5. PRESENTATIONS/ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS:

5.1: Tom Changnon, Stanislaus County Superintendent of Schools, to Present the State of Education in Stanislaus County.

Tom Changnon, Stanislaus County Superintendent of Schools provided a PowerPoint Presentation on the State of Education in Stanislaus County.

6. ADDITIONS/DELETIONS:

Mayor Paul asked whether there were any additions or deletions to the City Council agenda. City Manager Whitemyer advised there are none.



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7. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Alice Garcia addressed the City Council related to Oakdale Irrigation Districts (OID) removal of water service to city residents and classified the OID property tax assessment as a hidden tax. Ms. Garcia stated the City Manager and two Council Members have held private meetings with OID.

City Manager Whitemyer responded to Ms. Garcia's comments related to private meetings advising the City of Oakdale values the Brown Act and the City of Oakdale has obeyed all open meeting rules in meeting with OID; the City Manager and two council members can meet with two board members and the General Manager of OID, in compliance with the Brown Act.

Brewster Burns addressed the City Council related to street sweeping, code enforcement, traffic enforcement and sewer rates.

Christopher Smith approached the podium to excuse from the meeting Cub Scout Troop 303.
