



9.1 Discuss current Fire Services Agreement with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District and options available to the City of Oakdale.

Recommended Action: Discuss current Fire Services Agreement with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District and take formal action to either extend the Fire Services Agreement or pursue other options.

City Manager Whitemyer provided a staff report and PowerPoint Presentation to the City Council giving a brief history of the current fire services contract and the series of events which led up to tonight's recommendation. He explained that we have pursued many different avenues with the goal of providing the highest level of fire and emergency services to our residents and that we felt the best way to do that was through partnerships.

He explained that the 2+2+2 Committee had met several times and what came out of those meetings was a recommendation that the City of Oakdale and the Oakdale Fire Protection District extend the initial fire services agreement with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District for an additional year. This was taken back to the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District Board for consideration and action

CM Whitemyer discussed the proposed changes to the agreement and presented the City Council with the option of either continuing contract talks with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District or choose to pursue other options. The recommendation from staff to the City Council was for the City to inform Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District that the City of Oakdale will no longer pursue a contract extension and for the Council to direct staff to finalize other fire service options for the City.

The City Council asked questions of staff which were responded to by staff.

Mayor McCarty asked for public comment.

Vincent Victorine, Board Member from Oakdale Fire Protection District, addressed the City Council with questions he had regarding the additional new language in the draft agreement about unfunded payroll liabilities, including vacation and sick leave liability accrued and discussed issues regarding the unexpected 5-year extension.

Chief Whorton discussed MCST system and dropdown boundaries and questioned the level of service the City would have if they choose to pursue other options and contract with another agency. He made a point to clarify that Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District will always be there to serve mutual aid when needed.

Derek Nichols, Union President of Local 3399, addressed the City Council about his concerns with the City Council keeping their word with making sure Consolidated Firefighters would receive precedence when, and if, the city hires back firefighter positions for the City of Oakdale Fire Department. He asked that they please consider addressing their issues and counter the Consolidated District Board's offer before tomorrow's SCFPD meeting.



Council Member Bairos asked to have it go on record that that the firefighters who are in the position of being laid off will get priority hiring if coming over to Oakdale.






SECTOR ALLOCATION



EXCESSIVE QUANTITIES OF DIRT OR DEBRIS HAVE ENTERED THE NEW MAIN, BACTERIOLOGICAL SAMPLES SHALL BE TAKEN AT INTERVALS OF APPROXIMATELY 200 FEET AND SHALL BE IDENTIFIED BY LOCATION. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL ADDITIONAL WATER SERVICE TAPS AND SAMPLING STATIONS AS REQUIRED. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL ALSO REMOVE SAMPLING STATIONS AND SERVICES UPON SATISFACTORY COMPLETION OF TESTING. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PAY FOR TESTING OF THE CONTAMINATED AREAS. CONTRACT PRICE SHALL INCLUDE FULL COMPENSATION FOR FURNISHING ALL LABOR, MATERIALS, TOOLS, EQUIPMENT, AND INCIDENTALS, AND FOR DOING ALL OF THE WORK INVOLVED IN TESTING AND DISINFECTION OF THE WATER MAINS.

Cooperation Agreement with Stanislaus County for Participation in the Urban County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement and HOME Investment

Partnerships Program for Fiscal Years 2020-2023

I. BACKGROUND

Stanislaus County was designated a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) "Entitlement" Jurisdiction in 2001. This designation allows Stanislaus County access to CDBG funds from the Federal Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD) without participating in the competitive application process. The participating entities in this Stanislaus County CDBG Consortium consist of the unincorporated County and the cities of Ceres, Hughson, Newman, Patterson, Waterford and Oakdale.

II. DISCUSSION

Every three years, current participants as well as non-participating cities within Stanislaus County have an opportunity to enter into an agreement to become part of the Stanislaus County CDBG Consortium to be eligible to receive entitlement funding from HUD for affordable housing, associated infrastructure and community development activities. Because the City of Oakdale is continuing its participation in the entitlement program, HUD is requiring that we enter into a Three-Year Cooperation Agreement with Stanislaus County which will remain in effect until June 30, 2023.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no impact to the City General Fund as all program delivery and administrative costs will be funded through the CDBG program allocation.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The City Council adopt the attached resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a Three-Year Cooperation Agreement with Stanislaus County for participation in the Urban County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement and HOME Investment Partnerships Program for Federal Fiscal Years 2020-2023.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A THREE-YEAR COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH STANISLAUS COUNTY FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE URBAN COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) ENTITLEMENT AND HOME **INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM FOR FEDERAL FISCAL YEARS 2020-2023**

THE CITY OF OAKDALE CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE THAT:

WHEREAS, Stanislaus County has been an Urban County by the Federal Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD) and thereby qualifies as an "Entitlement" Jurisdiction pursuant to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) which includes the unincorporated areas in Stanislaus County and the cities of Ceres, Hughson, Newman, Patterson, Waterford and Oakdale; and,

WHEREAS, the designation allows Stanislaus County access to CDBG funds from the Federal Housing and Urban Development Department (HUD) without participating in the competitive application process; and

WHEREAS, every three years, current participants in the CDBG Entitlement Program must enter into an Three-Year Cooperation Agreement with Stanislaus County to continue its participation in the Urban County CDBG Entitlement and HOME Investment Partnerships program; and,

WHEREAS, City of Oakdale has elected to participate in the entitlement process for Fiscal Years 2017-2019; thereby, receiving a portion of the CDBG and HOME funds allocated to Stanislaus County and participating jurisdictions; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Oakdale wishes to enter into a Three-Year Cooperation Agreement with the County of Stanislaus to jointly carry out affordable housing, associated infrastructure and community development activities with CDBG and HOME funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the CITY COUNCIL hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute a Three-Year Cooperation Agreement with Stanislaus County for participation in the Urban County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Entitlement and HOME Investment Partnerships Program for Federal Fiscal Years 2020-2023.

