Oakdale, CA – Oakdale Police Lieutenant honorably retires after 28 years of service.

Police Lieutenant Joe Carrillo honorably retires after 28 years of service with the Oakdale Police Department on Friday, September 6, 2019.

“While I’m excited to begin this next chapter of my life and spend more time with family at home, it is difficult to leave my law enforcement family after spending so much time together,” said Lt. Carrillo, “My law enforcement career began as a Stanislaus County Marshall back in 1989 and continued with my appointment to the Oakdale Police Department back in 1991.”

Carrillo has held numerous assignments with the Oakdale Police Department, including patrol, Field Training Officer, Stanislaus Drug Enforcement Agency Task Force Officer, K9 Officer, Bike Patrol, Detective, Gang Sergeant, Special Weapons and Tactics Team, and Street Narcotics Team. He rose through the ranks, being appointed to police officer in 1991, police sergeant in 2008, and police lieutenant in 2017.

Carrillo earned his Associate of Science in Social Science while serving as a police officer and has been pursuing a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice during his time as a police sergeant and police lieutenant.
