



I. BACKGROUND

On April 19, 2004, the City Council approved an expansion of the Oak Valley Hospital District utilizing properties located at 350 South Oak Avenue. As part of this expansion, J Street was re-aligned through this area between Ash Avenue and Oak Avenue. Figure 1, Location Map, illustrates the location of the Oak Valley Hospital and the re-alignment of J Street as it is now configured. In accordance with the Conditions of Approval for that project, the City Council approved the final improvement plan on June 20, 2016.

II. DISCUSSION

The final design of the J Street Re-alignment project was reported, considered and approved by the City Council which included Condition No. 31 which states;

City Council Staff Report (Continued)

SUBJECT: J Street Acceptaence from Oak Valley Hospital District

MEETING DATE: December 17, 2018

"31. Final design of the Ash Avenue and "J" Street intersection shall be done during the "J" Street Improvement plan review. Final design of the "J" Street right-of-way improvements shall include the transition of a Class I bike path under-crossing from Ash Avenue, bicycle signage, public pedestrian sidewalks and possibly a Class II bike lane within "J" Street. Final design shall be reported to Planning Commission and City Council."

The re-alignment of J Street was completed with the expansion of the Oak Valley Hospital. Other improvements as conditioned include: These improvements include additional pavement and concrete to provide a bike lane in the pavement and a sidewalk from the tunnel to J Street. Drainage improvements will also be made to route runoff from the culvert adjacent to the tunnel into the grass basin. They also included two mid-way pedestrian islands in J Street with enhanced pedestrian crosswalks; a pavement slurry seal of J Street between Oak Avenue and Ash Avenue, and re-stripe J Street and provide bicycle signage.

On July 19, 2018 a letter from the City Engineer to the Oak Valley Hospital District was sent indicating that required improvements have been constructed and installed per approved plans and specifications and are deemed acceptable to the City subject to dedication of these improvements and right of way to the City.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City of Oakdale. The Oak Valley Hospital District constructed and installed improvements as required per Condition No. 31 of Resolution No. 2004-05, stated above. The City will commence maintenance responsibilities of this section of J Street upon Council acceptance.

IV. RECOMMENDATION



Subject: Part-Time Salary Schedule Adjustments

I. BACKGROUND

The City's Rules and Regulations for the Employment of Part-Time and Temporary Employees identify a number of part-time and temporary employment classifications and include salary schedules based on an hourly rate of pay for these positions (Attachment B.) The current part-time salary schedule was last updated in April 2018. New rates are normally administered on 01 January of each year to coincide with the California minimum wage increase. This new salary rate schedule is for calendar year 2019.

II. DISCUSSION

Since the last part-time salary schedule update, the State government has approved a minimum age increase. Effective January 1, 2019, the minimum wage increased from \$11.00 to \$12.00 per hour for employers with 26 employees or more. Although staff has adjusted salaries to comply with the new law, this proposed part-time and temporary salary schedule is being brought to Council for formal adoption.

III. FISCAL IMPACTS

All positions requiring adjustment to comply with new state wages have been calculated. The total cost for all positions for this increase is \$21.00 (Step A) to \$26.00 (Step E). No appropriations are needed to cover the increased costs in the FY 2018-19 budget. The increase will be included in the proposed FY 2018-19 budget.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the Resolution Approving the Revisions to the Salary Schedule for Part-Time and Temporary Employees.



The project was completed on time. During construction it was discovered that each home had Orangeburg pipe sewer laterals, made of paper and tar. The material was old and very fragile. I. BACKGROUND

The Airport Fuel Terminal Upgrade Project will replace an existing and discontinued fuel terminal with a new terminal equipped with a cellular communication kit and LED Multi-Display.

II. DISCUSSION

QTpod is discontinuing service for the existing M3000 Fuel Terminal for some of the following reasons:

- The M3000 utilizes older technology that is difficult to source and not compatible with many modern components. With the scarcity of spare parts, it will be difficult to keep the unit working in the event of a part failure.
- 2. The M3000 was designed to operate on the telecommunications infrastructure which was common at the time. Modern communication options like internet or cellular is not an option for the M3000.
 - a. The Airport fuel terminal has been down twice in 2018 due to wasps and bird nests found in the AT&T equipment.
 - b. The Oakdale Aero Club reported that their members had to fly to Modesto Airport to fuel during downtime.
 - c. This problem reduces revenue, is a potential safety issue and is solved with the new unit's cellular communication abilities.
- 3. The liability shift for chip card acceptance goes into effect for automated fuel terminals in October of 2020. Due to the limited programming memory available on the M3000 and the antiquated nature of dial up modems, QTpod will be unable to update those terminals for chip card acceptance which means the City could have greater liability for unauthorized transactions.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

To help facilitate the transition to newer technology, QTpod offered a limited time discount to the City for returning the old M3000. This reduces the investment by \$3,495.00 for a grand total Project cost of \$19,028.96.

The project is funded by Fund 659 - Airport Capital Replacement and is accounted for in the Fiscal Year 2018/19 Final Budget.

IV. RECOMMENDATION



Communications

The new M4000 utilizes either wired Ethernet, Wi-Fi or cellular communications for card processing and communication with Siteminder, our fuel management software. Why is this better?

- The old analog phone network is deteriorating and the telecom companies have shown they
 have little interest in maintaining these lines in favor of their digital and fiber networks.
- This results in inconsistent quality of the old phone lines which can cause customers to have to swipe their card multiple times to get approvals as well as card settlement failures. This can delay payment for the merchant.
- Dial up authorizations can take up to 60 seconds. Authorizations on the M4000 are virtually instant.
- The Wi-fi and cellular options help reduce costs for installation as there is no need to trench and run communications wire.

 everyone is automatically updated.
- The customer no longer has to perform firmware updates at the terminal as well. When updates are available, QT simply pushes these updates to the terminal over the internet.
- All of our subscription packages now cover software updates, so customers no longer have to worry about paying additional fees for upgraded software.
- Siteminder being web based now makes for easier, seamless integration with 3rd party software platforms. We currently have exports for TAS, Total FBO, FBO Manager and MyFBO.

Support

- As the M4000 and Siteminder are now web based, QT now has greater flexibility when it comes to supporting the terminals.
 - QT Support staff can remote into any terminal and see exactly what the customer is seeing on the screen. This reduces miscommunication between the customer and QT support staff, resulting in more timely resolution of issues.
 - QT can reboot the system, check diagnostics and receive errors without the customer having to be at the terminal. No more standing in the rain to troubleshoot.
 - QT can remote in and see the inputs and outputs of the pump interface board functioning through a diagnostics utility rather than relying on the customer to tell us which lights are coming on.
 - Multiple alerts are being built into the system so that QT will receive alerts if certain issues crop

QTpod M4000 – Communications

QT POD M4000 - Wired Ethernet Communications



The M4000 comes standard to accommodate a wired ethernet connection. A wired ethernet connection is a very good option if certain conditions can be met as this provides a stable and consistent connection to the customers' network. This also avoids the increased cost of optional communication kits. However, there are several factors that may determine whether or not this is the best option.

- 1. A wired Cat 5 or Cat 6 cable has distance limitations of around 300 feet. Beyond that range, the signal begins to degrade and become less reliable. Some IT staff may be able to install boosters to push the signal further, but QT can not guarantee the reliability of this.
- 2. There may be financial or logistical restraints to pulling and ethernet line to the fuel island. In some instances, it may be the case that an existing phone line for an M3000 or competitor unit already in place terminates in the same location as the network panel. In such instances, the customer may be able to attach Cat 5 to the phone line and as they pull the phone line out, they pull the Cat 5 into its place. However, if the Cat 5 needs to terminate elsewhere it may be cost prohibitive or technically difficult to get the ethernet cable to the M4000.

QT POD M4000 - Wi-Fi Communications



QT POD offers an optional Wi-Fi kit for \$500 MSRP that will allow the M4000 to access the web via the customer wireless network. This may be a good option for those customers who can't get an ethernet cable out to the system and do not want the additional cost of a cell plan. There are some factors to take into consideration if this route is chosen.


- 1. You will want to confirm that the customer can get a strong, consistent Wi-Fi signal at the fuel island. This can be affected by several factors such as:
 - Distance of the fuel island from the wireless router
 - Any obstacles between the router and the fuel island
 - Quality and reliability of the customer's wireless router
 - Quality and reliability of their internet service provider (ISP)
- The customer's IT personnel may be able to utilize a commercially available outdoor wireless range extended to boost the Wi-Fi signal to the fuel farm area.

QT POD M4000 - Zipline Communications



For installations in which distance limitations prohibit the use of Cat 5 or Wi-Fi-communications, and the customer does not wish to incur the cost of a cellular plan, QT POD offers the Teletics Zipline. The Zipline system comprises of two, outdoor rated radio antennae that can wirelessly transmit an ethernet signal over 1-3 miles line of sight and retails for \$1200. The Zipline device essentially acts like a wired ethernet connection, but eliminates the need to physically run wire to the fuel island.

In a typical installation, one antenna is mounted at the M4000 and requires a 110VAC outlet. The other antenna is mounted where it can be wired into the customer's network. For proper operation, the Zipline needs a clear, unobstructed line of sight between the two antennae.

Cellular communications is the preferred method for use on the M4000. This is due to the ease of installation and the speed and high reliability of cellular networks. M4000s shipped with our optional cellular kit will come preconfigured with the wireless account provided by QT POD. The advantage of this is that there is literally no work for the installer to set-up a communications link for the M4000. Once the system is powered up, it automatically communicates with the nearest cell tower. This also provides a high degree of reliability as it does not interface with the customer's network. Therefore, if anyone makes changes to internet service providers or to their firewall, it will have absolutely no effect on the M4000.

QT POD's cellular kit is \$1000 MSRP. This also requires a Verizon unlimited data plan provided by QT POD for \$480/yr. This cellular plan is added to the customer's yearly service subscription.

Prior to choosing this option, it is advised that someone with a Verizon cellular plan check the signal strength at the fuel farm location.

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES BETWEEN THE CITY OF OAKDALE AND MSI FUEL MANAGEMENT, INC.

This **AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES** ("<u>Agreement</u>") is made and entered into this 17th day of December, 2018, by and between the City of Oakdale, a California municipal corporation ("<u>City</u>") and MSI Fuel Management, Inc., a <u>Party</u>, ("<u>Contractor</u>") City and Contractor may herein be referred to individually as a "<u>Party</u>" and collectively as the "<u>Parties</u>". There are no other parties to this Agreement.

RECITALS

- **A.** City desires to retain the services of Contractor to perform work in connection with Airport Fuel Terminal Upgrade (the "<u>Project</u>").
- **B.** Contractor has submitted a proposal to City that includes a scope of proposed services, attached hereto and described more fully in **Exhibit A** ("<u>Services</u>"). Contractor desires to perform the Services, on the terms and conditions set forth herein.
- **C.** Contractor represents that it is qualified, willing and able to provide the Services to City, and that it will perform Services related to the Project according to the rate schedule attached hereto and described more fully in **Exhibit A** (the "Rates").

