the City Manager shall be final, with no further administrative right of appeal or reconsideration. The City Manager may sustain a suspension or revocation, overrule a suspension or revocation, reduce a revocation to a suspension and/or reduce the length of a suspension. Further, the City Manager may stay the effective date of any suspension for a reasonable time following a hearing.

(f) Reapplication. No reapplication will be accepted within one year after a certificate is revoked.

(g) Evidence. The following rules shall apply to any hearing required by this section. All parties involved shall have the right to offer testimonial, documentary, and tangible evidence bearing on the issues, to be represented by counsel, and to confront and cross-examine witnesses. Any relevant evidence may be admitted if it is the sort of evidence upon which reasonable persons are accustomed to rely in the conduct of serious affairs. Formal rules of evidence and discovery do not apply to proceedings governed by this chapter. Unless otherwise specifically prohibited by law, the burden of proof is on the registrant in any hearing or other matter under this chapter.

Sec. 19-134. PUBLIC NUISANCE.

It shall be unlawful and a public nuisance for a massage business to be operated, conducted, or maintained contrary to the provisions of this chapter. The City may exercise its discretion, in addition to or in lieu of prosecuting a criminal action, to commence proceedings for the abatement, removal, and enjoinder of that business in any manner provided by law.

Secs. 19-135 to 19-138. Reserved for future legislation.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days from and after its final passage and adoption, provided it is published in a newspaper of general circulation at least fifteen (15) days prior to its effective date.

4. Direct the Publication of the Notice of Public Hearing, once, at least seven (7) days prior to the Public Hearing.

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**I. BACKGROUND:**

In 2007, the City established the City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (Public Safety Services) (CFD No. 2007-1), for the purpose of establishing a special tax, paid by new residential property owners, to help off-set the additional costs of providing Public Safety Services to new residents.

**II. DISCUSSION:**

The proposed CFD No. 2007-1 Annexations will provide funding for public safety services including, fire services, law enforcement, code enforcement and animal control. Funding will also include the costs of personnel, equipment replacement, maintenance, and professional contract services and services related thereto, including collection and accumulation of funds to pay for anticipated operating cost shortfalls and reserves for repair and replacement of facilities, improvements, vehicles and equipment. The property owners have voted to approve the annexation.

**III. FISCAL IMPACT:**

The maximum annual special tax rates for fiscal year 2019/20 are as follows;

Single Family Residential – \$563.14 per unit

Multi-Family Residential – \$375.42 per unit



**IV. RECOMMENDATION:**

That the City Council adopt the Resolutions to Annex Territory to the City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (Public Safety Services), Annexation No. 12 (Loma Lane), set Public Hearing for September 16, 2019 and Direct the City Clerk to record the Annexation No. 12 Map within fifteen (15) days of the date of adoption of this Resolution.

**THE CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE THAT:**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council (the “Council”) has conducted proceedings for and has established the City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (Public Safety Services (the “District”) pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended (the “Act”), constituting Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5, commencing with Section 53311, of the California Government Code; and

**WHEREAS**, Under the Act, the Council, as the legislative body for the District, is empowered with the authority to annex territory to the District and to authorize the levy of special taxes therein, now desires to undertake proceedings to annex territory to the District and to authorize the levy of special taxes therein.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1. Findings.** The Council finds that:

(a) The foregoing recitals are true and correct; and

(b) **Annexation and Levy of Special Taxes:** The Council hereby finds and determines that public convenience and necessity require that territory be added to the District and the levy of special taxes authorized therein; and

(c) **Name of Existing District:** The name of the existing District is “City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (Public Safety Services)”; and

(d) **Territory:** The territory included in the existing District is as shown (i) on the map thereof filed in Book 4 of Maps of Assessment and Community Facilities Districts at Page 80, in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Stanislaus (the “County Recorder”); (ii) on the map depicting the area added to the District pursuant to Annexation No. 1 to the District, which map was filed in Book 4 of Maps of Assessment and Community Facilities Districts at Page 85, in the office of the County Recorder; (iii) on the map depicting the area added to the District pursuant to Annexation No. 2 to the District, which map was filed in Book 5 of Maps of Assessment and Community Facilities Districts at Page 12, in the office of the County Recorder; (iv) on the map depicting the area added to the District pursuant to Annexation No. 3 to the District, which map was filed in Book 5 of Maps of Assessment and Community Facilities Districts at Page 19, in the office of the County Recorder;