COOPERATION AGREEMENT

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City is a duly constituted municipal corporation under the laws of the State of California, and is empowered thereby to undertake essential community development and housing assistance activities, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing; and

WHEREAS, the County is a duly constituted subdivision of the State of California, and is also empowered by State law to undertake essential community development and housing assistance activities, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 6502 authorizes two or more public agencies to jointly exercise any power common to both; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and participating cities, including the City, form the Stanislaus Urban County ("Urban County") for purposes of receiving entitlement funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD"); and

WHEREAS, it is mutually desired by the parties hereto to enter into a Cooperation Agreement, in accord with the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 ("HCDA"), as amended, and applicable Federal rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto; whereby the parties shall jointly undertake community development and housing assistance activities, including the Community Development Block Grant Entitlement ("CDBG"), Emergency Solutions Grants ("ESG"), and the HOME Investment Partnerships ("HOME") Programs funded by HUD.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED as follows:

1. The parties hereto agree to cooperate to undertake, or assist in undertaking, community renewal and lower income housing assistance activities, specifically urban renewal and publicly assisted housing, pursuant to the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 ("HCDA"), as amended, and the HOME Investment Partnerships Act, as amended. This agreement shall become effective October 1, 2020, and be in effect until terminated, but termination may not occur before September 30, 2023. This agreement shall remain in effect until the CDBG, ESG, and HOME funds received during the Urban County's 20-21- (July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021), 21-22 (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022), and 22-23 (July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023) program years, and any related

program income received by the City, are expended and any funded activities are completed.

- 2. The County and City, along with all Urban County participants, agree to form the following committee and panel to coordinate and review Urban County information:
 - a. Technical Committee: consisting of one (1) representative from the County and one (1) representative from each Urban County participating city. The purpose of the committee is to review proposed funding and existing funding for HUD projects, and any other documentation required by HUD for the implementation and administration of the CDBG, ESG, and HOME Programs. Documentation shall include, but not limited to, a list of specific projects to be undertaken and priorities for implementation for the housing and community development projects. The committee will facilitate distribution of information to residents of the Urban County concerning community development and housing needs; and shall provide residents with an opportunity to participate in the development of programs and priorities.
 - b. Grant Review Panel: consisting of one (1) representative from the County and one (1) representative from each Urban County participating city and one (1) representative from the local Continuum of Care (CoC). The committee will meet a minimum of 2 times a year to review grant applications and proposals in response to a County released Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA). Grant Review Panel duties shall include reviewing and scoring of applications, and attendance during all grant applicant presentations.
- a. After deduction of administrative expenses, which shall not exceed 20%, all of the net CDBG monies shall be sub-allocated to the participating jurisdictions according to the general distribution formula established by HUD which is based on the latest available countywide data on population, the extent of poverty, and the extent of housing overcrowding. However, a different distribution is hereby expressly authorized if and when necessary to comply with Title I of the HCDA. If any project submitted by an Urban County member has CDBG documentation that is found to be ineligible by HUD, the proposed project shall not be funded. In such an event, the County, acting in concert with the Technical Committee may submit an alternative priority project which is within the original cost and in line with the stated needs and objectives of County, provided such a re-submission conforms with the rules and regulations of the HCDA.
 - a. 4. a. City may terminate its participation in this Cooperation Agreement by a single majority vote of its governing body. Such termination shall take effect only at the end of the federal three-year Urban County qualification period in

which the action is taken. City may participate in a HOME Program only through the Urban County; and that it may not participate in a HOME consortium with other local governments except through the Urban County, regardless of whether the Urban County receives a HOME formula allocation.

The next such qualification period will end September 30, 2023. However, City may void this Cooperation Agreement by written notice received by the Director of the Stanislaus County Planning and Community Development Department, 1010 10^{th} Street, Suite 3400, Modesto, California 95354, prior to September 30, 2023, if City is advised by HUD that City is eligible to be designated as a metropolitan city entitled to CDBG formula funding and City elects to accept designation as a metropolitan city. If this Cooperation Agreement is not voided by City prior to September 10, 2019 (or later date if approved in writing by HUD) under the circumstances listed in the previous sentence, City must remain a part of the urban county for the entire three-year urban county qualification period.

- 5. Under this Agreement, the County shall be the primary general-purpose local governmental unit pursuant to the HCDA. The County shall apply for grants, administer all funds received, and undertake or assist in undertaking essential community development and housing assistance activities. Based on recommendations made by the Technical Committee, the County shall have the authority to carry out activities which will be funded from annual CDBG, and ESG, funds covered by this Agreement. Records shall be kept by County in accordance with approved accounting procedures, and said records shall be available for public inspection at all times.
- 6. County and City, along with all Urban County participants, shall take all actions necessary to assure compliance with the Urban County's certification required by Section 104 (b) of Title I of the HCDA, including the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, Executive Order 11988, the Fair Housing Act, Section 109 of Title I of the HCD, as amended. Use of Urban County funds for activities, in or in support of, any participating city that does not affirmatively further fair housing within its own jurisdiction or that impedes the County's actions to comply with the County's fair housing certification shall be prohibited. Pursuant to 24 CFR 570.501(b), City is subject to the same requirements applicable to sub-recipients, including the requirement of a written agreement described in 24 CFR 570.503. County and City shall comply with all other applicable laws.
- 7. City shall report to County any program income generated by the expenditure of CDBG funds. Such program income may be retained by City to be used for CDBG eligible activities. County has the responsibility for monitoring and reporting to HUD on the use of program income, thereby requiring appropriate record keeping and reporting by City as may be needed for this purpose. In the case of HOME Investment Partnerships Program funds, the City shall report program income to

the entity responsible for HOME fund administration and it shall be the responsibility of that entity to report to HUD on the use of program income.