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and covenants set forth below, the Parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

Section 1. Description of Work.

- (a) Services. Contractor shall perform the Services described in Exhibit A, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein. Contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, material and supplies required or necessary to properly, competently and completely perform the work or render the Services. Contractor shall determine the method, details and means of doing the work or rendering the Services, however, Contractor shall not receive additional compensation for the performance of any services unless they are included in Exhibit A, or the Parties otherwise agree in writing.
- (b) *Modification of Services*. Only the City Manager may authorize extra or changed work. Failure of Contractor to secure such a written authorization for extra or changed work shall constitute a waiver of any and all right to adjustment in the Agreement price or Agreement time due to such unauthorized work and thereafter Contractor shall be entitled to no compensation whatsoever for the performance of such work. Contractor further waives any and all right or remedy by way of restitution or quantum meruit for any and all extra work performed without such express and prior written authorization of the City Manager.

- **Section 2.** Compensation. Contractor shall perform the Services according to the Rates set forth in Exhibit A, provided that in case shall the work exceed \$19,028.96.
- **Section 3.** Term. This Agreement shall commence on the Effective Date and will continue in effect until the Services provided herein have been completed ("<u>Term</u>"), unless sooner terminated as provided in Section 9. Contractor, however, shall not commence the performance of the Services until it has been given notice by City ("<u>Notice to Proceed</u>").
- **Section 4. Payment**. City shall pay Contractor for all Services described in Exhibit A that are actually performed, and Contractor agrees to accept compensation as provided in Exhibit A. On a monthly basis, Contractor shall provide City, in reasonable and understandable detail, a description of the Services rendered, and in accordance with the Rates. If the work is satisfactorily completed, City shall pay such invoice within thirty (30) days of its receipt. If City disputes any portion of any invoice, City shall pay the undisputed portion within the time stated above, and at the same time advise Contractor in writing of the disputed portion. Failure to accomplish work in any given month may subject Contractor to a reasonable amount of financial retention from that month's invoice until the situation is corrected.
- **Section 5. Representations of Contractor.** City relies upon the following representations by Contractor in entering into this Agreement:
- (a) Standard of Care. City has relied upon the professional ability and training of Contractor as a material inducement to enter into this Agreement. Contractor hereby warrants that it is qualified to perform the Services provided in Exhibit A, using generally accepted construction practices and standards, in compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws. Contractor's failure to comply with any laws, ordinances, codes or regulations applicable to the performance of the Services hereunder shall constitute a breach of contract. In cases where standards conflict, the standard providing the highest degree of protection shall prevail.

If a death, serious personal injury or substantial property damage occurs in connection with the performance of this Agreement, Contractor shall immediately notify the City's risk manager by telephone. If any accident occurs in connection with this Agreement, Contractor shall promptly submit a written report to City. This report shall include the following information: (a) name and address of the injured or deceased persons; (b) name and address of Contractor's subcontractor, if any; (c) name and address of Contractor's liability insurance carrier; and (d) a detailed description of the accident, including whether any of City's equipment, tools or materials were involved.

If a release of a hazardous material, substance, or waste occurs in connection with the performance of this Agreement, Contractor shall immediately notify City. Contractor shall not store hazardous materials or hazardous waste within the City limits without a proper permit from City.

(b) *Independent Contractor*. In performing the Services, Contractor shall act as an independent contractor and shall have control of the work and the manner in which it is performed. Contractor is not to be considered an agent or employee of City, and is not entitled to participate in any pension plan, insurance, bonus, or other benefits City may provide its employees. In the event

City exercises its right to terminate this Agreement, Contractor expressly agrees that it shall have no recourse or right of appeal under rules, regulations, ordinances, or laws applicable to employees. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as creating an employment, agency or partnership relationship between City and Contractor.

- Taxes. Contractor agrees to file federal and state tax returns and pay all applicable (c) taxes on amounts paid pursuant to this Agreement and shall be solely liable and responsible to pay such taxes and other obligations, including, but no limited to, state and federal income and FICA taxes. Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold City harmless from any liability which it may incur to the United States or to the State of California as a consequence of Contractor's failure to pay, when due, all such taxes and obligations. In case City is audited for compliance regarding any withholding or other applicable taxes, Contractor agrees to furnish City with proof of payment of taxes on these earnings.
- Authority. Contractor represents that it possesses the necessary licenses, permits (d) required to perform the Services or will obtain such licenses or permits prior to the time such licenses or permits are required. Contractor shall also ensure that all subcontractors are similarly licensed and qualified. Contractor represents and warrants to City that Contractor shall, at Contractor's sole cost and expense, keep in effect or obtain at all times during the Term of this Agreement, any licenses, permits, and approvals which are legally required for Contractor to practice Contractor's profession at the time the Services are rendered.
- Warranty. Contractor warrants that the work performed shall be free of defects for a period of one (1) year from project completion. If any installation fails as the result of the workmanship of Contractor, Contractor shall repair or replace the defective installation at no cost to City. Warranty work shall be performed within three (3) business days of notice by City that such work is required.
- Records Maintenance. Contractor shall keep and maintain full and complete (f) documentation and accounting records concerning all Services performed that are compensable under this Agreement and shall make such documents and records available to City for inspection at any reasonable time. Contractor shall maintain such records for a period of not less than five (5) years following completion of work hereunder.
- No Conflict of Interest. Contractor represents that no conflict of interest will be (g) created under state or federal law by entering into or in carrying out this Agreement. Contractor further promises that in the performance of this Agreement, no person having such interest will be knowingly employed.
- Nondiscrimination. Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations in regard to nondiscrimination in employment because of race, creed, color, sex, age, marital status, physical or mental disability or national origin. In addition, all agreements with sub-contractors will include language as required by the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Programs that requires sub-contractors to maintain equal employment opportunity policies, and, as necessary, affirmative action policies.

- (i) Prevailing Wage. Contractor agrees to pay all craftsmen and laborers working on this Project at least the minimum prevailing wage as determined by the California Department of Industrial Relations. Contractor understands and agrees that it is Contractor's responsibility to determine the minimum prevailing wage and to report compliance.
- **Section 6. Assurance of Performance.** If, at any time, City believes Contractor may not be adequately performing its obligations under this Agreement or may fail to complete the Services as required by this Agreement, City may submit a written request to Contractor for written assurances of performance and a plan to correct any observed deficiencies in Contractor's performance. Failure to provide written assurances subsequent to such written request shall constitute grounds to declare a breach under this Agreement.
- **Section 7. Excusable Delays.** Contractor shall not be in breach of this Agreement in the event that performance of Services is temporarily interrupted or discontinued due to a "<u>Force Majeure</u>" event which is defined as: riots, wars, sabotage, civil disturbances, insurrections, explosion, natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes, landslides, fires, strikes, lockouts and other labor disturbances or other catastrophic events, which are beyond the reasonable control of Contractor. Force Majeure does not include: (a) Contractor's financial inability to perform; (b) Contractor's failure to obtain any necessary permits or licenses from other governmental agencies; or (c) Contractor's failure to obtain the right to use the facilities of any public utility where such failure is due solely to the acts or omissions of the Contractor.
- **Section 8. Ownership and Disclosure of Work Product.** City shall be the owner of and shall be entitled to immediate possession of accurate reproducible copies of any design computations, plans, specifications, copies of correspondence, maps, or other pertinent data and information gathered or computed by Contractor ("Work Product") in the performance of and prior to termination of this Agreement by City or upon completion of the work pursuant to this Agreement. Contractor may retain copies of the above-described documents. When this Agreement is terminated, Contractor agrees to return to City all documents, drawings, photographs and other written or graphic material, however produced, that it received from City, its contractors or agents, in connection with the performance of its Services under this Agreement. All materials shall be returned in the same condition as received.
- **Section 9. Termination.** City may terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration of the Term ("<u>Termination</u>"), without cause or reason, upon five (5) days' advance written notice (the "<u>Termination Notice</u>"). Upon receipt of a Termination Notice, Contractor shall immediately cease performing the Services. Contractor will be entitled to compensation, as of the date Contractor receives the Termination Notice, only for Services actually performed. Compensation under this paragraph shall not include costs related to lost profit associated with the expected completion of the Services.

Notwithstanding the above, this Agreement may be terminated by City for cause based on the loss or suspension of any licenses, permits or registrations required for the continued provision of the

Services, or Contractor's malfeasance. Termination of the Agreement for cause as set forth in this Section shall relieve City from compensating Contractor.

Section 10. Property of City. The following will be considered and will remain the property of City:

- (a) *Documents*. All reports, drawings, graphics, working papers and Confidential Information furnished by City in connection with the Services ("<u>Documents</u>"). Nothing herein shall be interpreted as prohibiting or limiting City's right to assign all or some of City's interests in the Documents.
- (b) *Data*. All data collected by Contractor and produced in connection with the Services including, but not limited to, drawings, plans, specifications, models, flow diagrams, visual aids, calculations, and other materials ("<u>Data</u>"). Nothing herein shall be interpreted as prohibiting or limiting City's right to assign all or some of City's interests in the Data.
- (c) Delivery of Documents and Data. Contractor agrees, at its expense and in a timely manner, to return to City all Documents and Data upon the conclusion of the Term or in the event of Termination.
- Section 11. Liability for Breach. Neither Party waives the right to recover damages against the other for breach of this Agreement including any amount necessary to compensate City for all detriment proximately caused by Contractor's failure to perform its obligations hereunder or which in the ordinary course of things would be likely to result therefrom. City reserves the right to offset such damages against any payments owed to Contractor. City shall not in any manner be liable for Contractor's actual or projected lost profits had Contractor completed the Services required by this Agreement. In the event of Termination by either Party, copies of all finished or unfinished Work Product shall become the property of City. Notwithstanding the above, in no event shall City be liable, regardless of whether any claim is based on contract or tort, for any special, consequential, indirect or incidental damages, including, but not limited to, lost profits or revenue, arising out of or in connection with this Agreement or the Services performed in connection with this Agreement.
- **Section 12. Insurance.** Contractor, and all of its contractors and subcontractors, shall obtain and maintain insurance of the types and in the amounts described in this Section, with carriers reasonably satisfactory to City.
- (a) General Liability Insurance. Contractor shall maintain commercial general liability insurance with coverage at least as broad as Insurance Services Office form CG 00 01, in an amount not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage, including without limitation, blanket contractual liability and coverage for explosion, collapse and underground property damage hazards. Contractor's general liability policies shall be primary and not seek contribution from the City's coverage, and be endorsed using Insurance Services Office form CG 20 10 to provide that City and its officers, officials, employees, and agents shall be additional insureds under such policies. For construction contracts, an endorsement providing completed operations to the additional insured, ISO form CG 20 37, is also

required.