The territory now proposed to be annexed to the District is shown on the Annexation Map No. 12 of the District on file with the City Clerk, the boundaries of which territory are hereby preliminary approved and to which map reference is hereby made for further particulars. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause to be recorded said Annexation Map No. 12 of the District in the office of the City Clerk, at minimum, fifteen (15) days prior to the Public Hearing of said Annexation; and

(e) **Special Tax:** Except to the extent that funds are otherwise available to the District to pay for the Services, a special tax sufficient to pay the costs thereof, secured by recordation of a continuing lien against all non-exempt property in the District (including the property being annexed thereto), will be levied annually within the District and collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes, or in such other manner as the Council shall determine, including direct billing of the effected property owners. The proposed rate and method of apportionment of the special tax among the parcels of real property within the District, as now in existence and following the annexation proposed herein, in sufficient detail to allow each landowner within the territory proposed to be annexed to the District to estimate the maximum amount such owner will have to pay, are described in Exhibit A to the Resolution of Intention; and

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(f) **Public Hearing:** Monday, September 16, 2019 at 7:00 o'clock p.m., in the regular meeting place of the Council, City Council Chambers, 277 North Second Avenue, Oakdale, California, and the same are hereby appointed and fixed as the time and place when and where the Council, as legislative body for the District, will conduct a public hearing on the annexation of territory to the District where all interested persons for or against the annexation of territory or the levying of special taxes within the territory proposed to be annexed will be heard and will consider and finally determine whether the public interest, convenience and necessity require said annexation of territory to the District and the levy of said special tax therein; and

(g) **Notice of Hearing:** The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause notice of said public hearing to be given by publication one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the District. The publication of said notice shall be completed at least seven (7) days before the date herein set for said hearing. The notice shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B to the Resolution of Intention.

**Section 2. Intention.** The Council declares that it intends to annex territory to the CFD and levy said special tax therein.

**Section 3. Public Hearing.** The Council sets the Public Hearing for the 16<sup>th</sup> day of September 2019.

**RATE AND METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT**

A Special Tax applicable to each Assessor Parcel in the City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (Public Safety Services) shall be levied and collected according to the tax liability determined by the City of Oakdale or its designee, through the application of this rate and method of apportionment of Special Tax. All of the property in the CFD, unless exempted by law or by the provisions hereof, shall be taxed for the purposes, to the extent, and in the manner herein provided, including property subsequently annexed to the CFD unless otherwise provided for the annexed property.

**SECTION A  
DEFINITIONS**

The terms hereinafter set forth have the following meanings:

**“Acre” or “Acreage”** means the land area of an Assessor Parcel as shown on an Assessor Parcel map, or of the land area is not shown on an Assessor Parcel map, the land area shown on the applicable Final Map or other parcel map recorded with the County.

**“Act”** means the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, being Chapter 2.5, (commencing with Section 53311), Division 2 of the Title 5 of the California Government Code.

**“Administrative Expenses”** means any or all of the following, the expenses of the City in carrying out its duties for the CFD, including, but not limited to, the levy and collection of the Special Tax, the fees and expenses of its counsel, and other costs and expenses of the City in any way related to the establishment or administration of the CFD.

**“Administrator”** shall mean the person or firm designated by the City to administer the Special Tax according to the Rate and Method.

**“Assessor Parcel”** means a lot or parcel with an assigned County Assessor's Parcel number show on a County Assessor's Parcel Map.

**“Assessor's Parcel Map”** means an official map of the Assessor of the County designating parcels by Assessor's Parcel number.