- 8. City shall not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer all or any portion of such funds to another city, urban county, unit of general local government, or Indian tribe, or insular area that directly or indirectly received CDBG funds in exchange for any other funds, credits or non-Federal considerations, but must use such funds for activities eligible under title I of the HCDA.
- 9. The following standards shall apply to real property acquired or improved in whole or in part using CDBG funds that is within the control of a participating City:
 - a. City shall give County timely notification of any modification or change in the use of the real property from that planned at the time of acquisition or improvement including disposition.
 - b. City shall reimburse the allocation account in an amount equal to the current fair market value (less any portion thereof attributable to expenditures of funds other than CDBG) of property acquired or improved with CDBG funds that is sold or transferred for a use that does not qualify under the CDBG regulations.
 - c. City shall pay to County any program income generated from the disposition or transfer of property prior to or subsequent to the close-out, change of status or termination of the cooperation agreement between County and City. Any program income shall be allocated by County for eligible activities in accordance with all CDBG requirements as may then apply.
- 10. The parties hereto agree that the responsible entity with the final responsibility for analyzing needs, setting objectives, developing plans, selecting projects for community development and housing assistance, selecting CDBG Public Service and ESG programs to be funded, and filing the Consolidated Plan, and other plans and reports required by the HCDA, is the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors.
- 11. By executing this Agreement, City understands the following:
 - b. City may not apply for grants under the Small Cities or State CDBG or ESG Programs funded during the period in which it participates in the Urban County;
 - c. City may only receive ESG funding by a formula allocation as part of a participating member of the Urban County unless otherwise authorized by HCD or HUD.
 - d. This agreement remains in effect until CDBG, ESG, HOME funds, along with any program income received with respect to activities carried out during the

three-year qualification period, are expended and the funded activities completed. The County and the City cannot terminate or withdraw from the cooperation agreement while it remains in effect.

- 12. The cooperating unit of general local government has adopted and is enforcing:
 - a. A policy prohibiting the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and
 - b. A policy of enforcing applicable State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location which is the subject of such non-violent civil rights demonstrations within its jurisdiction. The phrase "cooperating unit of general local government" has the same meaning in this Cooperation Agreement as it does in HUD Notice #CPD 19-04.
- 13. Each Party mutually agrees, pursuant to Government Code §894.5, to a. indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the other Party, its County Board of Supervisors, City Councils, boards and commissions, officers, agents, employees, and volunteers (collectively, the "indemnified Parties") in an amount equal to its proportionate share of liability on a comparative fault basis. This indemnity obligation shall exist with respect to any claim, loss, liability, damage, lawsuit, cost or expense that arises out of, or is any way related to, the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. This indemnity obligation extends, without limitation, to any injury, death, loss, or damage which occurs in the performance of the Agreement and that is sustained by a third party, agent, or contractor of a Party. Each Party executing this Agreement certifies that it has adequate self-insured retention of funds to meet any obligation arising from this Agreement, and it shall continue to maintain such funds throughout the Term of this Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein shall be Agreement. construed to require any Party to indemnify any other Party from any Claim arising from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of another Party. Nothing in this section shall be construed as authorizing an award of attorney fees in any action on or to enforce the terms of this Agreement. This indemnity shall apply to all Claims and liability regardless of whether any insurance policies are applicable. Any policy limits shall not act as a limitation upon the amount of indemnification to be provided.
 - b. At its sole discretion, the indemnified Party may participate at its own expense in the defense of any claim, action or proceeding, but such participation shall not relieve the indemnitor of any obligation imposed by this Agreement. The Parties shall notify each other promptly of any claim, action or proceeding and cooperate fully in the defense. The Parties agree to defend themselves from any claim, action or proceeding arising out of the

concurrent acts or omissions of each Party. In such cases, the Parties agree to retain their own legal counsel, bear their own defense costs, and waive their right to seek reimbursement of such costs. Where a trial verdict or arbitration award allocates or determines the comparative fault of the parties, the Parties may seek reimbursement and/or reallocation of defense costs, settlement payments, judgments and awards, consistent with such comparative fault. The provisions of this section shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

Subject: Consideration of a resolution (1) Calling for an election on a ballot measure

proposing an amendment to Chapter 11 of the City of Oakdale Municipal Code to extend the term of the transactions and use tax implemented by Measure Y, previously Measure O, for an additional eleven (11) years; (2) Requesting the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County to consolidate a municipal election on a local measure with other elections to be held on the November 5, 2019 consolidated district election date; (3) Requesting the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors permit the County Elections Official to render election services to the

city; and (4) Approving the proposed ordinance.

I. BACKGROUND

In 2011 the City Council ("Council") for the City of Oakdale ("City") recognized that the City had been experiencing a structural deficit for several years. The City's fiscal problems resulted in a substantial reduction of staff including: (a) a reduction of sworn police officers by twenty-five percent (25%); (b) a reduction in firefighters by twenty-nine percent (29%); and (c) a reduction in department heads by twenty-five percent (25%). To respond to this crisis, the City appointed an ad hoc committee to analyze the possibility of imposing a local transactions and use tax to address the deficit. The ad hoc committee recommended that the City place a measure on the November 1, 2011 ballot to impose a one-half cent transaction and use tax for a three (3) year period. This measure, Measure O, was approved by 55.4% of the voters and adopted by ordinance with a sunset date of April 2015.

An ad-hoc committee appointed by the Council on February 18, 2014, found that the continuation of this revenue source was vital to the preservation of public safety services in the City and recommended that Measure O be extended for an additional five-year period. The City Council placed this question to the people on the November 2014 ballot and the ballot measure known as Measure Y extending the one-half cent transaction and use tax was approved by the 70.2% of the voters of Oakdale.

The taxes collected under Measure Y generate approximately one million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000) of revenue annually, or sixteen percent (16%) of the City's General Fund income.

Measure Y has allowed the City to refill six (6) police officer positions and three (3) firefighter positions. This has enabled the City to keep its residents safer by providing more proactive



police services and enhancing its ability to respond to fires and other public safety emergencies.

On March 18, 2019, the Council appointed an ad-hoc committee to explore the possibility of extending the one-half cent local sales tax measure (Measure Y) or other revenue generating options for the City. The following individuals served on that committee: Mary Guardiola, Jeff Steves, Mickey Peabody, Mike Eggener, Amy Velasco, Steve Medlin, Ed Viohl, and Pat Paul.

At the April 15, 2019 meeting, the ad-hoc committee reported to the Council that they had met as a group several times to discuss Measure Y and whether it should be extended. After reviewing financial documents and how Measure Y funds were expended in previous years the committee found that the Council had been very diligent in spending Measure Y for its intended purpose. The committee also indicated that City staff has been very transparent in how the money has been spent by meeting at least annually with the Measure Y Citizens Oversight Committee to review these expenditures. The citizen ad-hoc committee unanimously recommended that the Council place a measure on the November 5, 2019 ballot extending the one-half cent transaction and use tax for an additional 11-year period.