- (b) Workers' Compensation Insurance. Contractor shall maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance (Statutory Limits) and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000). Contractor shall submit to City, along with the certificate of insurance, a Waiver of Subrogation endorsement in favor of City, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers.
- (c) Automobile Liability. Contractor shall provide auto liability coverage for owned, non-owned, and hired autos using ISO Business Auto Coverage form CA 00 01, or the exact equivalent, with a limit of no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per accident.
- (d) Within five (5) days of the Effective Date, Other Insurance Requirements. Contractor shall provide City with certificates of insurance for all of the policies required under this Agreement ("Certificates"), excluding the required worker's compensation insurance. Certificates shall be kept current for the Term of the Agreement and Contractor shall be responsible for providing updated copies and notifying City if a policy is cancelled, suspended, reduced, or voided. With the exception of the worker's compensation insurance, all of the insurance policies required in this Agreement shall: (a) provide that the policy will not be cancelled, allowed to expire, or materially reduced in coverage without at least thirty (30) days' prior written notice to City of such cancellation, expiration, or reduction and each policy shall be endorsed to state such; (b) name City, and City's Agents as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of Services, work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor; products and completed operations of the Contractor; premises owned, occupied, or used by the Contractor, or automobiles owned, leased, or hired or borrowed by the Contractor. The coverage shall contain no special limitations on the scope of protection afforded to the City; (c) be primary with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs covering City or City's Agents and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by City or City's Agents shall be in excess of Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute to it; (d) contain standard separation of insured provisions; and (e) state that any failure to comply with reporting or other provisions of the policy including breaches of warranties shall not affect the coverage provided to the City.
- (e) *Material Breach*. If Contractor, for any reason, fails to maintain insurance coverage that is required pursuant to this Agreement, such failure shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement. City, at its sole option, may terminate this Agreement and obtain damages from Contractor resulting from said breach. Alternatively, City may purchase such required insurance coverage, and without further notice to Contractor, City may deduct from sums due to Contractor any premium costs advanced by City for such insurance. These remedies shall be in addition to any other remedies available to City.

When Applicable:

(f) Builder's Risk Insurance. Upon commencement of construction and with approval of City, Contractor shall obtain and maintain Builder's Risk/Course of Construction insurance. Policy shall be provided for replacement value on an "all-risk" basis. The City shall be named as

Loss Payee on the policy and there shall be no coinsurance penalty provision in any such policy. Policy must include: (1) coverage for removal of debris, and insuring the buildings, structures, machinery, equipment, materials, facilities, fixtures, and all other properties constituting a part of the project; (2) coverage with limits sufficient to insure the full replacement value of any property or equipment stored either on or off the project site. Such insurance shall be on a form acceptable to City to ensure adequacy of terms and limits. Contractor shall not be required to maintain property insurance for any portion of the Project following transfer of control thereof to City.

- (g) Contractors Pollution Liability. Pollution Coverage shall be provided on a Contractors Pollution Liability form or other form acceptable to City providing coverage for liability arising out of sudden, accidental and gradual pollution and remediation. The policy limit shall be no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim. All activities contemplated in this agreement shall be specifically scheduled on the policy as "covered operations." The policy shall provide coverage for the hauling of waste from the project site to the final disposal location, including non-owned disposal sites.
- (h) Professional Liability. Consultant shall maintain professional liability insurance that insures against professional errors and omissions that may be made in performing the Services to be rendered in connection with this Agreement, in the minimum amount of one millions dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim and in the aggregate. Any policy inception date, continuity date, or restorative date must be before the effective date of this agreement, and Consultant agrees to maintain continuous coverage through a period no less than three years after completion of the services required by this agreement.
- **Section 13. Indemnification.** Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless City, its officers, employees, agents and volunteers from and against all liability, loss, damage, expense, and cost (including, without limitation, reasonable legal counsel fees, expert fees and all other costs and fees of litigation) of every nature arising out of or in connection with Contractor's negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct in the performance of work hereunder, or its failure to comply with any of its obligations contained in this Agreement, except such loss or damage caused by the active negligence or willful misconduct of the City. It is expressly understood and agreed that the foregoing provisions are intended to be as broad and inclusive as is permitted by the law of the State of California and will survive termination of this Agreement.
- **Section 14. Non-Collusion.** For competitively bid projects, Contractor represents that he has provided a non-collusion affidavit pursuant to Public Contract Code 7106 prior to the provision of any Services under this Agreement.
- **Section 15. Retentions.** City, in its sole discretion, shall determine whether to set aside retentions in accordance with Public Contract Code sections 9203, 7107, 20104.50 and 22300.
- **Section 16. Resolution of Claims and Disputes.** The Parties shall abide by Public Contract Code section 20104 *et seq.* if such provisions apply to this Agreement. In such case where those provisions do apply, in any arbitration to resolve a dispute relating to or arising out of this Agreement, the arbitrator's award shall be supported by law and substantial evidence. The arbitrator shall file a

written decision with the court and serve a copy of it on each of the Parties. The written decision shall contain a summary of the evidence, reasons underlying the decision, and unless the Parties otherwise agree, findings of fact and conclusions of law.

Section 17. Notices. Any notice or communication required hereunder between City and Contractor must be in writing, and may be given either personally, by registered or certified mail (return receipt requested), or by Federal Express, UPS or other similar couriers providing overnight delivery. If personally delivered, a notice or communication shall be deemed to have been given when delivered to the Party to whom it is addressed. If given by registered or certified mail, such notice or communication shall be deemed to have been given and received on the first to occur of (a) actual receipt by any of the addressees designated below as the party to whom notices are to be sent, or (b) five (5) days after a registered or certified letter containing such notice, properly addressed, with postage prepaid, is deposited in the United States mail. If given by Federal Express or similar courier, a notice or communication shall be deemed to have been given and received on the date delivered as shown on a receipt issued by the courier. Any Party hereto may at any time, by giving ten (10) days written notice to the other Party hereto, designate any other address in substitution of the address to which such notice or communication shall be given. Such notices or communications shall be given to the Parties at their addresses set forth below:

Section 19. General Provisions.

(a) Recitals. The recitals set forth above ("Recitals") are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into and made part of this Agreement by this reference. In the event of any

inconsistency between the Recitals and Section 1 through 20 of this Agreement, Sections 1 through 20 shall prevail.

- (b) *Modification*. No alteration, amendment, modification, or Termination of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and executed by all of the Parties to this Agreement.
- (c) Waiver. No covenant, term, or condition or the breach thereof shall be deemed waived, except by written consent of the Party against whom the waiver is claimed, and any waiver of the breach of any covenant, term, or condition shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach of the same or any other covenant, term, or condition.
- (d) Authority. All Parties to this Agreement warrant and represent that they have the power and authority to enter into this Agreement and the names, titles, and capacities herein stated on behalf of any entities, persons, states, or firms represented or purported to be represented by such entities, persons, states or firms and that all former requirements necessary or required by the state or federal law in order to enter into the Agreement have been fully complied with.
- (e) Assignment. No Party shall assign, transfer, or otherwise dispose of this Agreement in whole or in part to any individual, firm, or corporation without the prior written consent of the other Party. Subject to the forgoing provisions, this Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the respective successors and assigns of the Parties.
- (f) Drafting and Ambiguities. Each Party acknowledges that it has reviewed this Agreement with its own legal counsel, and based upon the advice of that counsel, freely entered into this Agreement. Each Party has participated fully in the review and revision of this Agreement. Any rule of construction that ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party does not apply in interpreting this Agreement.
- (g) Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of California.
- (h) *Venue*. Venue for all legal proceedings shall be in the Superior Court of California for the County of Stanislaus.
- (i) Severability. If any term, covenant, or condition of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in effect.
- (j) *Counterparts*. This Agreement may be executed simultaneously and in several counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- (k) *Audit*. City shall have access at all reasonable times to all reports, contract records, contract documents, contract files, and personnel necessary to audit and verify Contractor's charges to City under this Agreement.

- (l) Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with its specific references, attachments and exhibits, constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matters hereof, and supersedes any and all prior negotiations, understanding and agreements with respect hereto, whether oral or written.
- (m) Supersedes Prior Agreement. It is the intention of the Parties hereto that this Agreement shall supersede any prior agreements, discussions, commitments, or representations whether, written, electronic or oral, between the Parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement.
- (n) *Mandatory and Permissive*. "Shall" and "will" and "agrees" are mandatory. "May" and "can" are permissive.
- (o) *Headings*. Headings used in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not be considered in construing this Agreement.
- (p) Attorney's Fees and Costs. If any action at law or in equity, including arbitration, mediation or any action for declaratory relief, is brought to enforce or interpret provisions of this Agreement, or because of any breach by either Party of the terms hereof, the prevailing Party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs, which may be set by the court in the same action or in a separate action brought for that purpose, in addition to any other relief to which such Party may be entitled.
- (q) Necessary Acts and Further Assurances. The Parties shall at their own cost and expense execute and deliver such further documents and instruments and shall take such other actions as may be reasonably required or appropriate to evidence or carry out the intent and purposes of this Agreement.

I. BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

In September of 2014, Governor Edmund G. Brown signed SGMA into law, which changed the landscape of groundwater management. Formation of a GSA must occur no later than June 30, 2017 and development and adoption of a GSP must be adopted no later than January 31, 2022.

In January of 2017 the Oakdale City Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding with other STRGBA member agencies to form a GSA for the Sub-basin. The MOU provides a mechanism for the agencies to fund the work of the GSA.

In August of 2017 STRGBA GSA authorized consultant Todd Groundwater ("Todd") to develop and submit a grant application package to the DWR 2017 Sustainable Groundwater Planning Grant Program to help fund the preparation of the GSP. The grand total cost for Todd to prepare and submit the GSP is \$1,469,296, plus a contingency in the amount of \$146,930 for additional services (if needed). STRGBA GSA also authorized City of Modesto to be the grant applicant on behalf of STRGBA GSA and act as the contracting agency with Todd.

On September 26, 2017, Modesto City Council authorized the submittal of an application to DWR for the Sustainable Groundwater Planning Grant Program, and authorized the City of Modesto City Manager or his designee to execute all grant-related documents, if awarded.

On April 4, 2018, the City of Modesto, on behalf of the STRGBA GSA, received a Proposition 1 2017 Sustainable Groundwater Planning Grant Award for \$1,000,000 which will cover 68% of the GSP preparation cost. The balance of the GSP estimated cost minus the grant amount, (\$1,469,296 - \$1,000,000) or \$496,296, will be divided equally among the agencies that make up the STRGBA GSA.

