## Oakdale Man Arrested For Stolen Vehicles

**Oakdale, CA** – Oakdale man arrested for multiple stolen vehicles during past week.

On May 11, 2019 at 2:19 p.m., Oakdale Police received a call regarding a suspicious vehicle left unattended by a man in the 400 block of South Maag Avenue. When officers arrived on scene, they discovered an unoccupied Honda Accord that had been vandalized with spray paint. Officers recognized the car as a previously stolen vehicle.

Upon further investigation, officers were led to the 1300 block of Grand Oak Way where Jared Joseph Dykes, 18 years, was taken into custody for vehicle theft. Dykes is suspected of committing vehicle thefts on May 9, 2019 from the 700 block of East "J" Street and May 10, 2019 from the 1300 block of East "G" Street. Both cars were Hondas.

Jared Joseph Dykes was arrested for two counts of 10851(A) VC – Auto Theft, 12022.1 PC – Committing a Felony While on Probation and 1203.2(A) PC – Probation Violation.

Dykes is also suspected of fleeing from Modesto Police in one of the stolen vehicles on May 11, 2019. Dykes was additionally charged 2800.2(a) VC – Felony Evasion.

Oakdale Police announced local residents who own Honda vehicles may be eligible to receive “The Club” steering wheel anti-theft device from police. Current Oakdale residents who own a Honda vehicle without newer anti-theft technology can come to the Oakdale Police Department and may be eligible to receive one of these devices, at no cost, as a way to partner with police in reducing auto thefts in the community. Supplies are limited and receipt is on a first come first served basis.