Measure Y Funds Have Been Spent as Intended

Measure Y Residents Oversight Committee:

Great care has been taken to ensure that funds collected from Measure Y are spent for their intended purpose. The Measure Y Residents Oversight Committee has met at least annually every year for the last eight years and has reviewed extensively the expenditure of Measure Y funds. Each year the City of Oakdale Measure Y Residents Oversight Committee has unanimously confirmed that all funds collected through the one-half cent sales tax (Measure Y) were expended appropriately. If Measure Y is extended this oversight committee will continue to meet to review the expenditure of Measure Y Funds.

II. DISCUSSION

California Revenue and Taxation Code requires voter approval to extend a transactions and use tax for general purposes.¹ The proposed resolution ("<u>Resolution</u>") would accomplish several necessary tasks to allow the City to submit a ballot measure to voters proposing to extend the life of the transactions and use tax established under Measure Y, previously Measure O, for an additional eleven (11) years ("Ballot Measure").

The Resolution calls for an election to consider the Ballot Measure and sets forth the exact language of the Ballot Measure. The Ballot Measure also includes the City Attorney's impartial analysis of the Ballot Measure, as required by the Stanislaus County Registrar of

Voters ("<u>ROV</u>"). The Revenue and Taxation Code requires that the Council approve the ordinance proposing the Sales Tax extension by a two-thirds (2/3) of all of the Councilmembers. The Resolution incorporates the full text of the ordinance and declares that the Council approves the ordinance and its submission to voters for consideration.

The Resolution also makes a formal request to the Board of Supervisors ("BOS") to consolidate the Ballot Measure election with other elections being held on the same election date and to direct the ROV to provide the City with election services.

If the Resolution is adopted, it must be mailed to both the ROV and the BOS for the County of Stanislaus (the "County") so that both receive the Resolution before July 3, 2019. The BOS will consider the request for consolidation and election services on July 20, 2019. Once the election occurs on November 5, 2019, the Council must hold a meeting to declare the results. If the Ballot Measure passes, it will become effective ten (10) days after Council's declaration of results. This will allow the City to extend the sunset date of Measure Y before it expires in April 2020.

If the Ballot Measure is successful, it would allow the City to continue to collect the one-half cent tax for sales within the City. Without this measure, the City's authority to collect the tax will expire in April 2020, resulting in a loss of approximately one million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$1,900,000) in annual revenue for the City.

Measure Y has enabled the City to improve the quality of life for its residents by adding back police officer and firefighter positions, keeping street lights on, providing services to senior citizens at the Oakdale Senior Center, and keeping streets and roadways swept. If Measure Y does expire, it is likely that the Council would be forced to impose reductions in City services.

To be placed on the November 2019 ballot, the ballot measure must receive a two-thirds majority vote of the Oakdale City Council.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

The Stanislaus County Clerk-Recorder's Office provided an estimate of \$6.00 to \$7.50 per voter as the City's election costs, regardless of the number of ballot measures up for consideration (Attachment B). It is anticipated that the total cost to place this on the ballot could range from \$69,300 to \$87,750.

If the Ballot Measure passes, these costs will be offset by the approximately one million nine hundred thousand dollars the City will be able to collect each year over the eleven (11) year extension of the Sales Tax.

Over the last several years the Council and staff have taken numerous steps to reduce expenditures and control costs. Staffing levels have been reduced significantly in all sectors of local government including public safety. The hardest hit sector has been in general

administration. Since 2007, the City has reduced by 45% the number of administrative staff from 54 positions to 30 positions currently.

Measure Y generates approximately \$1.9 million or 17% of all General Fund Revenues. This funding has allowed the City to prevent catastrophic budget cuts and maintain City services, including police and fire protection, senior programs, and other general services.

If an extension of Measure Y is not placed on the ballot or not approved by the voters, significant service reductions are expected. These service reductions could include, but are not limited to, police and fire services, senior center programs, and street lighting.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Adopt Resolution No. 2019-_____ (1) Calling for an election on a ballot measure proposing an amendment to Chapter 11 of the City of Oakdale Municipal Code to extend the term of the transactions and use tax implemented by Measure Y, previously Measure O, for an additional eleven (11) years; (2) Requesting the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County to Consolidate a municipal election on a local measure with other elections to be held on the November 5, 2019 Consolidated District Election date; (3) Requesting the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors permit the Stanislaus County Elections Official to render election services to the City; and (4) Approve the proposed draft ordinance.

(1) CALLING FOR AN ELECTION ON A BALLOT MEASURE PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 11 OF THE CITY'S MUNICIPAL CODE TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE TRANSACTIONS AND USE TAX IMPLEMENTED BY MEASURE Y, PREVIOUSLY MEASURE O, FOR AN ADDITIONAL ELEVEN YEARS; (2) REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF STANISLAUS COUNTY TO CONSOLIDATE A MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON A LOCAL MEASURE WITH OTHER ELECTIONS TO BE HELD ON THE NOVEMBER 5, 2019 CONSOLIDATED DISTRICT ELECTION DATE; (3) REQUESTING THE STANISLAUS COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS PERMIT THE COUNTY ELECTIONS OFFICIAL TO RENDER ELECTION SERVICES TO THE CITY; AND (4) APPROVING THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE

THE CITY OF OAKDALE CITY COUNCIL DOES HEREBY RESOLVE THAT:

WHEREAS, in 2011 the City Council for the City of Oakdale ("City"), relying on a recommendation from an ad hoc committee, determined that the city was experiencing a fiscal emergency; and

WHEREAS, in response to the fiscal emergency, the City Council (the "<u>Council</u>") passed Resolution No. 2011-65, declaring a fiscal emergency and calling for a municipal election to submit a local ballot measure to the voters to consider adopting a one-half cent transactions and use tax to fund various city services; and

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2011, city voters considered and approved Measure O, to allow the City to collect the one-half cent transactions and use tax to fund various city services ("<u>Measure O</u>"); and