STRGBA GSA EQUITABLE PROJECT COST SHARING AND REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT FOR PREPARATION OF A GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY PLAN

This Equitable Project Cost Sharing and Reimbursement Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Oakdale, a California municipal corporation, the City of Riverbank, a California municipal corporation, the City of Modesto, a California municipal corporation, the City of Waterford, a California municipal corporation, Stanislaus County, a political subdivision of the State of California, the Oakdale Irrigation District, a California special district, and the Modesto Irrigation District, a California special district. Each of the parties to this Agreement shall individually be referred to as the "Party," or collectively, as the "Parties." This Agreement is entered into this ______ day of _______, 2018.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Parties formed the Stanislaus and Tuolumne Rivers Groundwater Basin Association Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("STRGBA GSA") in 2017 pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding Forming the Stanislaus and Tuolumne Rivers Groundwater Basin Association Groundwater Sustainability Agency ("GSA MOU") entered into and duly adopted by each Party to this Agreement, and

WHEREAS, the recitals to the GSA MOU identify the GSA's obligations to, inter alia, develop a Groundwater Sustainability Plan, as defined in GSA MOU Section 3.9 ("GSP"), for the Modesto Sub-basin, as defined in GSA MOU Section 3.12 ("Modesto Sub-basin"), and

WHEREAS, the Parties have been notified that the City of Modesto as grantee acting on behalf of the STRGBA GSA, has been awarded a Sustainable Groundwater Planning Grant ("Grant") from the State of California Department of Water Resources ("DWR") in the amount

of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00) for the development of the Modesto Sub-basin GSP ("Grant Proceeds"), and

WHEREAS, the Parties have received a proposal from and intend to engage a consultant, Todd Groundwater ("Consultant"), to develop and complete the Modesto Sub-basin GSP for its adoption by the Parties pursuant to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act of 2014, and

WHEREAS, the TOTAL Consultant (all Fees and Services) cost per Consultant's proposal is provided at Exhibit 1 in the amount of ONE MILLION SIX HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS AND SIXTY CENTS, such TOTAL Consultant cost is composed of Consultant's Base Fee and Contingency Services, as each is defined in Exhibit 1, and

WHEREAS, this Agreement identifies each Party's Funding Percentage, as defined in GSA MOU Section 3.4 and described in GSA MOU Section 7.1, with respect to the TOTAL Consultant cost to complete the GSP for its due adoption by the Parties no later than December 31, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties, on the terms and conditions herein set forth, hereby agree as follows:

TERMS:

- 1. The City of Modesto shall enter into an agreement with DWR to receive the Grant Proceeds. The City of Modesto will manage the Grant Proceeds in accordance with the Grant agreement and as directed by the Parties through the STRGBA GSA.
- 2. Subject to the direction and prior approval of the Parties through the STRGBA GSA, the City of Modesto shall execute an agreement with the Consultant for the preparation of the Modesto Sub-basin GSP for the amounts stated in Exhibit 1, TOTAL Consultant cost (Base

Fee plus Contingency Services).

- 3. Subject to prior approval by the Parties through the STRGBA GSA, the City of Modesto will use the Grant Proceeds to pay a portion of the Consultant's Base Fee. The City of Modesto will pay the TOTAL Unfunded Balance, as described in Exhibit 1 as SIX HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS AND SIXTY CENTS, pursuant to the terms below.
- 4. The Parties shall each pay a share of the TOTAL Unfunded Balance to the City of Modesto as reimbursement for the City of Modesto's payment of the Balance as more specifically delineated in Exhibit 1 hereto ("Funding Share"). As specified in Exhibit 1, Stanislaus County, agrees and promises that, for all cost-share obligations under this Agreement, including cost-share for Base Fee and Contingency Services, it shall also be responsible for all cost-share amounts allocable to Tuolumne County.
- 5. In the event that any additional agency becomes a Party to this Agreement, GSA MOU Section 4.5 shall govern the addition and the new party's payment of its proportionate share of the TOTAL Consultant cost and the proportionate decrease and refund of the other Parties' Funding Share.
- 6. Any Party's payment of its Funding Share under this Agreement is contingent and expressly dependent on the condition precedent that the City of Modesto receives the full amount of the Grant Proceeds. If the City of Modesto does not receive the full amount of the Grant Proceeds, the Parties may seek a reduction in the scope of work of the Consultant, the Funding Shares may be adjusted accordingly or the obligations under this Agreement may be extinguished.
 - 7. Each Party shall make payment of its Funding Share pursuant to Exhibit 1 by: (1)

four equal installment payments totaling the amount of the Funding Share, made consecutively at the end of each calendar year, with the first payment due and payable on December 31, 2018; **or**, (2) full payment of the Funding Share by December 31, 2018.

- 8. In the event the Consultant notifies the Parties that payment in excess of the TOTAL Consultant cost is needed, the Parties, through the STRGBA GSA, shall determine whether to approve such additional payment and, if so, direct the City of Modesto to contract with the Consultant accordingly.
- 9. In the event that the actual costs to complete the Modesto Sub-basin GSP by the Consultant are less than the TOTAL Consultant cost and do not require use of the entirety of the Parties' Funding Shares, the Funding Shares shall be recalculated based upon the new Balance and any funds paid in excess of the new Funding Shares shall be refunded to the respective Parties by the City of Modesto accordingly.
- 10. The City of Modesto shall direct the Consultant to provide regular updates on its work to the STRGBA GSA and as directed by the Parties. Upon the request of the Parties, the City of Modesto shall direct the Consultant to provide any interim drafts or models completed for the Modesto Sub-basin GSP to the Parties. Each Party that has paid its respective Funding Share in full shall be entitled to copies of all final deliverables created by the Consultant.
- 11. This Agreement is governed by the GSA MOU and it shall control as to items that are not otherwise specifically addressed herein by this Agreement.

I. BACKGROUND

In September 2000, the State of California adopted AB 85 which requires the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to adopt specific regulations or standards for the permitting and operation of onsite wastewater treatment systems (OWTS), also known as septic systems. On June 19, 2012, the SWRCB adopted the Water Quality Control Plan for Siting, Design, Operation, and Maintenance of Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems (OWTS Policy), and it became effective on May 13, 2013.

The OWTS Policy establishes a waiver of Waste Discharge Requirement permits for OWTS systems meeting the criteria of the OWTS Policy. The OWTS Policy establishes low-risk siting and design requirements for OWTS subject to the OWTS Policy and authorizes local agencies to submit a Local Agency Management Program (LAMP) to the Regional Water Quality Control Board for approval of alternate methods of siting and design to achieve the same purpose.

II. DISCUSSION

Stanislaus County, Department of Environmental Resources (DER), operates of program for the approval of siting, design, operation, and maintenance of OWTS for individual residences within its Environmental Health Division and has adequate staffing and technical knowledge to meet the requirements of the OWTS Policy. The County submitted a LAMP to the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board for approval.

On June 9, 2017, the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board approved the County's LAMP, for those areas within the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board, and as a result granted a conditional waiver of waste discharge requirements for all OWTS complying with the LAMP.

SUBJECT: OWTS MOU

MEETING DATE: December 17, 2018

On March 14, 2017, the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors approved amendments of Stanislaus County Code Sections 16.10.030 and 20.56.170 to implement the requirements of the LAMP. The Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors delegated authority to the Director of DER to enter into agreements with local jurisdictions to provide services under the LAMP.

The City of Oakdale has existing OWTS and areas without access to a public sewer system. Earlier this year, the SWRCB required all cities to adopt the State's policy for siting, design, operation, and maintenance of OWTS and create their own LAMP, or adopt an approved Lamp from its County. Since Stanislaus County has an approved LAMP in place, the County approached the incorporated cities about utilizing it through a coordinated effort to satisfy the State requirement. In recent months, the County has been working with incorporated cities, including Oakdale, to develop language for a Memorandum of Understanding for this purpose. It is anticipated that most cities will enter into this MOU with Stanislaus County.

The attached MOU has incorporated the collective comments received and City Staff recommends that the City Council authorize the City Manager to sign the document.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with the adoption of this Memorandum of Understanding.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council adopt a Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with Stanislaus County Regarding Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems (OWTS)

pursuant to Chapter 48, Statutes of 2018 and Government

Code Section § 8698.2

I. BACKGROUND

Recently, the State of California announced a new funding stream to local cities called the Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP). HEAP is a \$500 million block grant program designed to provide direct assistance to cities and counties to address the homelessness crisis throughout California. HEAP is authorized by Senate Bill (SB)850, which was signed into law by Governor Brown in June 2018.

HEAP funds are intended to provide funding to Continuums of Care (COCs) and large cities (LCs) with populations over 330,000, so they may provide immediate emergency assistance to people experiencing homelessness. Eligible uses include, but are not limited to the following: homelessness prevention activities, criminal justice diversion programs for homeless individuals with mental health needs, establishing or expanding services meeting the needs of homeless youth or youth at risk of homelessness, and emergency aid. The HEAP funding allocation for Stanislaus County based on population and the 2017 homeless count is \$7.2 million.

The HEAP program is administered by the California Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council (HCFC), which is a division of the California Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency. As part of the application process for the HEAP funds, the governing body of an eligible jurisdiction must adopt a shelter crisis declaration pursuant to Chapter 7.8 of the Government Code. The attached Resolution contains specific language and text that is required by the HCFC and program administrators.

II. DISCUSSION

Stanislaus County has advised that HEAP funds are intended to provide immediate emergency assistance to people experiencing homelessness or those at-risk for potential homelessness. The parameters of the HEAP program are intentionally broad to allow local communities to craft programs that meet the specific needs that have been identified. The use of HEAP funds must align with California's Housing First policy.

Eligible uses of HEAP funds include the following:

- Services: street outreach, health and safety education, criminal justice diversion programs, homelessness prevention activities, and other service activities;
- Rental assistance or subsidies: housing vouchers, rapid re-housing programs, flexible housing subsidy funds, and eviction prevention strategies;
- Capital improvements: emergency shelter, navigation centers, transitional housing, permanent supportive housing, small/tiny houses, and improvements to current structures that serve homeless individuals and families;
- Youth services: at least five percent of HEAP funds must be used towards establishing or expanding services that meet the needs of homeless youth or youth at risk of homelessness (Stanislaus County minimum youth threshold amount – \$361,849.30); and,
- Administrative costs: are allowed for both the Administrative Entity (AE) and subrecipients but are capped at five percent of program funds.

The primary requirement for access to these funds is that each individual governmental jurisdiction within Stanislaus County must pass a resolution declaring a shelter crisis. Stanislaus County has formally requested that all 9 Cities within the County consider approving this resolution. The shelter crisis resolution states that while efforts have been undertaken to address homelessness, that currently the health and safety of unsheltered individuals is threatened by the lack of available shelter for these individuals. The resolution affirms the City's commitment to "combatting homelessness and creating or augmenting a continuum of shelter and service options for those living without shelter in our communities".