**“Average Increase”** means the annual average increase in the Indices that shall be applied to escalate the Maximum Special Tax each Fiscal Year. The Average Increase shall be calculated in January of each year by (1) referencing the Bureau of Labor Statistics Data to identify the annual percentage increase in each Index as of the end of the prior year, and (2) taking the average of these two percentages. If either Index decreases from one year to the next, percentage change from the prior year shall be assumed to be zero for purposes of calculating the Average Increase.

**“CFD”** means the City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (Public Safety Services).

**“CFD Formation”** means May 7, 2007, the date the owners of Assessor Parcels in the CFD elected to form the CFD.

**“City”** means the City of Oakdale.

**“City Council”** means the council of the City of Oakdale, acting as the legislative body of the CFD.

**“County”** means the County of Stanislaus.

**“Developed Property”** means all Taxable Property in the CFD for which a building permit for new construction was issued by the City prior to June 1 of the preceding Fiscal Year.

**“Fiscal Year”** means the period starting July 1 and ending on the following June 30.

**“Index or Indices”** means the Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco All Urban Wage Earners Category and the National Consumer Price Index.

**“Maximum Special Tax”** means the greatest amount of Special Tax that can be levied in any Fiscal Year determined under this Rate and Method.

**“Multi-Family Residential Property”** means any Developed Property for which a building permit was issued for construction of a Unit that is not a Single Family Residential Property.

**“Proportionately”** means, for Developed Property, that the ratio of the actual Special Tax levied in any Fiscal Year to the Maximum Special Tax authorized to be levied in that Fiscal Year is equal for all Assessor Parcels of Developed Property.

**“Public Property”** means any CFD Assessor Parcels owned by or irrevocably offered for dedication to the United States of America, the State of California, the County, the City, or other local government or public agencies.

**“Rate and Method”** means this rate and method of apportionment of Special Tax.

**“Services”** means the public safety services authorized to be financed, in whole or in part, by the Special Taxes in the CFD.

**“Single Family Residential Property”** means any Developed Property for which a building permit was issued for construction of a Unit without a common wall with another Unit and built on an Assessor Parcel of 3,000 square feet or more in area.

**“Special Tax”** means any tax levied in the CFD pursuant to the Rate and Method.

**“Special Tax Requirement”** means the amount necessary in any Fiscal Year to: (i) pay the cost of the Services, (ii) create a sinking fund for services that could not otherwise be funded in a given Fiscal Year, (iii) cure any delinquencies in the payment of Special Taxes, which have occurred in the prior Fiscal Year or, based on existing delinquencies in the payment of Special Taxes, are expected to occur in the Fiscal Year in which the tax will be collected; and (iv) pay Administrative Expenses.

**“Taxable Property”** means any Assessor Parcel within the CFD which is not exempt from the Special Tax by applicable law or Section F below.

**“Unit”** means a structure constructed primarily for human habitation, which may be an individual detached residential unit, an individual attached residential unit within a duplex, triplex, fourplex, townhome, or condominium structure, or an individual apartment unit.

## **SECTION B DATA FOR ANNUAL ADMINISTRATION**

On or about July 1 of each Fiscal Year, the Administrator shall identify the current Assessor Parcel numbers of all Taxable Property. The Administrator shall also determine: (i) whether each Assessor Parcel is Developed Property; (ii) for Developed Property, which Assessor Parcels are Single Family Residential Property and Multi-Family Residential Property and (iii) the Special Tax Requirement.

**SECTION C  
MAXIMUM SPECIAL TAX**

**1. Special Tax Rates**

Table 1 below identifies the Maximum Special Taxes for Taxable Property within the CFD.

**2. Special Tax Increases**

In January 2008, and each January thereafter, all figures shown in Table 1 above shall be adjusted by applying the Average Increase, if any, in the Indices. Each annual adjustment of the Maximum Special Tax shall become effective on the subsequent July 1.

**SECTION D  
METHOD OF LEVY**

Each Fiscal Year, the Special Tax shall be levied on all Parcels of Developed Property according to the steps outlined below.