WHEREAS, the ordinance adopted pursuant to Measure O provided that the one-half cent transactions and use tax ("<u>Sales Tax</u>") would expire three (3) years from the date it was first collected; and

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2014, the City Council appointed an ad hoc committee to consider the need to extend the existing one-half cent transactions and use tax, which was slated to expire in April 2015; and

WHEREAS, on November 4, 2014, City voters elected to adopt Measure Y (previously Measure O) which continued the one-half cent transactions and use tax for an additional five (5) year period, to expire March 31, 2020; and,

WHEREAS, on March 18, 2019, the City Council appointed an ad-hoc committee, the Transaction and Use Tax Exploratory Committee, to consider the need to extend the existing one-half cent transactions and use tax and the appointed ad hoc committee found that, "The \$1.98 million dollars that Measure "Y" provides the City, on an annual basis, represents about 16% of the total income the City receives. Despite all that has been accomplished to balance the budget, the City cannot survive, as we know it, without Measure "Y" funding"; and

WHEREAS, the Transactions and Use Tax Exploratory Committee recommended the City Council propose a ballot measure for the November 5, 2019 general election to continue the one-half cent transactions and use tax for an additional eleven (11) years; and

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2019, the City Council passed Resolution 2019- XX to place a ballot measure on the November 5, 2019 ballot, considering the extension of the one-half cent transaction and use tax for an additional eleven (11) years; and

WHEREAS, Revenue and Taxation Code section 7285.9 authorizes the City to increase or extend a transactions and use tax for general purposes if (1) the ordinance proposing the tax is approved by a two-thirds vote of all the members of Council; and (2) the tax is approved by the majority of the City's voters.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Oakdale does hereby resolve:

- 1. <u>Call for Election</u>. A ballot measure ("<u>Ballot Measure</u>") shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City at the November 5, 2019 general election, proposing an amendment to Chapter 11 of the City of Oakdale Municipal Code to extend the one-half cent transaction and use tax adopting Measure Y for an additional eleven (11) years.
- 2. <u>Form a Ballot Measure</u>. The text of the proposed ordinance to be submitted to the voters is attached as Exhibit A to this resolution. The exact form of the Ballot Measure to be voted upon shall appear on the ballot as follows:

To help prevent additional budget cuts and maintain City services, including police and fire protection, senior programs, and other general services, shall	YES
the City of Oakdale extend the existing ½ cent sales tax set to expire April 2020, for an additional eleven (11) years, with resident oversight and annual independent audits?	NO

The Ballot Measure shall be designated on the ballot by a letter printed on the left margin of the square containing the description of the measure, as provided in California Elections Code Section 13116.

- 3. <u>Proposed Ordinance</u>. The ordinance authorizing the extension of the Sales Tax to be approved by the voters is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference. The Council hereby approves the ordinance, the form thereof, and its submission to the voters at the November 5, 2019 general election, as required by Revenue and Taxation Code Section 7285.9, subject to the approval of a majority of the voters voting on the Ballot Measure at the election called by the adoption of this resolution.
- 4. <u>City Attorney's Impartial Analysis</u>. After reviewing the Ballot Measure, the City Attorney for the City of Oakdale has prepared the following impartial analysis of the Ballot Measure pursuant to California Elections Code section 9280:

California Revenue and Taxation Code requires voter approval to extend a transactions and use tax for general purposes. In 2011, voters in the City of Oakdale approved Measure "O" to institute a transactions and use tax within the City of one-half cent. This tax had a sunset date of April 2015. In 2014, voters in the City of Oakdale approved Measure "Y" to institute an extension the transactions and use tax within the City of one-half cent for an additional five (5) years. If passed, this measure, placed on the ballot by the City Council, will allow the City of Oakdale to collect approximately one million seven hundred thousand dollars annually in sales tax revenue that can be used for general services within the City. The measure will result in individuals continuing to pay a one-half cent tax for transactions within the City. If the measure does not pass, the transaction and use tax implemented through Measure "Y" will expire in April 2020, and the City will no longer be able to collect the revenue.

- 5. Full Text of Ballot Measure. The full text of the "Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Oakdale Amending Article II of Chapter 11: Transactions and Use Tax to Delay the Original Termination Date for Nineteen (19) Years" will be available at no cost, from the City Clerk's Office or on the City's website: www.oakdalegov.com. A statement about how to obtain the full text of the Ordinance will be included in the Voter Information Pamphlet below the City Attorney's Impartial Analysis.
- 6. <u>Passage of Ballot Measure</u>. Such Ballot Measure shall require a majority vote to become effective.
- 7. <u>Consolidation of Election</u>. The City Council hereby authorizes and requests that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Stanislaus, State of California ("<u>BOS</u>") order the consolidation of the election in the City of Oakdale to be held on November 5, 2019, with any other election(s) to be held on the same regular election date, pursuant to California

Election Code section 10400 et. seq.

- 8. <u>Deadline for Submittal of Arguments</u>. Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9282, the deadline for submitting arguments for or against the Ballot Measure is 5:00 p.m. on July 26, 2019. All arguments shall be three hundred (300) words or less and shall be submitted to the City Clerk who shall transmit such arguments to the County Registrar of Voters ("ROV"). The provisions of the Section shall only apply to the election to be held on November 5, 2019 and shall then be repealed.
- 9. Request for Election Services. The Council hereby requests the BOS to permit the ROV to render the City such services as the City Clerk may request relating to the conduct of the above-describe election including: ordinance of election precincts, polling places, voting booths, voting systems and election officers, printing and mailing of voter pamphlets, preparation and tabulation of the result of votes cast, canvassing of the returns of the election.
- 10. <u>Costs</u>. The City shall reimburse the County for the actual cost incurred in conducting the election upon receipt of a bill stating the amount due.
- 11. Filing with County. The Council directs the City Clerk to submit this resolution and accompanying documents to the County BOS and ROV no later than July 3, 2019.
- 12. Notice. In accordance with California Elections Code Section 9205, the City Clerk is directed to publish public notice of the election in an adjudicated newspaper of general circulation. Such notice shall include the election date, election location, ballot questions, passage requirement, and the deadlines for submitting arguments and rebuttals. Such notice and an affidavit attesting to its publication shall be filed pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9206.