If the City of Oakdale Council chooses not to adopt the shelter crisis resolution, the City of Oakdale or nonprofits wanting to do projects within the City of Oakdale will not have access to any of the HEAP funds for 2019. Approving the resolution does not inherently commit the City to any particular course of action with regard to projects or services for the homeless. One concern that has been discussed regionally is the perception that approval of this resolution will require that the City build a homeless shelter in town. This is not accurate. Declaration of the shelter crisis simply would provide access to the HEAP funds so that if Oakdale wanted to pursue a project or service (or coordinate a project or service with the County) it would have access to the \$7.2 million in HEAP funding. Oakdale may choose to pursue funding for a project or not based on the normal decision-making process conducted by Council. The resolution essentially confirms that insufficient shelter exists to serve the community's homeless, since Oakdale has only limited services for its homeless population as well as limited availability locally (and regionally) for shelter.

The CSOC and County representatives are currently creating/restructuring a governance structure which will administer the HEAP grant funds. Each jurisdiction will have the opportunity to request funding for programs that align with the CSOC programs and strategy for addressing homelessness. The governance structure will include

members from many of the Stanislaus County jurisdictions which will assist in administration and oversight of the funding.

It is conceivable that the City of Oakdale may not choose to make use of the HEAP funds, however, passing of this resolution would at least provide the opportunity for use of this funding in the future should Oakdale so choose.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

No immediate direct fiscal impact. However, if the City of Oakdale decides to partner to move forward with a program, service or project that would assist homeless individuals the City would have access to a portion of the \$7.2 million in HEAP funding. Currently the CSOC/HEAP groups have discussed proposing to split the heap funding between flex/funding rental assistance, youth navigation center, and an access center/shelter. The County and the City of Modesto have been in the process of considering different possible shelter locations for a number of months as the majority of the homeless population is located in the Modesto area.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Consider whether or not to approve a Resolution declaring a shelter crisis in Oakdale pursuant to Government Code § 8698.2.

Community Redevelopment Agency authorizing the Executive Director to execute an Agreement with Urban Analytics to provide required continuing disclosure services for the 2018 Series A and B Tax

Allocation Bonds

I. BACKGROUND

The Oakdale Community Redevelopment Agency was established and activated by Ordinance No. 770 adopted by the City Council on April 6, 1981, at which time the City Council declared itself to be the governing board of the Former Agency. The Former Agency was charged with the authority and responsibility of redeveloping and upgrading blighted areas of the City.

On June 28, 2011, Assembly Bill No. 26 ("AB X1 26") was enacted as Chapter 5, Statutes of 2011, together with a companion bill, Assembly Bill No. 27 ("AB X1 27"). A lawsuit entitled *California Redevelopment Association, et al. v. Matosantos, et al.*, was brought in the State Supreme Court challenging the constitutionality of AB X1 26 and AB X1 27. In a published decision (53 Cal. 4th 231 (Dec. 29, 2011)), the State Supreme Court largely upheld AB X1 26, invalidated AB X1 27, and held that AB X1 26 may be severed from AB X1 27 and enforced independently. As a result of AB X1 26 and the decision of the State Supreme Court, as of March 1, 2012, all redevelopment agencies in the State, including the Former Agency, were dissolved, and successor agencies were designated as successor entities to the former redevelopment agencies to expeditiously wind down the affairs of the former redevelopment agencies.

The primary provisions of AB X1 26 relating to the dissolution and winding down of former redevelopment agency affairs are Parts 1.8 (commencing with Section 34161) and 1.85 (commencing with Section 34170) of Division 24 of the Health & Safety Code of the State, as amended on June 27, 2012 by Assembly Bill No. 1484 ("AB 1484"), enacted as Chapter 26, Statutes of 2012 and as further amended on September 22, 2015 by Senate Bill 107 ("SB 107"), enacted as Chapter 325, Statutes of 2015 (collectively, as amended from time to time, the "Dissolution Act").

On January 10, 2012, pursuant to an adopted City Council resolution and Section 34173 of the Dissolution Act, the City Council of the City elected to serve as the successor agency to the Former Agency. Subdivision (g) of Section 34173 of the Dissolution Act, which was added by AB 1484, expressly affirms that the Successor Agency is a separate public entity from thee liabilities of the Former Agency will not

be transferred to the City, nor will the assets of the Former Agency become assets of the City.

In April 2018 the Successor Agency sold its \$13,935,000 Series 2018 A Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds and \$1,660,000 Series 2018 B Taxable Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds. There are certain continuing disclosure requirements associated with these bonds that the City must follow (Attachment B).

In order to comply with the continuing disclosure requirements, it is recommended that the City enter into an agreement with Urban Analytics. Urban Analytics will provide the following services for the Successor Agency:

Provided Services

Task 1: Annual Meeting

Section 3 (d) of the Certificate requires the Agency Representative and the Disclosure Consultant to hold a meeting (the "Annual Meeting") regarding the preparation and timely filing of the Annual Report.

The Disclosure Consultant will contact the Agency Representative on or before January 15 to set up the Annual Meeting. Under the terms of the Certificate, the Agency Representative will respond within 10 business days to schedule the meeting on a date sufficient to meet the Filing Date. In order to meet the Filing Date, the Annual Meeting will be held on or about February 1, provided that such date is at least 25 business days prior to the Filing Date to allow for preparation, review and filing of the Annual Report on or before the Filing Date.

The Annual Meeting will, at a minimum, cover:

- 1) The status of the audited financial statement, including its expected date of completion. In the event the expected date of completion is on or after 15 business days prior to the Filing Date, the Agency Representative will provide the Disclosure Consultant with an unaudited financial statement.
- 2) In the event that the Successor Agency has issued any debt payable from or secured by a pledge of Tax Revenues in the Project Area (as defined in the Official Statement) in the most recently completed fiscal year, the Agency Representative will provide the Disclosure Consultant with a description of such issuance to meet the requirements of Section 4(b)(ii) of the Certificate.
- 3) The status of the Teeter Plan with respect to the Successor Agency will be discussed along with notification language to be included in the Annual Report in the event that the Teeter Plan is discontinued, as required under Section 4(b)(vii) of the Certificate.
- 4) A discussion of the items enumerated under Section 5(a) in the Certificate (the "Listed Events"). Should there be any Listed Events that the Successor Agency has determined are material, the Agency Representative will identify them for the

Disclosure Consultant and both parties will develop language describing the material event for inclusion in the Annual Report.

5) A plan for providing to the Disclosure Consultant on or about March 1 (provided that such a date is no later than 10 business days prior to the Filing Date), the written certification to accompany the Annual Report, as required under Section 3(a) of the Certificate.

Task 2: Annual Report Preparation

Disclosure Consultant shall be provided with an electronic copy of the audited financial statement required under Section 4(a) of the Certificate at least 15 business days prior to the Filing Date. In the event that the audited financial statement is not available by that date, an electronic copy of an unaudited financial statement will be provided to the Disclosure Consultant.

Disclosure Consultant shall prepare the tables and information listed in Section 4(b) of the Certificate. Where required information is found in the financial statement, references will be made to the financial statement.

In the event any of the Listed Events identified in Section 5 of the Certificate are identified by the Successor Agency during the Annual Meeting as having occurred, Disclosure Consultant will include a discussion of such events based on language prepared with the Agency Representative during the Annual Meeting. In the event no Listed Events have occurred, the events will be enumerated with the descriptor "None".

On or about March 1 (but at least 10 business days prior to the Filing Date), the Agency Representative will provide the Disclosure Consultant with the written certification required under Section 3(a) of the Certificate to the effect that the Annual Report constitutes the Annual Report required to be furnished by the Successor Agency.

Task 3: Annual Report Filing

The Disclosure Consultant will provide the Agency Representative with a review copy of the Annual Report in electronic form on or about March 1 (provided such date is at least 10 business days prior to the Filing Date). The Agency Representative will provide Disclosure Consultant with any comments or suggested revisions at least 5 business days prior to the Filing Date. Disclosure Consultant will then review and revise the Annual Report as appropriate.

Provided that the Disclosure Consultant has received all necessary materials from the Agency Representative, the Disclosure Consultant will then submit the Annual Report to the Dissemination Agent on or before the Filing Date.

In the event that the Annual Report is not submitted to the Dissemination Agent by the Filing Date, the Agency Representative will, with the assistance of the Disclosure Consultant, respond to the Dissemination Agent's request for information regarding the timely submittal of the Annual Report to the MSRB by the Annual Report Date.

In the event that the Annual Report will not be submitted to the MSRB by the Annual Report Date, the Agency Representative, with the assistance of the Disclosure Consultant, will prepare and file the notice required by Section 3(b) of the Certificate.

Task 4: Additional Fiscal Services

Disclosure Consultant will provide Agency with additional fiscal services as requested in writing by the Agency. Additional services will be charged on a time-and-materials basis, at the then-current hourly rate.

II. FISCAL IMPACT

Urban Analytics will commence work under this Scope with the Annual Report submitted by March 31, 2019 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. The initial term of the contract will be for three years, through the March 31, 2021 Annual Report Date.

Tasks 1 through 3 (Continuing Disclosure): The annual fee for the continuing disclosure reports described in Tasks 1 through 3 will be \$4,500 for the first year, with annual increases of 5% in each subsequent year. The fees are based on meetings being held by telephone or email; meetings in person will be billed at the hourly rate for travel time plus expenses. The annual fees include all reasonable expenses, data and materials necessary for the completion of the services described in Tasks 1 through 3 above.

Task 4 (Additional Fiscal Services): Additional services will be provided on a timeand-materials basis, as mutually agreed by the Successor Agency and Urban Analytics. The hourly rate for such additional services is \$260 in FY 2017-18, increasing by 5% in each subsequent year.

The costs for these services will be paid for from account 363-9091-425003 RDA Successor Agency Contract Services as follows:

2019 - \$4,500.00

2020 - \$4,725.00

2021 - \$4,961.25

III. RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Oakdale City Council adopt a resolution that:

CONSULTANT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into as of the __th day of _____ 2018, by and between the City of Oakdale, herein called "City", and Urban Analytics, LLC, herein called the "Consultant."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, City desires to obtain fiscal consulting services related to the continuing disclosure obligations of the Successor Agency to the Oakdale Community Redevelopment Agency in conjunction with the issuance of the 2018 Series A and B Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds; and

WHEREAS, Consultant hereby warrants to the City that Consultant is skilled and able to provide such services described in Section 1 of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, City desires to retain Consultant pursuant to this Agreement to provide the services described in Section 1 of this Agreement.