- Step 1:** Determine the Special Tax Requirement, as defined in Section A above, for the Fiscal Year in which the Special Tax will be collected;
- Step 2:** Calculate the total Special Tax revenues that could be collected from Developed Property within the CFD based on application of the Maximum Special Tax rates determined pursuant to Section C above;
- Step 3:** If the amount determined in Step 1 is greater than or equal to the amount calculated in Step 2, levy the Maximum Special Tax on all Parcels of Developed Property in the CFD.
- Step 4:** If the amount determined in Step 1 is less than the amount calculated in Step 2, levy the Special Tax Proportionately on each Assessor Parcel of Developed Property so the amount of the Special Tax levy equals the Special Tax Requirement for that Fiscal Year.

**SECTION E  
COLLECTION**

The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner and at the same time as ordinary *ad valorem* property taxes, provided, however, that the CFD may collect the Special Tax at a different time or in a different manner if necessary to meet its financial obligations, and may collect delinquent Special Taxes through foreclosure or other means.

A Special Tax shall continue to be levied and collected within the CFD to fund the annual Special Tax Requirement in perpetuity.



## **SECTION F EXEMPTIONS**

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Rate and Method, no Special Tax shall be levied on Public Property, except as otherwise provided in the Act.

## **SECTION G FORMULA FOR THE PREPAYMENT OF THE SPECIAL TAX**

The Special Tax may not be prepaid.

## **SECTION H INTERPRETATION**

The Administrator may interpret this Rate and Method as necessary to clarify any inconsistency, vagueness, or ambiguity.

## **SECTION I APPEALS**

Appeals of any claim of incorrect computation of Special Tax or application of this Rate and Method may be made by the owner of an Assessor Parcel or such owner's duly-authorized representative by filing a written notice of appeal with the Administrator not later than on calendar year after having paid the disputed Special Tax. The Administrator shall promptly review the appeal and if necessary, meet with the property owner (or representative), consider written and oral evidence regarding the amount of the Special Tax, and decide the appeal. If the property owner disagrees with the Administrator's decision, the owner may then file a written appeal with the Council, whose decision shall be final. If the decision of the Administrator or the Council requires the Special Tax to be modified or changed in favor of the property owner, no cash refund shall be made for prior years' Special Tax levies, but an adjustment shall be made to the next Special Tax levy(ies) as appropriate. This procedure shall be exclusive and its exhaustion by any property owner shall be a condition precedent to filing any legal action by such owner.