WHEREAS, on November 4, 2014, City voters elected to adopt Measure Y (previously Measure O) which continued the one-half cent transactions and use tax for an additional five (5) year period, to expire March 31, 2020; and,

Section 11-12.8. TERMINATION DATE. The authority to levy the additional one-half of one cent tax imposed by this article shall expire eight (8) years nineteen (19) years from the date the city first commenced collecting the additional tax amount. At that time, the rate shall return to the one cent rate that was in place before the city first began collecting the additional tax amount. (Ord. No. 1202; Ord. No. 1202 (amended); Ord. No. 1224-14.)

SECTION 2.

EFFECTIVE DATE. Upon approval by the majority of voters in the City of Oakdale voting on this Ordinance, this Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after the results of the election are declared by the city council.

VOTER CERTIFICATION. Upon certification of voter approval, this Ordinance was duly approved by the following vote of the voters of the City of Oakdale on November 5, 2019.

the voters of the city of Oakdale, California, whether the office of City Clerk shall be appointive; (2) Requesting the Board of Supervisors of Stanislaus County to consolidate a municipal election on a local measure with other elections to be held on the November 5, 2019 consolidated district election date; (3) Requesting the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors permit the County Elections Official to render election services to the city; and (4) Approving the proposed ordinance.

I. BACKGROUND

The City Clerk position in the city of Oakdale has been an elected position since the City first became incorporated in 1906. A voter approval of a change to make the position appointive would allow the City Council to set qualifications and make the appointment or delegate that responsibility to the City Council by ordinance.

At the January 22, 2019 City Council Meeting, the City Council approved filling the City Clerk position by appointment to complete the current term which expires in 2020 and directed staff to prepare an ordinance revision to make the City Clerk an appointed position, furthermore, directed staff to prepare a ballot measure for the November 5, 2019 consolidated district election.

II. DISCUSSION

State law requires every general law city have a City Clerk, who may be either elected by the voters or appointed. Due to the continued growing complexity of local government, the duties of the City Clerk continue to become more numerous and technical in nature, requiring professional skills and expertise in areas such as election law, federal and state regulations, records management and conflict of interest standards. For these reasons among others, the trend of cities throughout the state and the country over the last several years has been to have appointed City Clerks based on professional standards for the position as well as experience and credentials, rather than through a general election process of which the only required qualifications are being over 18 years old, a city resident, a registered voter in the city of residence, and not having been convicted of certain disqualifying crimes (e.g., embezzlement of public funds, bribery, etc.). In fact, according to a March 2019 report from the League of California Cities, of the 482 cities in California, 381 (79%) have an appointed

City Clerk and of the nine cities in Stanislaus County, the City of Oakdale is the only city without an appointed City Clerk.

The most frequent argument in favor of retaining the elected City Clerk position is a notion that an independently elected City Clerk is important to "checks and balances" in our governance structure. In reality, statutes of the State of California prescribe the basic functions and duties of the City Clerk, and the Government Code and Election Code provide precise and specific responsibilities and procedures to follow. By contrast, the City cannot impose any minimum qualifications for an elected position such as a level of experience, education, professional certification or training so there is no guarantee that an elected City Clerk will possess the necessary skills and expertise to perform at the professional level currently required. On the other hand, an appointed City Clerk can be selected based on education, management experience, licenses, and professional training and be subject to normal personnel procedures, including annual performance evaluations and possible termination for unsatisfactory performance.

Pursuant to Government Code section 36508, the City Council must submit a local measure to the voters to determine whether the City Clerk position should be appointive. The California Government Code addresses the election process for this ballot question for a general law city. "Section 36508. At any municipal election, or a special election held for that purpose, the city council may submit to the electors the question whether the elective officers, or any of them except council members, shall be appointed by the city council; provided, however, that the city council shall not submit such question to the electors more often than once in an 11-month period." "36509. The question shall be printed on the ballots used at the election substantially in the following form: 'Shall the office of city clerk be appointive?' The words 'yes' and 'no' shall be so printed on the ballots that the voters may express their choice.

Consistent with the Elections Code requirements, the proposed resolution calls for an election to consider the ballot measure and sets forth the exact language of the ballot measure, including the City Attorney's impartial analysis of the ballot measure, as required by the Stanislaus County Registrar of Voters. It incorporates the full text of the proposed ordinance (Exhibit A) and declares that the City Council approves the ordinance and its submission to voters for consideration and makes a formal request to the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors to consolidate the ballot measure election with other elections being held on the same election date and furthermore, directs the Stanislaus County Registrar of Voters to provide the City with election services.

If the resolution is adopted, it must be mailed to both the Stanislaus County Registrar of Voters and the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors so that both receive the resolution before July 3, 2019, which is the deadline for submitting resolutions to the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors for consideration. The Board of Supervisors will consider the request for consolidation and election services at their July 16, 2019 meeting, and, if approved, the ballot measure will go before the voters at the November 5, 2019 election. After the election,

the City Council must hold a meeting to declare the results. If the Ballot Measure passes, it will become effective ten (10) days after City Council's declaration of results.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

The Stanislaus County Clerk's Office provided an estimate of \$6.00 to \$7.50 per voter as the City's election costs (Attachment B), regardless of the number of ballot measures up for consideration. Additional costs for the preparation of an ordinance, advertising and translation services for this ballot measure would be approximately \$1000 and would be paid for with funds allocated for these expenses in the General Fund, City Clerk Election Expense Account (110-1130-425031).

The City would realize a cost savings with an appointed City Clerk position as no further salary would be required to be paid for an elected City Clerk position (\$2,400 a year) and ongoing election expenses would be eliminated (approximately \$800 a year).

- 5. Full Text of Ballot Measure. The full text of the "Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Oakdale Amending the Oakdale Municipal Code, Chapter 2, Administration, Adding Article XIV, Appointment of City Clerk, Section 2-55, Changing the City Clerk Position from Elected to Appointed" will be available at no cost, from the City Clerk's Office or on the City's website: www.oakdalegov.com. A statement about how to obtain the full text of the Ordinance will be included in the Voter Information Pamphlet below the City Attorney's Impartial Analysis.
- 6. <u>Passage of Ballot Measure</u>. Such Ballot Measure shall require a majority vote to become effective.