AGREEMENTS

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Scope of Services</u>. Consultant shall provide fiscal consulting services as set forth in the attached Scope of Work, which is incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. <u>Compensation.</u> Consultant shall be paid as set forth in the attached Scope of Work. City shall process Consultant's invoices within 30 days of receipt.
- 3. <u>Employment of Other Consultants</u>. Consultant will not employ or otherwise incur an obligation to pay other Consultants or experts for services in connection with this Agreement without the prior written approval of the City.
- 4. <u>Liability of City Officers and Employees</u>. No officer or employee of the City shall be personally liable to Consultant for any obligations of the City pursuant to the terms of this Agreement
- 5. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Consultant, in the performance of the work and services pursuant to this Agreement, is acting as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee of City. As an independent contractor, Consultant is not entitled to retirement benefits or other benefits that accrue to City's employees, and Consultant hereby expressly waives any claim to any such rights.
- 6. <u>Assignment Prohibited</u>. Neither the City nor Consultant may assign any right or obligation pursuant to this Agreement. Any attempted or purported assignment of any right or obligation hereunder shall be void and of no effect.
 - 7. <u>Termination of Agreement</u>. This Agreement may be terminated at any time, with

or without cause, by either party upon giving 10 days written notice to the other party. In the event this Agreement is terminated pursuant to this paragraph, Consultant shall be entitled to compensation for any work completed up to the time of termination.

- 8. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement constitutes the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement to City and Consultant. It may be amended or extended from time to time by written agreement of the parties hereto.
 - 9. <u>Time of the Essence</u>. Time is of the essence of this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Waiver</u>. No failure on the part of either party to exercise any right or remedy hereunder shall operate as a waiver of any other right or remedy that party may have hereunder.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Introduction

The following scope of services is focused on assisting the Successor Agency to the Oakdale Community Redevelopment Agency (the "Successor Agency") with meeting certain requirements contained in Appendix H - Form of Continuing Disclosure Certificate (the "Certificate") of the 2018 Series A and B Tax Allocation Bonds (the "Bonds"), specifically those requirements contained in Section 3 – Provision of Annual Reports and Section 4 – Content of Annual Reports (together, the "Annual Report"). Urban Analytics LLC (the "Disclosure Consultant") will work with a designated representative of the Successor Agency (the "Agency Representative") in carrying out the tasks described below.

The Certificate requires the Successor Agency to file the Annual Report with the Dissemination Agent not later than 15 business days prior to the Annual Report Date of March 31. For the purposes of this Scope, the Successor Agency's filing deadline with the Dissemination Agent is referred to as the "Filing Date".

Task 1: Annual Meeting

Section 3 (d) of the Certificate requires the Agency Representative and the Disclosure Consultant to hold a meeting (the "Annual Meeting") regarding the preparation and timely filing of the Annual Report.

The Disclosure Consultant will contact the Agency Representative on or before January 15 to set up the Annual Meeting. Under the terms of the Certificate, the Agency Representative will respond within 10 business days to schedule the meeting on a date sufficient to meet the Filing Date. In order to meet the Filing Date, the Annual Meeting will be held on or about February 1, provided that such date is at least 25 business days prior to the Filing Date to allow for preparation, review and filing of the Annual Report on or before the Filing Date.

The Annual Meeting will, at a minimum, cover:

1) The status of the audited financial statement, including its expected date of completion. In the event the expected date of completion is on or after 15 business days prior to the Filing Date, the Agency Representative will provide the Disclosure Consultant with an unaudited financial statement.

- 2) In the event that the Successor Agency has issued any debt payable from or secured by a pledge of Tax Revenues in the Project Area (as defined in the Official Statement) in the most recently completed fiscal year, the Agency Representative will provide the Disclosure Consultant with a description of such issuance to meet the requirements of Section 4(b)(ii) of the Certificate.
- 3) The status of the Teeter Plan with respect to the Successor Agency will be discussed along with notification language to be included in the Annual Report in the event that the Teeter Plan is discontinued, as required under Section 4(b)(vii) of the Certificate.
- 4) A discussion of the items enumerated under Section 5(a) in the Certificate (the "Listed Events"). Should there be any Listed Events that the Successor Agency has determined are material, the Agency Representative will identify them for the Disclosure Consultant and both parties will develop language describing the material event for inclusion in the Annual Report.
- 5) A plan for providing to the Disclosure Consultant on or about March 1 (provided that such a date is no later than 10 business days prior to the Filing Date), the written certification to accompany the Annual Report, as required under Section 3(a) of the Certificate.

Task 2: Annual Report Preparation

Disclosure Consultant shall be provided with an electronic copy of the audited financial statement required under Section 4(a) of the Certificate at least 15 business days prior to the Filing Date. In the event that the audited financial statement is not available by that date, an electronic copy of an unaudited financial statement will be provided to the Disclosure Consultant.

Disclosure Consultant shall prepare the tables and information listed in Section 4(b) of the Certificate. Where required information is found in the financial statement, references will be made to the financial statement.

In the event any of the Listed Events identified in Section 5 of the Certificate are identified by the Successor Agency during the Annual Meeting as having occurred, Disclosure Consultant will include a discussion of such events based on language prepared with the Agency Representative during the Annual Meeting. In the event no Listed Events have occurred, the events will be enumerated with the descriptor "None".

On or about March 1 (but at least 10 business days prior to the Filing Date), the Agency Representative will provide the Disclosure Consultant with the written certification required under Section 3(a) of the Certificate to the effect that the Annual Report constitutes the Annual Report required to be furnished by the Successor Agency.

Task 3: Annual Report Filing

The Disclosure Consultant will provide the Agency Representative with a review copy of the Annual Report in electronic form on or about March 1 (provided such date is at least 10 business days prior to the Filing Date). The Agency Representative will provide Disclosure Consultant with any comments or suggested revisions at least 5 business days prior to the Filing Date. Disclosure Consultant will then review and revise the Annual Report as appropriate.

Provided that the Disclosure Consultant has received all necessary materials from the Agency Representative, the Disclosure Consultant will then submit the Annual Report to the Dissemination Agent on or before the Filing Date.

In the event that the Annual Report is not submitted to the Dissemination Agent by the Filing Date, the Agency Representative will, with the assistance of the Disclosure Consultant, respond to the Dissemination Agent's request for information regarding the timely submittal of the Annual Report to the MSRB by the Annual Report Date.

In the event that the Annual Report will not be submitted to the MSRB by the Annual Report Date, the Agency Representative, with the assistance of the Disclosure Consultant, will prepare and file the notice required by Section 3(b) of the Certificate.

Task 4: Additional Fiscal Services

Disclosure Consultant will provide Agency with additional fiscal services as requested in writing by the Agency. Additional services will be charged on a time-and-materials basis, at the then-current hourly rate.

TIMING AND FEES

Urban Analytics will commence work under this Scope with the Annual Report submitted by March 31, 2019 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. The initial term of the contract will be for three years, through the March 31, 2021 Annual Report Date.

Tasks 1 through 3 (Continuing Disclosure): The annual fee for the continuing disclosure reports described in Tasks 1 through 3 will be \$4,500 for the first year, with annual increases of 5% in each subsequent year. The fees are based on meetings being held by telephone or email; meetings in person will be billed at the hourly rate for travel time plus expenses. The annual fees include all reasonable expenses, data and materials necessary for the completion of the services described in Tasks 1 through 3 above.

Task 4 (Additional Fiscal Services): Additional services will be provided on a time-and-materials basis, as mutually agreed by the Successor Agency and Urban Analytics. The hourly rate for such additional services is \$260 in FY 2017-18, increasing by 5% in each subsequent year.

David Mealy, principal of Urban Analytics, will provide all services in this Scope. The firm and its principal have no known conflicts of interest.

This CONTINUING DISCLOSURE CERTIFICATE (this "Disclosure Certificate") is executed and delivered by the Successor Agency to the Oakdale Community Redevelopment Agency (the "Successor Agency") in connection with the execution and delivery of the above-referenced bonds (the "Bonds"). The Bonds are being executed and delivered pursuant to an Indenture of Trust, dated as of April 1, 2018, by and between the Successor Agency and U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee (the "Indenture").

The Successor Agency covenants and agrees as follows:

Section 1. <u>Purpose of the Disclosure Certificate</u>. This Disclosure Certificate is being executed and delivered by the Successor Agency for the benefit of the holders and beneficial owners of the Bonds and in order to assist the Participating Underwriter in complying with S.E.C. Rule 15c2-12(b)(5).

Section 2. <u>Definitions</u>. In addition to the definitions set forth above and in the Indenture, which apply to any capitalized term used in this Disclosure Certificate unless otherwise defined in this Section 2, the following capitalized terms shall have the following meanings:

"Agency Representative" means the City Manager of the City of Oakdale or the Executive Director of the Successor Agency.

"Annual Meeting" means an in-person or telephonic meeting between the Disclosure Consultant and one or more Agency Representatives at which the requirements of this Disclosure Certificate, including but not limited to the Content of Annual Reports described in Section 4 hereof and the Reporting of Significant Events described in Section 5 hereof, are discussed.

"Annual Report" means any Annual Report provided by the Successor Agency pursuant to, and as described in, Sections 3 and 4 of this Disclosure Certificate.

"Annual Report Date" means the date that is nine months after the end of the Successor Agency's fiscal year (currently March 31 based on the Successor Agency's fiscal year end of June 30).

"Dissemination Agent" means, initially, U.S. Bank National Association, San Francisco, California, or any successor Dissemination Agent designated in writing by the Successor

Agency and which has filed with the Successor Agency a written acceptance of such designation.

"Disclosure Consultant" means a third-party consultant bearing professional expertise in compliance with the Rule and experience preparing annual reports and material events notices pursuant to the Rule, and who is designated in writing by the Successor Agency and which has filed with the Successor Agency a written acceptance of such designation.

"Listed Events" means any of the events listed in Section 5(a) of this Disclosure Certificate.

"MSRB" means the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, which has been designated by the Securities and Exchange Commission as the sole repository of disclosure information for purposes of the Rule, or any other repository of disclosure information that may be designated by the Securities and Exchange Commission as such for purposes of the Rule in the future.

"Official Statement" means the final official statement executed by the Successor Agency in connection with the issuance of the Bonds.

"Participating Underwriter" means Hilltop Securities Inc., the original underwriter of the Bonds required to comply with the Rule in connection with offering of the Bonds.

"Rule" means Rule 15c2-12(b)(5) adopted by the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as it may be amended from time to time.

Section 3. Provision of Annual Reports.

- The Successor Agency shall, or shall cause the Dissemination Agent to, not later than the Annual Report Date, commencing March 31, 2019 with the report for the 2017-18 fiscal year, provide to the MSRB, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, an Annual Report that is consistent with the requirements of Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate. Not later than 15 Business Days prior to the Annual Report Date, the Successor Agency shall provide the Annual Report to the Dissemination Agent (if other than the Successor Agency). If by 15 Business Days prior to the Annual Report Date the Dissemination Agent (if other than the Successor Agency) has not received a copy of the Annual Report, the Dissemination Agent shall contact the Successor Agency to determine if the Successor Agency is in compliance with the previous sentence. The Annual Report may be submitted as a single document or as separate documents comprising a package, and may include by reference other information as provided in Section 4 of this Disclosure Certificate; provided that the audited financial statements of the Successor Agency may be submitted separately from the balance of the Annual Report, and later than the Annual Report Date, if not available by that date. If the Successor Agency's fiscal year changes, it shall give notice of such change in the same manner as for a Listed Event under Section 5(c). The Successor Agency shall provide a written certification with each Annual Report furnished to the Dissemination Agent to the effect that such Annual Report constitutes the Annual Report required to be furnished by the Successor Agency hereunder.
- (b) If the Successor Agency does not provide (or cause the Dissemination Agent to provide) an Annual Report by the Annual Report Date, the Successor Agency shall provide (or cause the Dissemination Agent to provide) in a timely manner to the MSRB, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, a notice in substantially the form attached as Exhibit A.