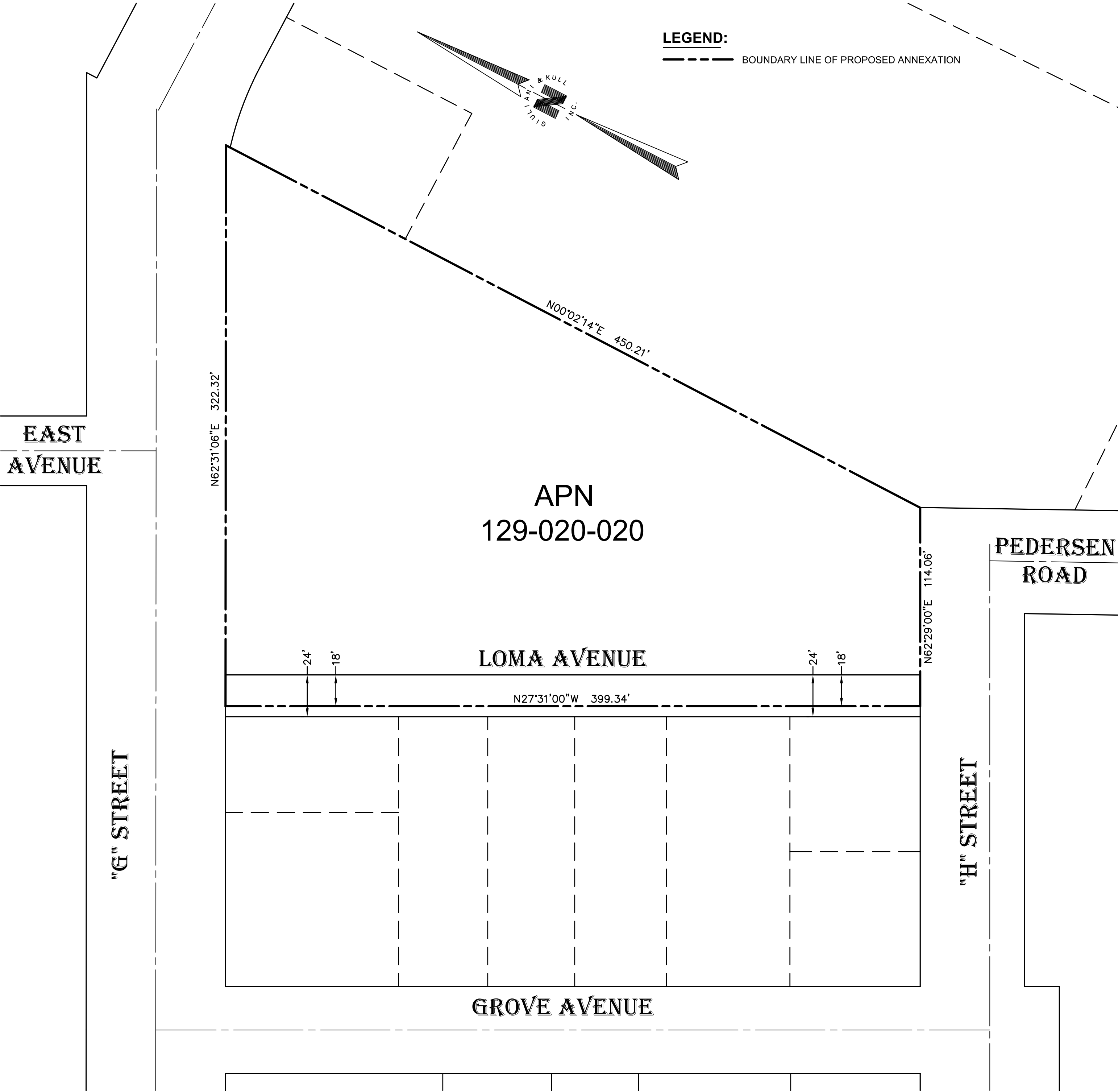
**BOUNDARY MAP

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**I. BACKGROUND:**

In August 2015, the City established the City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2015-01 (Maintenance Services) (CFD No. 2015-01), for the purpose of establishing a special tax, paid by new residential property owners, to help off-set the additional costs of providing services related to the maintenance of streets, street lights, drainage facilities, the treatment of storm water run-off, and landscaping to new residents.

**II. DISCUSSION:**

The proposed CFD No. 2015-01 Annexation of 17 residential parcels will provide funding for the services mentioned above. Funding will also include the costs of personnel, equipment replacement, maintenance, and professional contract services and services related thereto, including collection and accumulation of funds to pay for anticipated operating cost shortfalls and reserves for repair and replacement of facilities, improvements, vehicles and equipment. The property owner of this annexation has voted to approve the annexation.

**III. FISCAL IMPACT:**

The maximum annual special tax rates for fiscal year 2019/20 are as follows;

Single Family Residential – \$590.57 per unit (\$49.21 per month)

**"County"** means Stanislaus County.

**"Developed Property"** means, in any fiscal year, all parcels of Taxable Property in the CFD for which a building permit for new construction was issued by June 30 of the preceding fiscal year.

**"Fiscal Year"** means the period starting July 1 and ending on the following June 30.

**"Maximum Special Tax"** means the maximum Special Tax determined in accordance with Section D below that can be levied on Taxable Property in any fiscal year.

**"Multi-Family Residential Property"** means any parcel of Developed Property for which a building permit was issued for construction of a residential structure with units that are offered for rent to the general public.

**“Rate and Method”** means the rate and method of apportionment of Special Tax as described herein.

**“Services”** means the services authorized to be financed, in whole or in part, by the Special Taxes levied in the CFD. Please see “Description of Services” below.

**“Single Family Residential Property”** means any Developed Property for which a building permit was issued for construction of a Unit without a common wall with another Unit.