- 7. Consolidation of Election. The City Council hereby authorizes and requests that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Stanislaus, State of California ("BOS") order the consolidation of the election in the City of Oakdale to be held on November 5, 2019, with any other election(s) to be held on the same regular election date, pursuant to California Election Code section 10400 et. seq.
- 8. <u>Deadline for Submittal of Arguments</u>. Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9282, the deadline for submitting arguments for or against the Ballot Measure is 5:00 p.m. on July 26, 2019. All arguments shall be three hundred (300) words or less and shall be submitted to the City Clerk who shall transmit such arguments to the County Registrar of Voters ("<u>ROV</u>"). The provisions of the Section shall only apply to the election to be held on November 5, 2019 and shall then be repealed.
- 9. Request for Election Services. The Council hereby requests the BOS to permit the ROV to render the City such services as the City Clerk may request relating to the conduct of the above-describe election including: ordinance of election precincts, polling places, voting booths, voting systems and election officers, printing and mailing of voter pamphlets, preparation and tabulation of the result of votes cast, canvassing of the returns of the election.
- 10. <u>Costs</u>. The City shall reimburse the County for the actual cost incurred in conducting the election upon receipt of a bill stating the amount due.
- 11. Filing with County. The Council directs the City Clerk to submit this resolution and accompanying documents to the County BOS and ROV no later than July 3, 2019.
- 12. Notice. In accordance with California Elections Code Section 9205, the City Clerk is directed to publish public notice of the election in an adjudicated newspaper of general circulation. Such notice shall include the election date, election location, ballot questions, passage requirement, and the deadlines for submitting arguments and rebuttals. Such notice and an affidavit attesting to its publication shall be filed pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9206.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE AMENDING THE OAKDALE MUNICIPAL CODE, CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION, ADDING ARTICLE XIV, APPOINTMENT OF CITY CLERK, SECTION 2-55, CHANGING THE CITY CLERK POSITION FROM ELECTIVE TO APPOINTIVE.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF OAKDALE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 2-55 of Article XIV of Chapter 2 of the City of Oakdale Municipal Code shall read as follows:

SECTION 1. The office of City Clerk shall be changed from elective to appointive pursuant to California Government Code section 36508.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect as provided in §9217 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

EFFECTIVE DATE. Upon approval by the majority of voters in the City of Oakdale voting on this Ordinance, this Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after the results of the election are declared by the city council.

SECTION 3.

VOTER CERTIFICATION. Upon certification of voter approval, this Ordinance was duly approved by the following vote of the voters of the City of Oakdale on November 5, 2019.

Re: May 2019 Administration Department Report



In an effort to highlight the work being done by all City Departments, City staff provides monthly activity reports to the City Council at the 2nd City Council meeting of each month. These reports are included in the agenda packet as an informational item but council members are encouraged to ask questions about any of the items listed in the report. The purpose of these reports is to help keep the City Council and the public apprised of the work being done in all areas of city operations.

Administration Department Activities

- Continued dialogue with right-of-way purchasing agent to finalize details on the Pedersen Road right-of-way acquisition efforts. UPDATE: The right-of-way purchasing agreements for Pederson Road were finalized and signed by the property owners at the beginning of May. The City Council approved the purchase agreements at its May 6, 2019 meeting. Construction on the Oak Leaf Meadows multi-family housing project and Pederson Road street improvements should commence in a few days.
- Prepared and presented a report at the joint City Council and Oakdale Fire Protection District Board meeting held on Tuesday, April 9, 2019. Both governing bodies voted to extend the existing fire services agreement with Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District (SCFPD) for an additional year. If this agreement is approved by SCFPD the agreement will be extended until June 30, 2020. UPDATE: The SCFPD Board discussed our extension request during three different meetings. They had a new draft agreement prepared that included provisions that were unacceptable to the Council. For example, the agreement stated that the Fire Chief would not attend City Council meetings and that the City would be liable for unfunded liabilities that have not yet been identified. Additionally, the proposal did not include any new cost figures. With the contract expiring on June 30, 2019 the City Council and Oakdale Fire Protection District Board (OFPD) decided to end its contract with SCFPD on June 30, 2019. The City and OFPD are currently negotiating a new fire services contract with another fire agency.
- Met with the Deputy Director of Caltrans District 10, Arvinder Bajwa to discuss the Stearns and Highway 108/120 intersections. Community concerns about that intersection were shared and a request to install radar feedback signs and additional flashing warning lights in both east and west bound directions was

made. Caltrans indicated that they would review our request and get back to us. UPDATE: We received a letter from Caltrans indicating that they were going to perform a full traffic study on the Stearns and 108/120 intersection. We hope to receive the results from that study in 10 weeks or so.

- Participated in the Stanislaus County Transit Cost Sharing meeting on Thursday, April 18, 2019 in Modesto at the StanCOG offices.
- Attended the Governance Restructuring Workgroup meeting on Thursday, April 25, 2019 to discuss and finalize the details surrounding the formation of the Stanislaus Homeless Alliance
- Attended the Special City Council Workshop on Public Safety held on Monday, April 29, 2019 at the Oakdale Community Center.
- Attended the May 2, 2019 Special Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection
 District Board meeting held in Riverbank. The Board discussed the City's oneyear contract extension proposal but took no formal action but directed their legal
 council to prepare a new agreement.
- Prepared for and attended a Fire Services 2 + 2 Committee meeting on Friday, May 3, 2019 to discuss the options available to the City and OFPD.
- Reviewed the agenda and departmental staff reports for the May 6, 2019 City Council meeting.
- Prepared for and attended the Special City Council meeting on Wednesday, May 8, 2019. The Council took formal action to not extend the fire services agreement with SCFPD.
- Prepared a presentation and spoke to the Oakdale Realtors Association on Thursday, May 9, 2019.
- Attended the May 9, 2019 Sierra Pointe Specific Plan Annexation workshop held at the Oakdale Community Center. A presentation was given by a representative of the property developer to provide information to neighboring residents about the development.