- (c) With respect to each Annual Report, the Dissemination Agent shall:
- (i) determine each year prior to the Annual Report Date the then-applicable rules and electronic format prescribed by the MSRB for the filing of annual continuing disclosure reports; and
- (ii) if the Dissemination Agent is other than the Successor Agency, file a report with the Successor Agency certifying that the Annual Report has been provided pursuant to this Disclosure Certificate, and stating the date it was provided.
- (d) The Successor Agency's contract with or designation of the Disclosure Consultant shall require the Disclosure Consultant to contact the Agency Representative(s) prior to the submission of each Annual Report to request an Annual Meeting to be held on a date that reasonably enables the Successor Agency to timely file such Annual Report. The Agency Representative shall respond within 10 business days of such request to schedule the Annual Meeting on a date sufficient to meet such timely filing. The Agency Representative shall timely cooperate in all respects with recommendations of the Disclosure Consultant or Participating Underwriter to meet the Successor Agency's obligations under this Certificate.
- (e) Prior to the submission of the first Annual Report hereunder, the Agency Representative(s) shall receive training about the Rule to be conducted by Jones Hall, A Professional Law Corporation, San Francisco, California, the Successor Agency's bond counsel
- Section 4. <u>Content of Annual Reports</u>. The Annual Report shall contain or incorporate by reference the following:
- (a) The Successor Agency's audited financial statements prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles as promulgated to apply to governmental entities from time to time by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. If the Successor Agency's audited financial statements are not available by the Annual Report Date, the Annual Report shall contain unaudited financial statements in a format similar to the financial statements contained in the final Official Statement, and the audited financial statements shall be filed in the same manner as the Annual Report when they become available.
- (b) Unless otherwise provided in the audited financial statements filed on or before the Annual Report Date, financial information and operating data with respect to the Successor Agency for the preceding fiscal year, substantially similar to that provided in the corresponding tables in the Official Statement:
 - (i) Principal amount of Bonds outstanding.
- (ii) Description of issuance by the Successor Agency of any debt payable from or secured by a pledge of Tax Revenues in the Project Area (as defined in the Official Statement) in the most recently completed fiscal year.
 - (iii) The assessed value of property in the Project Area.
 - (iv) The ten largest local secured property taxpayers in the Project Area.

- (v) A discussion of any pending appeals of any parcel (or parcels owned by a single landowner) in the Project Area where the pre-appeal assessed valuation amount exceeds \$750,000.
- (vi) The amount of Tax Revenues (current fiscal year only) and the coverage ratio provided by Tax Revenues with respect to debt service on the Bonds and any Parity Bonds (current fiscal year only).
- (vii) In the event that during the most recently completed fiscal year Stanislaus County discontinues the Teeter Plan with respect to the Successor Agency, notice thereof.
- (c) Any or all of the items listed above may be included by specific reference to other documents, including official statements of debt issues of the Successor Agency or related public entities, which are available to the public on the MSRB's Internet web site or filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The Successor Agency shall clearly identify each such other document so included by reference.

Section 5. Reporting of Significant Events.

- (a) The Successor Agency shall give, or cause to be given, notice of the occurrence of any of the following Listed Events with respect to the Bonds:
 - (1) Principal and interest payment delinquencies.
 - (2) Non-payment related defaults, if material.
 - (3) Unscheduled draws on debt service reserves reflecting financial difficulties.
 - (4) Unscheduled draws on credit enhancements reflecting financial difficulties.
 - (5) Substitution of credit or liquidity providers, or their failure to perform.
 - (6) Adverse tax opinions, the issuance by the Internal Revenue Service of proposed or final determinations of taxability, Notices of Proposed Issue (IRS Form 5701-TEB) or other material notices or determinations with respect to the tax status of the security, or other material events affecting the tax status of the security.
 - (7) Modifications to rights of security holders, if material.
 - (8) Bond calls, if material, and tender offers.
 - (9) Defeasances.
 - (10) Release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the securities, if material.
 - (11) Rating changes.

- (12) Bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar event of the Successor Agency or other obligated person.
- (13) The consummation of a merger, consolidation, or acquisition involving the Successor Agency or an obligated person, or the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the Successor Agency or an obligated person (other than in the ordinary course of business), the entry into a definitive agreement to undertake such an action, or the termination of a definitive agreement relating to any such actions, other than pursuant to its terms, if material.
- (14) Appointment of a successor or additional trustee or the change of name of a trustee, if material.
- (b) Whenever the Successor Agency obtains knowledge of the occurrence of a Listed Event, the Successor Agency shall, or shall cause the Dissemination Agent (if not the Successor Agency) to, file a notice of such occurrence with the MSRB, in an electronic format as prescribed by the MSRB, in a timely manner not in excess of 10 business days after the occurrence of the Listed Event. Notwithstanding the foregoing, notice of a Listed Event described in subsection (a)(8) above need not be given under this subsection any earlier than the notice (if any) of the underlying event is given to holders of affected Bonds under the Indenture.
- (c) The Successor Agency acknowledges that the events described in subparagraphs (a)(2), (a)(7), (a)(8) (if the event is a bond call), (a)(10), (a)(13), and (a)(14) of this Section 5 contain the qualifier "if material" and that subparagraph (a)(6) also contains the qualifier "material" with respect to certain notices, determinations or other events affecting the tax status of the Bonds. The Successor Agency shall cause a notice to be filed as set forth in paragraph (b) above with respect to any such event only to the extent that it determines the event's occurrence is material for purposes of U.S. federal securities law. Whenever the Successor Agency obtains knowledge of the occurrence of any of these Listed Events, the Successor Agency will as soon as possible determine if such event would be material under applicable federal securities law. If such event is determined to be material, the Successor Agency will cause a notice to be filed as set forth in paragraph (b) above.
- (d) For purposes of this Disclosure Certificate, any event described in paragraph (a)(12) above is considered to occur when any of the following occur: the appointment of a receiver, fiscal agent, or similar officer for the Successor Agency in a proceeding under the United States Bankruptcy Code or in any other proceeding under state or federal law in which a court or governmental authority has assumed jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the Successor Agency, or if such jurisdiction has been assumed by leaving the existing governing body and officials or officers in possession but subject to the supervision and orders of a court or governmental authority, or the entry of an order confirming a plan of reorganization, arrangement, or liquidation by a court or governmental authority having supervision or jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the Successor Agency.

Section 6. <u>Identifying Information for Filings with the MSRB</u>. All documents provided to the MSRB under the Disclosure Certificate shall be accompanied by identifying information as prescribed by the MSRB.

Section 7. <u>Termination of Reporting Obligation</u>. The Successor Agency's obligations under this Disclosure Certificate shall terminate upon the legal defeasance, prior redemption or payment in full of all of the Bonds. If such termination occurs prior to the final maturity of the Bonds, the Successor Agency shall give notice of such termination in the same manner as for a Listed Event under Section 5(c).

Section 8. <u>Dissemination Agent</u>. The Successor Agency may, from time to time, appoint or engage a Dissemination Agent to assist it in carrying out its obligations under this Disclosure Certificate, and may discharge any Dissemination Agent, with or without appointing a successor Dissemination Agent. The initial Dissemination Agent shall be U.S. Bank National Association. Any Dissemination Agent may resign by providing 30 days' written notice to the Successor Agency.

Section 9. <u>Amendment; Waiver</u>. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Disclosure Certificate, the Successor Agency may amend this Disclosure Certificate, and any provision of this Disclosure Certificate may be waived, provided that the following conditions are satisfied:

- (a) if the amendment or waiver relates to the provisions of Sections 3(a), 4 or 5(a), it may only be made in connection with a change in circumstances that arises from a change in legal requirements, change in law, or change in the identity, nature, or status of an obligated person with respect to the Bonds, or type of business conducted;
- (b) the undertakings herein, as proposed to be amended or waived, would, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, have complied with the requirements of the Rule at the time of the primary offering of the Bonds, after taking into account any amendments or interpretations of the Rule, as well as any change in circumstances; and
- (c) the proposed amendment or waiver either (i) is approved by holders of the Bonds in the manner provided in the Indenture for amendments to the Indenture with the consent of holders, or (ii) does not, in the opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel, materially impair the interests of the holders or beneficial owners of the Bonds.

If the annual financial information or operating data to be provided in the Annual Report is amended pursuant to the provisions hereof, the first Annual Report filed pursuant hereto containing the amended operating data or financial information shall explain, in narrative form, the reasons for the amendment and the impact of the change in the type of operating data or financial information being provided.

If an amendment is made to this Disclosure Certificate modifying the accounting principles to be followed in preparing financial statements, the Annual Report for the year in which the change is made shall present a comparison between the financial statements or information prepared on the basis of the new accounting principles and those prepared on the basis of the former accounting principles. The comparison shall include a qualitative discussion of the differences in the accounting principles and the impact of the change in the accounting principles on the presentation of the financial information, in order to provide information to investors to enable them to evaluate the ability of the Successor Agency to meet its obligations. To the extent reasonably feasible, the comparison shall be quantitative.

A notice of any amendment made pursuant to this Section 9 shall be filed in the same manner as for a Listed Event under Section 5(c).

Section 10. Additional Information. Nothing in this Disclosure Certificate shall be deemed to prevent the Successor Agency from disseminating any other information, using the means of dissemination set forth in this Disclosure Certificate or any other means of communication, or including any other information in any Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Listed Event, in addition to that which is required by this Disclosure Certificate. If the Successor Agency chooses to include any information in any Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Listed Event in addition to that which is specifically required by this Disclosure Certificate, the Successor Agency shall have no obligation under this Disclosure Certificate to update such information or include it in any future Annual Report or notice of occurrence of a Listed Event.

Section 11. <u>Default</u>. If the Successor Agency fails to comply with any provision of this Disclosure Certificate, the Participating Underwriter or any holder or beneficial owner of the Bonds may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandate or specific performance by court order, to cause the Successor Agency to comply with its obligations under this Disclosure Certificate. A default under this Disclosure Certificate shall not be deemed an Event of Default under the Indenture, and the sole remedy under this Disclosure Certificate in the event of any failure of the Successor Agency to comply with this Disclosure Certificate shall be an action to compel performance.