**“Special Tax”** means any tax levied in the CFD pursuant to the Rate and Method.

**“Special Tax Requirement”** means the amount of revenue needed in any fiscal year to pay for the following: (i) Authorized Services, maintenance services and capital reserves authorized to be funded by the CFD, (ii) Administrative Expenses, (iii) amount needed to cure any delinquencies in the payment of Special Taxes, which have occurred in the prior fiscal year or, based on existing delinquencies in the payment of Special Taxes, are expected to occur in the fiscal year in which the tax will be collected.

**“Taxable Property”** means any Assessor Parcel within the CFD which is not exempt from the Special Tax pursuant to applicable law or Section F below.

**“Undeveloped Property”** means, in any fiscal year, all parcels of Taxable Property in the CFD for which a building permit for new construction was not issued by June 1 of the preceding fiscal year.

**“Unit”** means an individual single-family detached unit, or an individual attached residential unit within a duplex, triplex, four-plex, townhome, condominium, or apartment structure.

**SECTION B – DATA COLLECTION FOR ANNUAL TAX LEVY**

On or about July 1 of each fiscal year, the Administrator shall identify the current Assessor Parcel numbers of all Taxable Property. The Administrator shall also determine: (i) whether each Assessor Parcel is Developed Property; (ii) for Developed Property, which Assessor Parcels are Single Family Residential Property, Multi-Family Residential Property, Condominium Property or Non-Residential Property, and (iii) the Special Tax Requirement.

**SECTION C – MAXIMUM SPECIAL TAX**

1. Special Tax Rates

Table 1 below identifies the Base Year Special Tax rates for all Taxable Property within the CFD.

2. Special Tax Increases

The Maximum Special Tax established in the Base Year for each property type shall be adjusted annually by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers ("CPI"), for the month of February, for the San Francisco/Oakland/San Jose area.

**SECTION D – METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT OF SPECIAL TAX LEVY**

Each fiscal year, the Special Tax shall be levied on all parcels of Developed Property as shown in the table above.

**SECTION E – COLLECTION**

The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner and at the same time as ordinary ad valorem property taxes, provided, however, that the CFD may collect the Special Tax at a different time or in a different manner if necessary to meet its financial obligations, specifically through a direct billing.

A Special Tax shall continue to be levied and collected within the CFD to fund the annual Special Tax Requirement in perpetuity.

**SECTION F – EXEMPTIONS**

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Rate and Method, no Special Tax shall be levied on Public Property, except as otherwise provided in the Act.

**SECTION G – FORMULA FOR THE PREPAYMENT OF THE SPECIAL TAX:**

The Special Tax may not be prepaid.

**SECTION H – INTERPRETATION**

The Administrator may interpret this Rate and Method as necessary to clarify any inconsistency, vagueness, or ambiguity.

**SECTION I – APPEALS**

Appeals of any claim of incorrect computation of Special Tax or application of this Rate and Method may be made by the owner of an Assessor Parcel or such owner's duly-authorized representative by filing a written notice of appeal with the Administrator not later than on calendar year after having paid the disputed Special Tax. The Administrator shall promptly review the appeal and if necessary, meet with the property owner (or representative), consider written and oral evidence regarding the amount of the Special Tax, and decide the appeal. If the property owner disagrees with the Administrator's decision, the owner may then file a written appeal with the Council, whose decision shall be final. If the decision of the Administrator or the Council requires the Special Tax to be modified or changed in favor of the property owner, no cash refund shall be made for prior years' Special Tax levies, but an adjustment shall be made to the next Special Tax levy as appropriate. This procedure shall be exclusive and its exhaustion by any property owner shall be a condition precedent to filing any legal action by such owner.

**DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES**

The City of Oakdale Community Facilities District No. 2015-01 (Maintenance Services) will levy an Annual Special Tax within the area for the purposes of providing funding for public services including, streets, street lights, storm drain facilities, treatment of storm water run-off and landscape maintenance. Funding will also include the costs of personnel, equipment replacement, maintenance, and professional contract services and services related thereto, including collection and accumulation of funds to pay for anticipated operating cost shortfalls and reserves for repair and replacement of improvements and equipment.