Below are the latest available crime stats for the calendar year to date (April 2018 vs April 2019 - Attachment A):

- There were no homicides in 2018 and 1 in 2019.
- Robbery decreased 33% from 9 in 2018 to 6 in 2019.
- Aggravated Assault decreased 33% from 6 in 2018 to 4 in 2019.
- Rape remained unchanged with 1 in 2018 and 1 in 2019.
- Simple Assault decreased 25% from 40 in 2018 and 30 in 2019.
- Burglary increased 22% from 32 in 2018 to 39 in 2019.
- Vehicle Theft increased 21% from 28 in 2018 to 34 in 2019.
- Larceny increased 4% from 139 in 2018 to 144 in 2019.
- Non-Injury Collisions increased 33% from 36 in 2018 to 48 in 2019.

PATROL - ONGOING

 Officers continue to provide additional patrol and enforcement in areas directly surrounding area schools in efforts to diminish drivers violating school zone laws as well as focused enforcement in areas throughout the city where complaints of habitual speeding, stop sign running, and motorists failing to stop for pedestrians are reported. Traffic messaging trailer continue to be deployed at various locations in the city, including the Stearns Rd. area on the east side of the city and the Crane Rd. area on the west side of the city.

- Officers continue to respond to habitual transient offender (HTO) complaints and offer resources. Policy #430 Homeless Persons was recently updated. Officers continue to be encouraged to contact the homeless for purposes of rendering aid, support and for community-oriented policing purposes.
- Staff is scheduled to attend upcoming stakeholder meetings focused in Mental Health which overlaps a large sub-population of our homeless community members.

- Officers are utilizing crime analysis and partnering with the Stanislaus Auto Theft
 Task Force (STANCATT) to address trends. At least monthly, an officer attends
 an information sharing meeting with STANCATT. Through our partnership with
 STANCATT we also have the ability to deploy "bait" cars to apprehend auto
 thieves. Officers have made arrests during the past several weeks related to
 recent vehicle thefts.
- Patrol teams continue work in their assigned policing zones and beat realignments. At any given time there are several Problem Oriented Policing (POP) projects being led by officers as long-term problem solving strategies.
- Members of the police department volunteered for various duties to assist with the "Love Oakdale" event.
- On April 17, 2019, staff attended a meeting focused on regional law enforcement trends and efforts with Congressman Josh Harder.
- On April 18, 2019, all police department personnel attended a meeting focused on the Oakdale Police Department Strategic Plan and Division Goals.
- On April 25, 2019, staff hosted the Oakdale Chamber of Commerce Leadership Oakdale Program for "Police Day Activities".
- On April 26, 2019, staff attended the CSU Stanislaus Criminal Justice Advisory Board to discuss ongoing trends in the criminal justice system and opportunities to partner on intern projects.
- On April 29, 2019, staff attended the City Council Workshop on Public Safety and presented 2018/19 measured outcomes and the new Oakdale Police Department Three Year Strategic Plan.

 Communications Center is now up and running. Staff continues to work on the
 goal of pushing the video out to patrol units in the field.
- IXII Group, Inc. met with staff on April 8, 2019 and provided a final operational
 efficiency assessment report on the Communications Center. The consultant also
 met with all dispatcher/clerk personnel to discuss the report and
 recommendations. The report was provided to all members of the
 Communications Center to assist in working towards recommended
 improvements as a team going forward.
- Staff continues to review and update department manual policies to maintain compliance with changing laws and best practices. Eight policy updates are currently being considered for updates:

- Staff continues to work with Sierra Railroad on drafting a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the police department and the railroad partnering on the department's electric motorcycle use along the railroad tracks.
- Staff continues to develop next year's departmental budget in consultation with the Finance Department and City Manager's Office.
- As part of the development of the Department Strategic Plan, Division Commanders met with teams to develop Division goals. On April 18, 2019, all

police department personnel attended a meeting focused on the Oakdale Police Department Strategic Plan and Division Goals.

- Staff continues to make progress on the outfitting of patrol vehicles and mobile in-car radio projects. The mobile radios in the vehicles have all been updated with current channel and frequencies and we continue to wait on a final approval from the Department of Justice (DOJ) to begin work on the Cradlepoint Wireless Router System and installation of CLETS in the patrol vehicles. Staff met with DOJ and is much closer to implementation of the CLETS in patrol vehicles.
- Staff is working on the replacement of Communications Center consoles and equipment. This is much needed as our current equipment has exceeded its serviceable use life. The replacement project was approved by City Council on April 1st. The replacement plan is being proposed to coincide with the future renovation of the police facility in order to maximize efficiency.
- Animal Services Staff are working on strategies to address feral cat challenges within the communities of Oakdale and Riverbank. Stakeholder meetings are being planned to discuss options including education and enforcement strategies.
- Staff continues to work with members of the community on the Neighborhood Watch Radar program.

RECRUITMENT

- With two recent police sergeant retirements, the department is actively recruiting for full-time police officers with one candidate currently in the background process. As the officer positions are filled, promotions to the supervisor positions will follow.
- The department continues to hold recruitments for part-time Reserve Police Officer, and part-time Public Safety Dispatcher/Clerk positions.
- The Executive Assistant to the Police Chief recruitment is in the final selection phase pending background(s). An appointment is anticipated by mid-May.
- Staff anticipates a future part-time Admin Support position vacancy and will be recruiting to establish an eligibility list.

ONGOING

 Patrol officers and professional staff continue to attend Neighborhood Watch meetings. The Oakdale Police Department appreciates and actively partners with our community Neighborhood Watch Groups and together are committed to achieving a higher quality of life and lower level of crime through community involvement.

- Personnel continue to attend various training in the month of March:
 - o Our K9 officers continue to attend monthly canine training.
 - o COPLINK Training.
 - Milestone POD Camera SystemTraining.
- Staff received the graffiti report for the month of April from the city's TAG (Teamup Against Graffiti) coordinator Mike Hancock who reported there were five graffiti incidents last month and no outstanding from the previous month. Additionally, he reported there was one new gang related graffiti incident in April. A map showing graffiti incidents is attached (Attachment C).