Section 12. <u>Duties, Immunities and Liabilities of Dissemination Agent.</u>

- (a) The Dissemination Agent shall have only such duties as are specifically set forth in this Disclosure Certificate, and the Successor Agency agrees to indemnify and save the Dissemination Agent, its officers, directors, employees and agents, harmless against any loss, expense and liabilities which they may incur arising out of or in the exercise or performance of its powers and duties hereunder, including the costs and expenses (including attorneys' fees) of defending against any claim of liability, but excluding liabilities due to the Dissemination Agent's negligence or willful misconduct. The Dissemination Agent shall have no duty or obligation to review any information provided to it by the Successor Agency hereunder, and shall not be deemed to be acting in any fiduciary capacity for the Successor Agency, the Bond holders or any other party. The obligations of the Successor Agency under this Section shall survive resignation or removal of the Dissemination Agent and payment of the Bonds.
- (b) The Dissemination Agent shall be paid compensation by the Successor Agency for its services provided hereunder in accordance with its schedule of fees as amended from time to time, and shall be reimbursed for all expenses, legal fees and advances made or incurred by the Dissemination Agent in the performance of its duties hereunder.

Section 13. <u>Beneficiaries</u>. This Disclosure Certificate shall inure solely to the benefit of the Successor Agency, the Dissemination Agent, the Participating Underwriter and the holders and beneficial owners from time to time of the Bonds, and shall create no rights in any other person or entity.

I. BACKGROUND

ABx1 15 (the Dissolution Act) was enacted in late June 2011 as part of the FY 2011-12 State budget package and was held by the California Supreme Court to be largely constitutional on December 29, 2012. Under the Dissolution Act, each of California's redevelopment agencies (Each a "Dissolved RDA") was dissolved as of February 1, 2012, and cities and counties that formed the Dissolved RDA's, together with other designated entities, have initiated the process under the Dissolution Act to unwind the affairs of the Dissolved RDA's.

II. DISCUSSION

The Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) includes the bonded indebtedness of the former Redevelopment Agency and the reimbursement of City Staff time to administer the Dissolution of the Successor Agency. The funding is provided by the Tax Increments from within the Former Redevelopment Agency boundaries. The ROPS will be forwarded to the Countywide Oversight Board and the State Department of Finance by the February 1, 2019.

III. FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the general fund.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council as Successor Agency adopt the resolution to approve the ROPS for submission to the Successor Agency Oversight Board and the State Department of Finance.

- Robbery increased 200% from 5 in 2017 to 15 in 2018.
- Aggravated Assault increased 19% from 16 in 2017 to 19 in 2018.
- Rape increased 17% from 6 in 2017 to 7 in 2018.
- Simple Assault decreased 23% from 140 in 2017 to 108 in 2018.
- Burglary increased 8% from 89 in 2017 to 96 in 2018.
- Vehicle Theft decreased 7% from 73 in 2017 to 68 in 2018.
- Larceny decreased 4% from 351 in 2017 to 338 in 2018.
- Non-Injury Collisions decreased 5% from 114 in 2017 to 108 in 2018.
- Injury collisions decreased 22% from 73 in 2017 to 57 in 2018.

PATROL - ONGOING

- Officers continue to provide additional patrol and enforcement in areas directly surrounding area schools in efforts to diminish drivers violating school zone laws as well as focused enforcement in areas throughout the city where complaints of habitual speeding, stop sign running, and motorists failing to stop for pedestrians are reported. The new traffic messaging trailer has been deployed at various locations in the city including along West "H" to address speeding and along Yosemite advising motorists of the cost of the fine for a red light violation.
- Officers continue to respond to habitual transient offender (HTO) complaints.
- Officers are utilizing crime analysis and partnering with the Stanislaus Auto Theft Task Force (STANCATT) to address trends. At least monthly, an officer attends an information sharing meeting with STANCATT. Through our partnership with STANCATT we also have the ability to deploy "bait" cars to apprehend auto thieves.
- Patrol teams continue work in their assigned policing zones and beat realignments and have reported no issues over the last month. Staff is currently working on a spreadsheet "zone" folder that will track projects and information for the various beats.

EVENTS AND PROJECTS

- The department participated in its annual California Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) audit and compliance inspection on 11/30/2018 and we anticipate receiving the results of the audit sometime during the month of December. Law enforcement agencies are required to adhere to a minimum selection and training standards as well as the provisions of California Penal Code Section 13512 which requires compliance inspections to ensure adherence to POST standards for selection and training. Audits are conducted on a yearly basis.
- CAPS and members of the department assisted in this year's Spirit of Oakdale Community Thanksgiving dinner and delivered approximately 120 dinners to homebound seniors on Thanksgiving.
- In response to the Butte County fire emergency, the department was requested by the Office of Emergency Services (OES) on 11/9/18 to assist with a Law Enforcement Mutual Aid (LEMA) Request from our region (Region IV). In coordination with the Stanislaus and Sacramento County Sheriff's Offices, we sent two officers and a marked patrol car to assist in Butte County.
- In anticipation of the upcoming holidays, the department will be holding a "Coco with A Cop" event sometime mid-December. More information will go out on this when it becomes available.
- Two consultants from IXII Group, Inc. have been providing Dispatch/Records training in the Communications Center for the last several weeks. The consultants provide instruction, monitor skill and ability, complete daily observation reports, and assign earned ratings according to department standards. Both consultants are POST certified Master Instructors and subject matter experts in various dispatch related fields and have over 50 combined years of dispatch experience.
- Staff continues work on the public video surveillance system for the Community Park.
- Staff continues to work with Sierra Railroad on drafting a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the police department and the railroad partnering on the department's electric motorcycle use along the railroad tracks.
- The department participated in many community events in the month of November. On 11/3/18, the department hosted Operation Happy Halloween 2.0

which was held in response to the candy tampering incident that occurred Halloween night. The police department invited all members of the community impacted by the unfortunate event to come by the police department to receive free certified safe replacement candy treats. In addition to receiving a bag full of candy, attendees were treated to a tour of the Armored Rescue Vehicle (ARV), patrol vehicles, a demonstration of the Unmanned Arial Vehicle (UAV) Unit and a visit by McGruff the Crime Dog. The objective of this event was to focus positive energy on those kids impacted by this terrible event and to give them their Halloween back. This event would not have been possible without the help of Oak Valley Hospital who provided the services to scan the candy and also River Christian Community Church who provided a large donation of candy for the event.

The department also participated in the Veteran's Day Parade and Memorial Service on 11/12/18 and the Oakdale Christmas Tree Lighting on 11/23/18. Patrol vehicles, along with the ARV and Equestrian Unit were on hand for the events.

- Staff received the final report for the results of the three-day audit of the police department's Property and Evidence facility by DB Consulting that was conducted on 10/23 through 10/25/18. Staff will be reviewing the findings and recommendations and sharing results the future.
- Staff recently completed the biennial assets inventory and certifications audit for equipment received through the Homeland Security Grant Program.
- Staff continues to work on outfitting the patrol vehicles and mobile in-car radio projects as well as the Cradlepoint Wireless Router System project for our emergency vehicles. Work also continues on the installation of CLETS in the patrol vehicles. Datapath is currently working with the Department of Justice (DOJ) on clearance issues.
- Staff continues to review and update department manual policies to maintain compliance with changing laws and best practices. A review of the department's Manual of Uniforms and Equipment policy was conducted at the last department staff meeting.
- Staff continues to work with members of the community on the Neighborhood Watch Radar program.

RECRUITMENT

- In the month of November, the department welcomed two new members, Jordan Tapia and Charles Castro. Mr. Tapia has been hired as a full-time Police Officer and Mr. Castro will be serving in the Police Administrative Support position. Also, two of our Public Safety Dispatcher's, Minda Klein and Jillian Costa, were reclassified from part-time status to full-time employees. We welcome Officer Tapia and Mr. Castro to the OPD family and congratulate them all on their accomplishments!
- The department currently has two full time police officer vacancies with one reserve officer in the police academy and an additional reserve officer delayed from the current academy due to injury and scheduled to attend the next. There are also several candidates currently in various stages of the testing process that could be future police academy prospects. Staff has been placing an emphasis on developing officers locally and from the department's Explorer and Internship Programs as way to better represent the community and increase future retention.
- The department is currently fully staffed with full-time dispatcher/clerks in the Communications Center.
- The department continues to hold ongoing recruitments for the positions of Police
 Officer, Reserve Police Officer, and part-time Public Safety Dispatcher/Clerk as
 well as Police Lieutenant. We currently have one Reserve Police Officer
 candidate in the background process and recently held interviews for the parttime Animal Shelter Attendant.

The department will be conducting interviews for Reserve Officer and Police Officer on 12/7/2018 and hosting a POST Dispatcher T-Test on 12/17/2018.

ONGOING

- Patrol officers and professional staff continue to attend Neighborhood Watch meetings. The Oakdale Police Department appreciates and actively partners with our community Neighborhood Watch Groups and together are committed to achieving a higher quality of life and lower level of crime through community involvement.
- Personnel continue to attend various training in the month of November:

- Our K9 officers continue to attend monthly canine training.
- Two officers attended motorcycle training for the departments two Zero motorcycles.
- Two officers attended Field Training Officer (FTO) Update training.
- Members of the RRT (Rapid Response Team) continue monthly training.
- Staff received the graffiti report for the month of November from the city's TAG (Team-up Against Graffiti) coordinator Mike Hancock who reported there were four graffiti incidents last month and one outstanding from the previous month. None of the four incidents were gang related. An incident occurred at a frequent graffiti location under the North Yosemite Avenue Bridge. More significant graffiti was reported along a wall in the open field on East Gregor Street and due to the significant amount of graffiti on the wall, Stanislaus County Graffiti Abatement was called in to use their paint spraying equipment. A map showing graffiti incidents is attached (Attachment C).



AIRPORT DIVISION

- AIRPORT PAVEMENT REHABILITATION CONSTRUCTION: This Projects scope of work includes slurry and striping of the entire runway and 3" grind and overlay of the entire taxiway. The City accepted the FAA grant offer in the amount of \$1,069,921 at the Sept. 4 meeting. A Caltrans matching grant in the amount of \$50,000 was received. This project will be winterized to construct pavement in spring 2019. Staff is working through the FAA requirements to winterize the project.
- AIRPORT SECURITY FENCING PHASE II: This Projects scope of work includes 5,810 feet of new 6' high fencing, with barbed wire and dig proof fabric. The new fence will be installed along the property line south of the runway and parallel to the OID canal. The City accepted the FAA grant offer in the amount of \$367,901 at the Sept. 4 meeting. A Caltrans matching grant in the amount of \$50,000 was received. The project is complete. Anticipate bringing item to Council for acceptance in January.
- **2019 AIRPORT LAYOUT PLAN:** The FAA requested that Staff move this project up from 2022 to 2019. This Projects scope of work includes Runway Safety Area mitigation and a Drainage Study. A preliminary Grant Application will be submitted to the FAA by end of December.