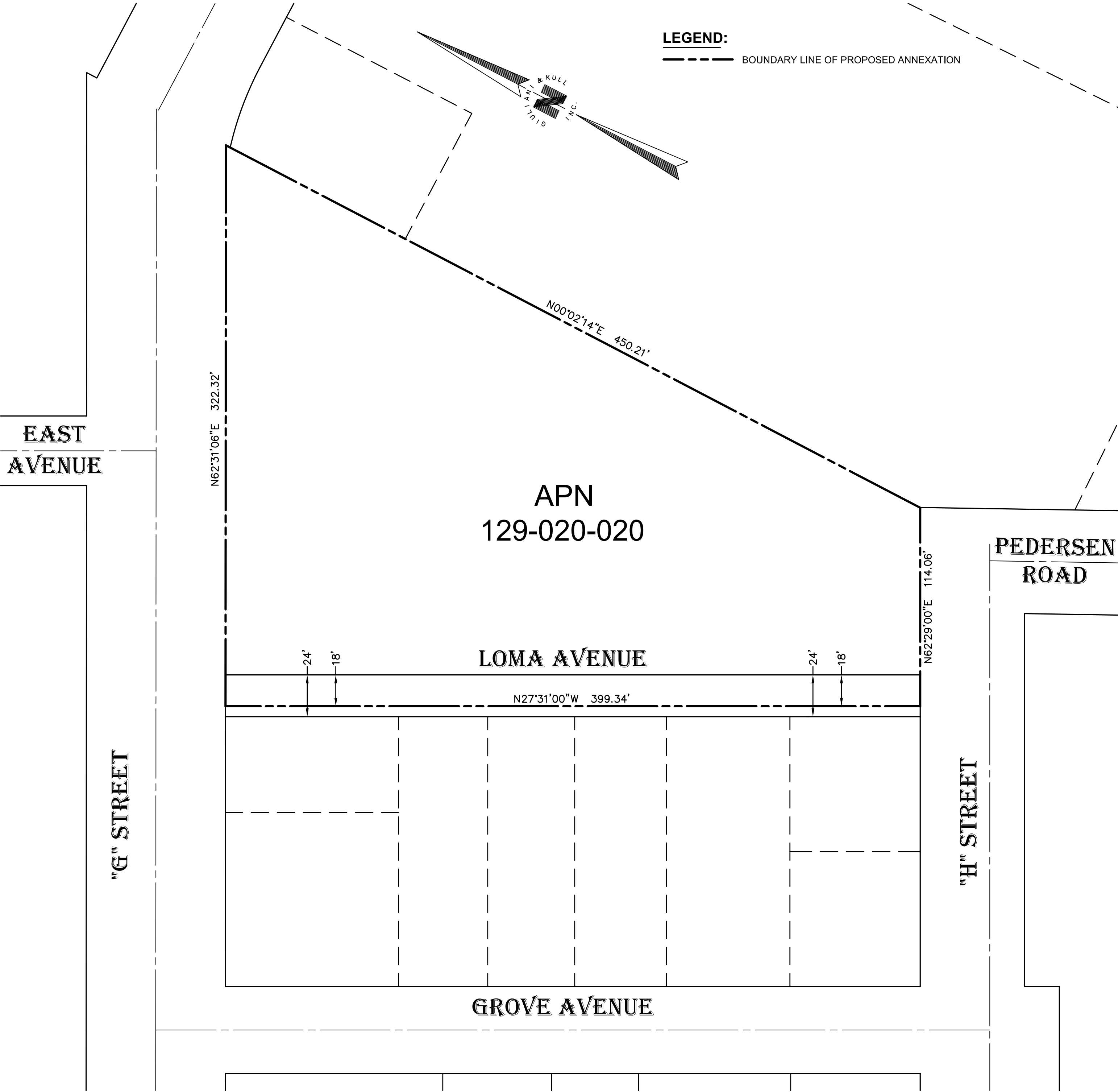
**BOUNDARY MAP
